I'm writing today for my concerns on the renewed development of the Naperville Polo Grounds and let you know I plan on attending the September 21st PZC meeting.

As a long time resident of Naperville's South Pointe community, I'm genuinely confused as to how this is being brought up again without any plans to handle the already congested intersection at 119th and Route 59. The last time this was brought up, it was voted down by the City Council due to no plans to modify that intersection and I'm concerned we're wasting the valuable time of our City Leadership (including the PZC) with another proposal that was poorly developed and researched.

I travel down 119th every Monday through Friday and I can say it is nothing short of unsafe during rush hour events (especially when the Soccer field is in use) - if a full development is put in place, the additional traffic would make 119th / Route 59 completely inaccessible and dangerous.

This new development is arguably worse than prior proposals because they have proposed no through traffic via South Pointe, meaning future residents have only one main way in or out of this proposed development. As a father, I should be supporting no through traffic via my neighborhood, but I don't, due to the severity of traffic at 119th and Route 59. Since there is no access to route 59, this development would force residents in that area to use 119th & Plainfield Naper Road, which is the location of a major High School - which again has me concerned about the negligence behind this.

That said, I urge the PZC and City Council to ask anyone wishing to develop this land that they come to the table with a full plan to re-work that intersection, so as to not cause a dangerous situation for anyone living in the area.

Hello Planning and Zoning Commission,

I am a resident of the South Pointe subdivision and a member of the Naperville Environment and Sustainabilty Task Force (NEST). I am writing this letter as a resident of the subdivision adjacent to the proposed development.

I am concerned that the Pulte Group's Polo Field proposal is too dense for this area and request that the R2 zoning be **reduced to R1** to conform to the zoning of the adjacent neighborhoods.

If you look at the current land use map of the area, the neighborhoods to the north of this site are all R1, low density residential housing. The land proposed to be annexed has been used as horse farms, agriculture, polo fields, and soccer fields. Losing this open space is a loss for the area. Losing it to a dense development is particularly detrimental in terms of green spaces, habitat loss, flooding potential, pollution, and traffic. For context, this proposal puts more housing on a smaller piece of land than the existing South Pointe subdivision.

Has there been any impact study done to quantify the loss of biodiversity and habitat loss?

Regarding traffic, currently, 119th Street, with only one lane in each direction and no shoulder, gets overloaded with traffic. If over 400 units are built it will cause traffic issues on 119th Street to substantially worsen and also contribute to the worsening traffic on Route 59.

There are numerous other projects that have been approved recently in the area of south Naperville: the apartments on 111th Street, the development at 103rd Street and Route 59, the Wagner Farms Subdivision, and ongoing development on 248th Street, not to mention the continuing development in the adjacent Village of Plainfield. All of these are contributing to increased traffic in the area.

Without any public transportation alternatives and a coordinated plan for walk and bike paths, all of these developments rely on car traffic. This will negatively affect south Naperville's population with traffic and pollution, creating safety and health hazards, and increase our green house gas emissions that contribute to climate change.

The Land Use Master Plan that the City adopted in March 2022 specifically states that new developments should **not** "exacerbate existing problems". The Pulte Group's project will only exacerbate these problems.

I request that the Commission deny R2 zoning in this case.




