

My concerns regarding this development revolve primarily around the massive size of the development - it will literally be the largest mosque in North America yet will be embedded within a small parcel of land within a residential neighborhood. The traffic impact would be devastating to the neighborhood with the planned 900+ parking spaces being utilized multiple times a day. Even with an expansion of 248th, the traffic would undoubtedly be rerouted through our neighborhood's streets as drivers search for a more expeditious way to depart the location. Once they realize the delays that are associated with parking in the mosque's lot, attendees would undoubtedly start parking on our neighborhood's streets as a way to avoid the traffic jam. Speeding cars is already an issue on our neighborhood's streets, and this massive development would only exasperate the issue further increasing the risk to playing children and pedestrians.

The west side of 248th Avenue was undeveloped and uncongested. Since then I have seen multiple subdivisions built on this land which brought with it an increase in traffic. This year a park was built which will bring a lot of people and traffic to the area especially during the spring and summer months when organized baseball and soccer leagues are formed. Building a mosque, school, and gymnasium on 248th Avenue will substantially increase the flow of traffic to this area seven days a week.

Calvary Church is located on Route 59, a three-lane street going north and south at a major intersection with a stoplight. 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#### Dear City Staff,

My name is Molly Evans, and my family and I have been residents of Tall Grass since 2009. I am writing to express my concerns regarding the Islamic Center of Naperville's (ICN) proposed plans for the 13.6 acres of land on 248<sup>th</sup> Ave. I became aware of the details of this project when ICN presented at a Tall Grass HOA Board meeting via zoom on August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020, and then furthered my research by looking online on the City's website. My overall concerns are (1) the sheer size of the development is too large for the parcel of land; (2) the increased traffic and traffic congestion a development of this size would cause to Tall Grass and other neighboring subdivisions; and (3) the safety concerns around the Tall Grass Greenway bike/walking trail north of the development of which my family and I, and many others use often.

#### In further detail,

- (1) <u>Size</u>. This 5-phased development will be located in the middle of a residential area off one road with only 2 means of access/egress, yet is equal in size (actually larger by 200+ parking spots) as the Costco on Rt 59 and 75<sup>th</sup> St of which has several access/egress roads. A development of this size is more like a business with the lack of green space and is not compatible or in harmony with the surrounding residential neighborhoods.
- (2) <u>Traffic</u>. This large development will host multiple events a day (prayer service, school, functions, etc.) 7 days a week which will cause an already stressed 248<sup>th</sup> minor arterial road to be more congested and less safe, especially for the high school drivers who use 248<sup>th</sup> Ave as a main route getting to and from school. The most concerning is on Fridays when ICN's largest prayer service of the week releases approximately 580 cars around the same time as the surrounding District 204 schools release which will cause major back-up on 103<sup>rd</sup> and 248<sup>th</sup> Ave. Living near Scullen Middle School, I see the frustration and congestion on a daily basis that drop-off and pick-up already causes; this development will exacerbate this problem exponentially.

(3) <u>Bike trail</u>. The walking/bike path just north of the proposed development is used by my family any many others often and as is, is not a very safe intersection. Currently, it has a flashing pedestrian light that often goes unnoticed to drivers passing by. To add a development of this magnitude with the amount of daily traffic and a proposed north access/exit drive that close to the bike trail seems irresponsible and will make an already unsafe situation more dangerous. With the excitement of the newly constructed Wolfs Crossing Community Park built just west of the subdivision, the increase in walkers/bikers on that path when the weather changes will be significant. If this development gets approved, a plan <u>needs</u> to be developed and implemented before the first phase of construction begins.

To be very clear, the proposed development looks to be a well-thought out, incredible venue for the Islamic Community and for the City of Naperville as a whole; however, I do not believe this is the right plot of land for all parties involved. There seems to be other areas in our City that would be more suitable for a center of this magnitude. Simply put, a development of this size will be detrimental to the overall character of the neighborhood and to all the neighboring subdivisions due to the impacts listed above. Great project, great concept, wrong plot.

Some have compared the proposed development to a Costco. It bears noting that there are stark differences between a religious facility and a major commercial development that prevent a comparison between the two

uses. As a resident of Naperville, I fully support the development of a commercial tax base in our City, but I would also oppose the construction of a Costco on this parcel.

In this turbulent time in our nation's history, I must also add that religious freedom is a cornerstone of American democracy and a bedrock constitutional right. In consideration of these rights, the facts presented herein and the plans submitted by ICN, I strongly encourage that you approve the development of this mosque as submitted.

