# PROCLAMATION

**WORLD PANCREATIC CANCER DAY  
NOVEMBER 16, 2017**

**WHEREAS,** in 2017, an estimated 53,670 people will be diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer in the United States, 43,090 will die; and

**WHEREAS,** Pancreatic Cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, the third leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States and expected to become the second by 2020; and

**WHEREAS,** Pancreatic Cancer is the only cancer with a five-year survival rate of just 8 percent; 73 percent of patients die within the first year, 93 percent of patients die within the first 5 years; and


**WHEREAS,** approximately 1650 deaths will occur in Illinois in 2017 and an estimated 403,000 new cases diagnosed globally; and

**WHEREAS,** the good health and well-being of the residents of Naperville are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about Pancreatic Cancer.
