**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3 (BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS),
CHAPTER 3 (LIQUOR AND TOBACCO CONTROL), SECTION THREE (DEFINITIONS)
SECTION 11 (LIQUOR LICENSE AND PERMIT CLASSIFICATIONS)
OF THE NAPERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPERVILLE, DUPAGE AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, in exercise of its home rule powers that:

SECTION 1: Title 3 (Business and License Regulations), Chapter 3 (Liquor and Tobacco Control), Section 3 (Definitions) of the Naperville Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding the underlined language as follows:

3-3-3: - DEFINITIONS: For the purposes of this Chapter, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR through
ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCT * * *

<u>ARTISANAL</u> <u>TEQUILA</u>	Additive-free tequila that uses 100% fully mature agave slow-cooking in masonry or stone ovens, open-air fermentation with wild yeasts, and small-batch distillation in copper pot stills.
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BEER through
WINE OR VINOUS BEVERAGE * * *

SECTION 2: Title 3 (Business and License Regulations), Chapter 3 (Liquor and Tobacco Control), Section 11 (Liquor License and Permit Classifications) of the Naperville Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding the underlined language and deleting the stricken language as follows:

3-3-11: LIQUOR LICENSE AND PERMIT CLASSIFICATIONS:

The following are classes of liquor licenses and permits with an annual license and permit fee as indicated:

1. On-premises consumption liquor licenses * * *

2. Off-Premises Consumption Liquor Licenses: * * *

Class D – Package Store through

Class S – Specialty Wine Shop * * *

Class S1 – Specialty Food and Liquor Shop	
Requirements of Premises	Premises shall not exceed 1,500 square feet. Not less than 40% of the premises shall be designated for the sale of specialty foods.
Consumption	Off-premises, except consumption on premises of not more than 3 oz. of <u>artisanal tequila</u> , craft distilled whiskey or small batch whiskey, or 18 oz. of wine, or 32 oz. of craft beer per person/day.
Container Requirements	199 ml containers must be confined to a closed display unit. All wine-bottles must bear the establishment's private label. Retail sale of craft beer, wine, <u>artisanal tequila</u> , craft distilled whiskey or small batched whiskey in its original package.
Liquor Tasting	Tastings are limited to one type of alcoholic liquor per person/day. Tasting hours: 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
Annual Fee	\$1,650
Other	Capped at 2. The Class S1 license is exempted from the restrictions in Section 3-3-12:7 (Downtown Establishments).

Requirements of Permit	Class B license holders only.
Consumption	Liquor service from 11:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. (Mon.—Fri.), 2:00 a.m. (Sat.—Sun.)
Container Restrictions	None.

Food Service	None.
Type of Liquor Service	Same as with Class B license.
Annual Fee	\$500.00
Other	Cap of <u>25</u> <u>21</u> for downtown locations, cap of 43 for non-downtown locations.