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



I am a resident of Tall Grass and have been for the past eight years. I am writing to state my opposition to the development that is up for consideration on 248<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

Initially, I was unopposed to this development since I had been under the impression that it would have been considerably smaller in size. At most, I understood that the structure would have had a parking lot to support about 100 vehicles, and there would have been a considerable amount of green space or landscaping to hide the development from the houses surrounding the plot of land. After speaking with other concerned residents, I now understand that the whole of the property will be used and that the landscaping or fencing will not be adequate to hide the development from view.

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Dear Sara Kopinski and Naperville Planning Committee,

I am writing to express my concerns about the proposed building of the Islamic Center of Naperville (ICN) on 248th Street. I understand that this project has not yet been approved and would like the city planners and city council to understand my concerns, which are likely shared by many. I am a 19-year resident of South Naperville. When we moved to South Naperville, we studied the Sector G plan and were well aware that the land on 248th was zoned for religious use. We assumed a small church or temple would be built there eventually. We have no problem with that land use, nor do we care what religious organization purchases the property. However we strongly oppose the ICN plans for this land, as I will explain below.

- 1. TOO LARGE FOR THIS LOCATION The development plans for the 248th ICN are impressive, but are quite mammoth for this land parcel. The ICN proposal calls for building in phases totaling 120,893 sf on a mere 13.63 acres.
- By comparison, the ICN will be over 3 times larger than the recently built Compass Church at Rt 59/103rd but the 248th property is not 3 times larger than the 8 acres at Compass Church. (Compass Church is less then 38,000 sf on 8 acres. ICN is 120,893 sf on 13.63 acres.)
- ICN will be much larger than other religious organizations that neighbor residential property. For example, Alleluia! Lutheran 24000 sf, Holy Spirit 30,000 sf.
- The new Costco on Ogden Avenue is comparable in size to ICN. Costco will be a 159.157 square foot store on 18.71 acres with about 200 fewer parking spaces than ICN.. Building a Costco on 248th wouldn't be acceptable not should a mega-religious-facility. These large developments belong in a commercial area, like the Ogden corridor or Rt 59. - The Hindu Mandir in Bartlett IL is a very comparable size religious organization: It is very similar in height to ICN 248th and is about 140,000 sf. The key difference is the BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir in Bartlett sits on over 30 acres of land on Rt 59.
- 2. LOCATION This is a mega church to be built basically in the middle of a neighborhood. I would not oppose a smaller religious facility... but not a 120,893 sf facility. Other area mega-churches like Calvary and Community Christian (YellowBox) are not in a residential area. And as mentioned above, the very similarly sized mandir in Bartlett is located on 30 acres, far away from residential homes. If ICN wanted to build at the vacant corner of Rt 59 & 75th Street, that would feel an appropriate asset to the community. However, a mega-facility in this location would be disruptive to the quality of life of nearby residents.
- 3. ACCESS There are only 2 access points in and out of ICN. Both access points are to 248th Ave. Since the plans call for 719 parking spaces, it is conceivable that thousands of cars could be coming and going from the ICN multiple times a day as services are offered many times a day. Simply put, even an improved 248th Avenue cannot handle this type of traffic. (The ICN proposal notes that their other locations never have full parking lots... but this new development is meant to be a mega-facility different than their current locations and will attract more worshippers.) Other churches in Naperville typically are built on corner lots to allow traffic to disperse in multiple directions without clogging a single roadway. For example, Community Christian, Alleluia, Holy Spirit, Compass Church Wheatland Salem Church are all on corner lots.

4. CONGESTION - As stated above, I'm concerned about the traffic congestion that would occur with this size facility at this location, letting out onto 248th a minor arterial road. This roadway can already be very busy during commuting hours but also during the morning and afternoon as students/parents commute to and from large neighborhoods such as Tall Grass, Pencross Knolls, Ashwood Park, Ashwood Creek, Ashwood Park to Valley HS. Likewise, students from west of 248th commute to Scullen Middle School, which adds more traffic to 248th. (See Waubonsie Valley HS boundary map <a href="http://ipsdweb.ipsd.org/Documents/Boundaries/Boundary Map Packet Current.pdf">http://ipsdweb.ipsd.org/Documents/Boundaries/Boundary Map Packet Current.pdf</a>) School bus traffic departing from First Student bus lot travel 248th to serve other schools, inclding Fry Elementary, Scullen Middle School, Crone Middle School and possibly other schools.

