To Whom it may Concern:

This email rescinds the signing of previous letter received from petitioner, signed 10/1/2020.

Following the signing of this letter more information has been learned by residents of [REDACTED] regarding the installation and use of a Home Standard Generator unit which raises questions and concerns. Specifically the two primary concerns are:

1) Noise produced by the unit which is planned to be installed in close proximity to our den, family room, and bedroom. What will the noise level be while unit is running, how often will it be running, and at what time of day? These are all relevant questions in regards to a unit that will likely be exceeding 65-100 decibels in noise level.

2) Second is the exhaust that is expelled by the generator which contains carbon monoxide. This is of particular concern as we have two dogs who regularly spend of good deal of time in our yard and close to the fence line where the generator may be installed. Key question is how does the unit detect and direct its Carbon Monoxide exhaust and build up? Does this unit have a cut off switch that would detect CM build up and automatically turn off if levels get too high?

Please note that we are not suggesting that the generator should not be installed. We are however, **questioning the proposed location** for the reasons that we have detailed in this email.