Even if 248th is expanded to serve more than the current traffic, it is reasonable to expect this roadway will only get more congested when 95th Street is extended over the E&J Railroad and as other residential development is built out. Naperville's Southwest Community Plan also calls for more commercial development in this area. Building a mammoth religious center that relies only on 248th Avenue for its access points can only build a congestion problem in this area. When ICN states that they do not have congestion problems or parking problems at their other location, that is not relevant to this situation since the 248th ICN location would be much larger. "If you build it, they will come"

- 5. **HEIGHT** The proposed height of ICN 248th is approximately 80 feet. This is VERY out of character for buildings in Southwest Naperville, especially in a residential area. If this is approved, my understanding is that it will be one of the highest buildings in Naperville: taller than Edward Hospital. Source: <a href="https://www.emporis.com/statistics/tallest-buildings/city/106607/naperville-il-usa">https://www.emporis.com/statistics/tallest-buildings/city/106607/naperville-il-usa</a> This does not belong adjacent to a neighborhood.
- 6. SOUND It is tradition for the Islamic call to prayer to be broadcast throughout a temple and speakers outside the temple. It is long, very loud and occurs 5 times a day. ICN representatives are saying they don't plan to broadcast the call to prayer. However, because city ordinances currently consider church bells/chimes exempt from noise ordinances, it would be very easy for the ICN to later argue that a call to prayer broadcast should be exempt from noise ordinances. This would be high disruptive to the nearby homes.

In summary, I am not opposed to this parcel of land on 248th being used for a small religious organization. That's what it's always been zoned for. However, I am extremely opposed to a mega facility being built on this land, which borders multiple neighborhoods and does not allow appropriate access. Please consider how this will impact the nearby residents and do not approve the ICN proposal. THIS IS THE WRONG PLACE for such a large development.

I am a resident of Carillon Club of Naperville and DO NOT APPROVE OF THE PROPOSED ISLAMIC MOSQUE ON 248TH. The structure is too tall and enormous for the area. I am painfully aware of the Mosque on Ogden...open 24 hours a day and a mob scene when noon prayer gets out. The people stream out in crowds over spilling onto the streets and literally gridlock the area. The attendance is so large at noon alone that the parking provided is not enough and the business lots in the mall across the street fill with cars. It is noisy and the area is overcrowded. I can't begin to fathom an 80 foot tall, humongous structure filled with worshippers (and parking usage, structure and parking lot lights) that would literally crowd the geographic area it is proposed to occupy. If there is a holy day, there will be insufficient parking and this could definitely over spill to the surrounding, formerly tranquil neighborhood streets. The safety on the streets, unending gridlock on the thoroughfare streets there, noise pollution from the human over population during those times would be paralyzing to residents living in the area or using 248th to get to their destinations. I have a couple of comments on the ICN project proposed for 248<sup>th</sup> Street scheduled for the January 20, 2021 Planning and Zoning Commission.

- The 13 acres is appropriately zoned for residential. About 50-55 single family homes could be built on the 13 acres. A two lane road like 248<sup>th</sup> Street can handle that additional volume. The proposal calls for 700 parking spaces, expanding to 900 spaces in the future, is a magnitude that is not even close and will lead to a traffic condition F rating. I am concerned about the proposal to build a mosque in an area zoned as residential. Naperville has precious few open areas available for residential development. In addition, the Naperville city council has expressed a commitment to have more affordable housing units made available within the city of Naperville. It seems to me that building a new mosque in an area that is one of the few undeveloped residential zones left is counter to this commitment.

My wife and I recently became aware of a large non-residential building project being proposed for a property on 248th street in Naperville that is close to the Ashwood Crossing 55+ residential community where we recently built a new home. Our decision to build a home in Ashwood Crossing was based on our desire to retire in the wonderful city of Naperville in an over 55 age community that offered ranch style living in a residential area with easy access to Naperville Park District facilities.

Choices of such developments are limited in Naperville yet we were able to find exactly what we were looking for in Ashwood Crossing. However, we have deep concerns about the large Islamic Center being proposed for property very close to our residential community for a number of reasons.

- The project does not fit with other development that has taken place on 248th street. With the exception of an Elementary School and Naperville Park District location, there has been NO non residential development on the street. The area consists entirely of residential communities, some of which are still in development and in which home owners have invested significant resources to ensure the residential character of the community is maintained. A massive non residential building project in the middle of this residential area clearly does not make sense and will negatively impact the residential environment sought by home owners living in the area.
- 248th street is primarily used by local residents to access the various communities they live in as they return or leave their homes. Currently a portion of 248th street is only 2 lane and clearly cannot handle what I'll define as high volume "commercial traffic" that would result from a large project like the Islamic Center or any similar project on the property. The future expansion of 248th street to four lanes, also an unknown to us when we bought our home, will still result in high volumes of traffic simply as a result of it being the only access road to the Center. Clearly with a plan to have 900 parking spaces when the complete project is finished, there are significant expectations by the Center to accommodate large crowds of people for various activities.
- A large building project as proposed will negatively impact property values in the various residential communities that exist along 248th street. All of them. And there are many! High traffic volume and large gatherings of people throughout the week will disrupt the lifestyle that most people are looking for when seeking a quiet residential area to make their home. We certainly would not choose to live in Ashwood Crossing with a large non-residential development of ANY KIND that would result in this occurring. Home buyers will look elsewhere and perhaps even outside Naperville rather than in one of the many beautiful residential developments along 248th street for the reasons specified above. We certainly would.

We are strongly against the non residential development of the property along 248th street by the Islamic Center or any
other group or business proposing a project of such massive scale in a residential area. We ask that this project be

My name is Brad Salmon, and my wife Emily and our three kids have lived in the Tall Grass neighborhood since 2012. I'm writing to share with you my concern with, and objection to, the proposed development of the Islamic Center of Naperville (ICN) on 248th Ave.

Quite simply, the scale of the project is too massive for the size of the plot of land and single two-lane road (248th) providing access to the land. The full plan presented by the ICN calls for nearly two hundred <u>more</u> parking spaces than the Costco on Rte 59. The ingress and egress to Costco can be dicey and congested on a normal day—and there are three different streets that feed it (Rte 59, Beebe Dr and the two lane alleyway behind it that connects both 75th St and Beebe). I cannot imagine how difficult and congested and dangerous it will get with <u>potentially 200 more cars</u> than the capacity of the Costco lot trying to enter or exit <u>a single access road</u> (248th) all at the same time (e.g., after conclusion of services)—something that doesn't happen at Costco.

As a family we travel 248th frequently and we use the walking trail (and the crossing of 248th) alot for both walking and biking when the weather allows. We will be using the walking trail and crossing even more now that the awesome new park on Wolfs Crossing is open. We love that park and will be spending lots more time there as the weather improves. The traffic crossing 248th is already quite busy, I can't imagine how untenable (from both a congestion and safety perspective) that crossing will get during peak times if the proposed development continues.

Since 248th is the only street that directly accesses the proposed development, the congestion, traffic and delays (and the safety concerns that go along with them) in getting in and out of the development will be agonizing for anyone using the development and for everyone in and around the neighborhood needing to pass through. It is frankly untenable at the scale currently proposed.

If it goes forward, I can imagine that people that want to access or attend the ICN but not deal with the traffic headache will take to parking in the nearby neighborhoods and walking the final half to quarter mile to access the facility (I would do that if I were in their shoes). That will create more car and foot traffic in the neighborhoods (and the attendant congestion and safety concerns) than they should bear.

For the foregoing reasons, we strongly object to the proposed development and urge the City to not approve it.

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Sara,

We are longtime residents in TallGrass subdivision which is where the proposed site for this large multi-building project is under consideration. We have many concerns with this large a facility and its expansion plans. They are centered on safety and traffic flow and congestion. Covid aside, 248th is typically heavily congested as many folks choose this route to avoid as much of Rte 59 as possible whether traveling North or South. It is very difficult to turn South out of our subdivision from Lansdown Street onto 248th. Likewise, traffic gets backed up heading North on 248th due to the Wolfs Crossing stoplight and the 95th stoplight. The pedestrian crosswalk (with flashing light) for the Prairie Path also has added congestion and safety issues on its own even before this project has been proposed. Additionally, the PACE parking lot nearby during normal times continues to increase traffic on 95th street West of 248th.

248th street is the main road school buses use to transport kids to our High School (Waubonsie) daily. In fact, a bus depot is just off 248th/95th on Normantown road nearby so we get a lot of school bus traffic during non-Covid times. Adding this large a complex in the midst of this area just does not make any sense. There is ample property open and available on Rte 59 and 75th street North of Calvary church. At least that is off two major thoroughfares and away from residential areas where kids and families take their bus and ride their bikes on the Prairie Path.

As you know, Compass Church is already building on the corner of Rte 59 and 103rd street. They too are at least off a major road and not intertwined with multiple residential areas like those off of 248th.

There is now a new public park constructed on Wolfs Crossing just West of 248th. I can only imagine as this links with the Prairie Path and it includes ball fields, sled hill, exercise stations, etc. it will be popular with nearby families and their kids (post-coved). Do we really need this huge complex bringing more auto traffic to this vulnerable pedestrian playground area?

We also think an 80ft building in the midst of residences will be a complete tower of an eyesore, but that is less a concern than the added congestion and added safety issues that will come from increased traffic flow and congestion.

As taxpayers, we strongly object to this proposal and ask consideration be given for an alternative site.

I have been resident of and home owner in Remington at Tall Grass since 2006 and am writing to you with regard to the proposed development of the Islamic Center of Naperville.

After reviewing the current stipulations and dynamic of this proposal, I am kindly requesting great consideration be made prior to any approval for the development of this establishment. If approval is furnished, I am then kindly requesting objectives, in benefit to the community and City of Naperville as a whole, for said approval to have been determined be shared.

First and foremost, I believe the question as to what degree will the flow of people and vehicles in/out of this dauntingly large establishment impinge on the surrounding residential areas and homeowners' ability to continue to easily flow in/out of their neighborhoods for activities of daily life be concretely understood. In my years of investing in residential property, I have not seen this type of facility and the magnitude of it placed in the middle of residential communities.

The second concern would be if the development of the ICN benefits our city to the degree of warranting such an impingement on the flow of life to the surrounding homeowners. I believe Naperville's Islamic community is approximately 6%, yet the projected ICN is approximately 121,000 square feet, requiring 900+ parking spaces. It would seem the ratio of census to purpose for the overall community wouldn't prove this to be reasonable. This is including factoring in that this is not an establishment intended to bring revenue or business to our City and it's resident, yet we would be expecting a significant impingement on the flow of our current processes of the surrounding homes.

Thirdly, I suspect there is great probability the two lane street/s will eventually require an expansion. The concern as to what resources will the city tap into to address the projected possibility of this is viable. Otherwise, will we be seeing a need to increase (tax) revenue to cover the costs of this and the cost of police force to manage said expantion and subsequent traffic. Please keep in mind, this proposed venue will not only accommodate it's local/state members, but out of town members as well, leaving substantive concern as to the congestion of flow and impingement of daily life activities of surrounding residents/homeowners.

I believe the center is a wonderful idea for the Islamic Community. The question becomes is the current proposed location most optimal for all involved or are there areas in our city that would be more suitable for a center of this magnitude. It would seem the overall cost (not solely financial) outweighs the benefit to the community as a whole. I hope the decision factors in all logic in the best interest of all impacted by this.

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Dear Honorable Members of the Planning & Zoning Commission,

I am writing to today to support the Islamic Center of Naperville's (ICN) proposed mosque on 248th St. As a resident of Tall Grass, it is my strong belief that this project is in compliance with the ordinances of the City and in service of the public benefit. The subject parcel was previously zoned for religious use and the proposed use in accordance with the existing, approved zoning.

To address a few concerns that may have been raised about the project:

- The proposed site plan provides the necessary set backs and landscaping screens to ensure that the development does not cause detrimental impacts to the surrounding parcels and subdivisions
- The proposed height of the buildings will be 35 FT to the top of the parapet wall
- The proposed site plan provides for a large detention basin on the east end of the development, providing 6.75 AC-FT of detention capacity, in accordance with City requirements. These calculations account for the addition of impervious surfaces.
- The City's plans include an improvement of 248th St, including a widening between 95th St and 103rd St. ICN's Phase I plans call for dedicated left turn lanes on 248th St. Per the Traffic Study prepared by Kenig, Lindgren, O'Hara, Aboona, Inc. (KLOA, Inc.), the combination of these improvements addresses projected future traffic growth on 248th St and the proposed development.

Some have compared the proposed development to a Costco. It bears noting that there are stark differences between a religious facility and a major commercial development that prevent a comparison between the two uses. As a resident of Naperville, I fully support the development of a commercial tax base in our City, but I would also oppose the construction of a Costco on this parcel.

In this turbulent time in our nation's history, I must also add that religious freedom is a cornerstone of American democracy and a bedrock constitutional right. In consideration of these rights, the facts presented herein and the plans submitted by ICN, I strongly encourage that you approve the development of this mosque as submitted.
