METHODOLOGY

- 1 Address-based random sample survey
- 2 Survey open April 6 - June 1, 2026
- 3 Invitations were sent to 5,000 randomly selected households in all districts
- 4 +/- 4% margin of error
- 5 Results weighted to reflect Naperville

RESPONSE

760 completed surveys 16% response rate
English, Spanish, and Simplified Chinese

WHAT RESIDENTS RECEIVED

Postcard invitation

Mailed first, with QR codes in all three languages inviting the household to respond online

Cover letter from the Mayor

Personal appeal with the survey link and household access code, again printed in English, Spanish, and Simplified Chinese

Printed questionnaire

Full paper survey with a postage-paid return envelope, so respondents could answer on paper or online

Open participation survey

Publicized separately from May 11 - June 1, 2026: 213 responses are reported apart from the random sample

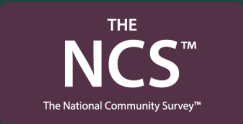

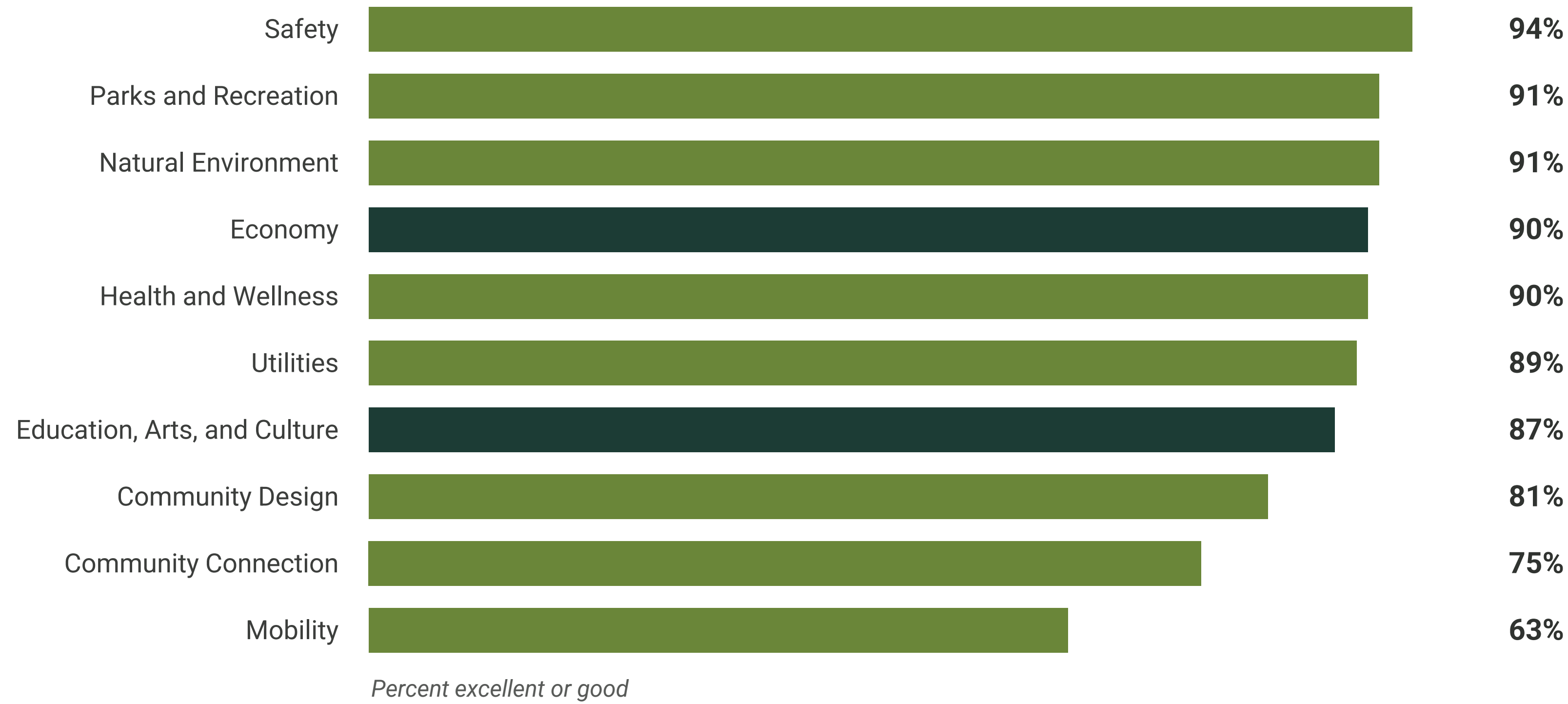

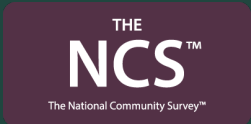
Facets of Community Livability: Quality



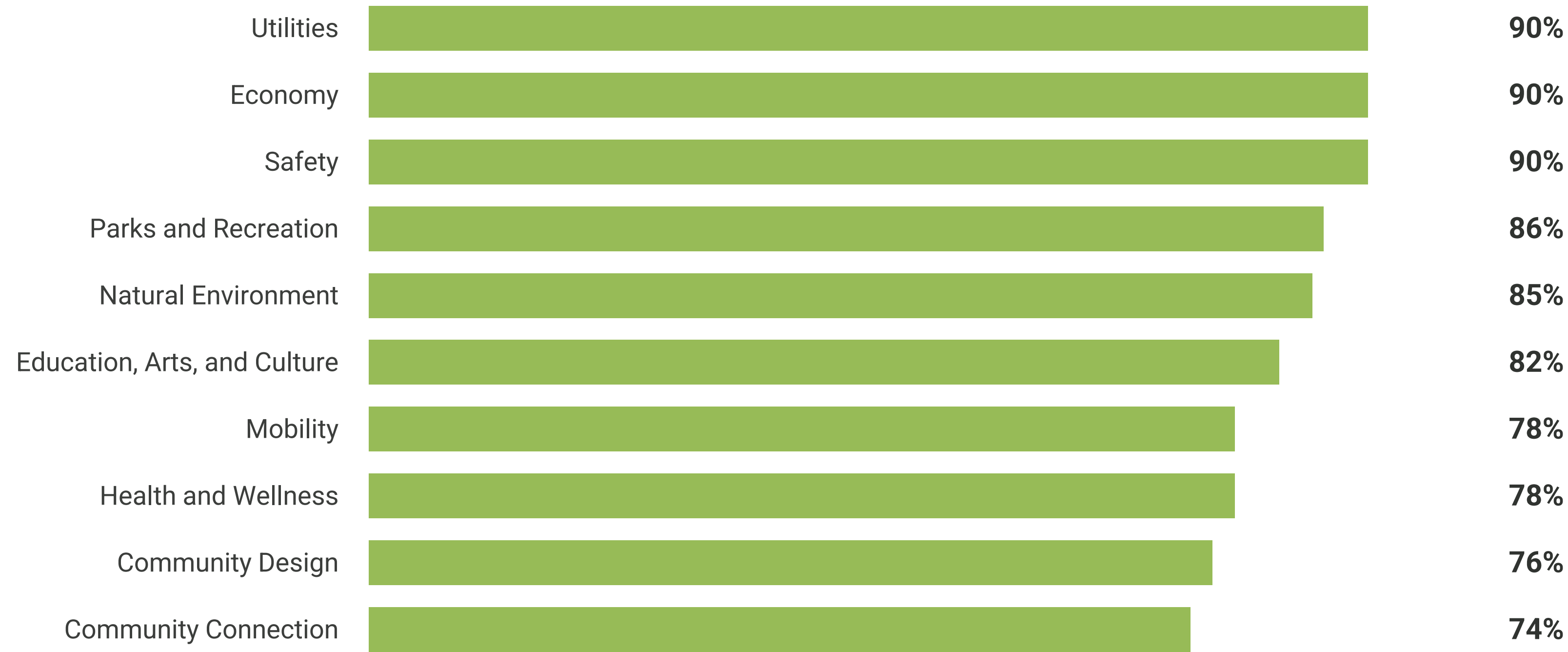
Please rate the quality of each of the following in the Naperville community.

Please rate how important, if at all, it is for the Naperville community to focus on each of the following in the coming two years.

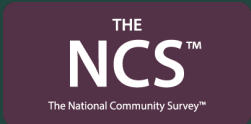

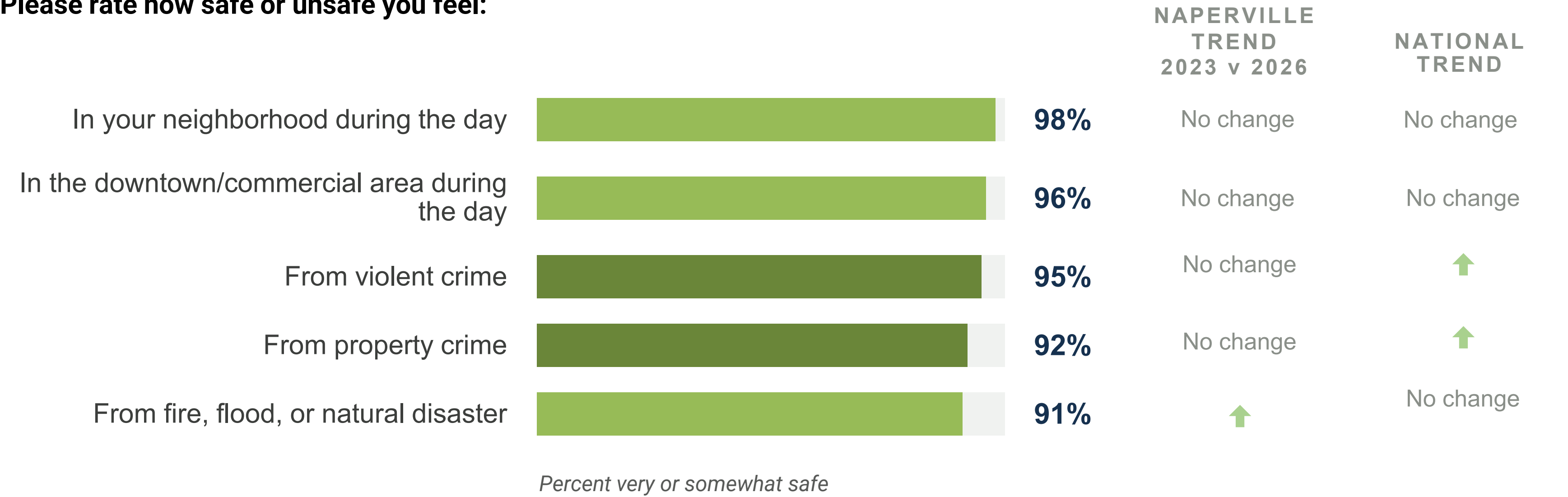

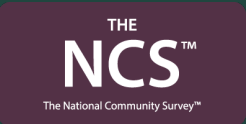

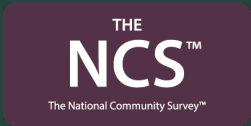

The Economy in Naperville

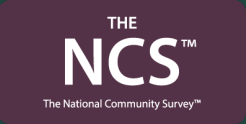

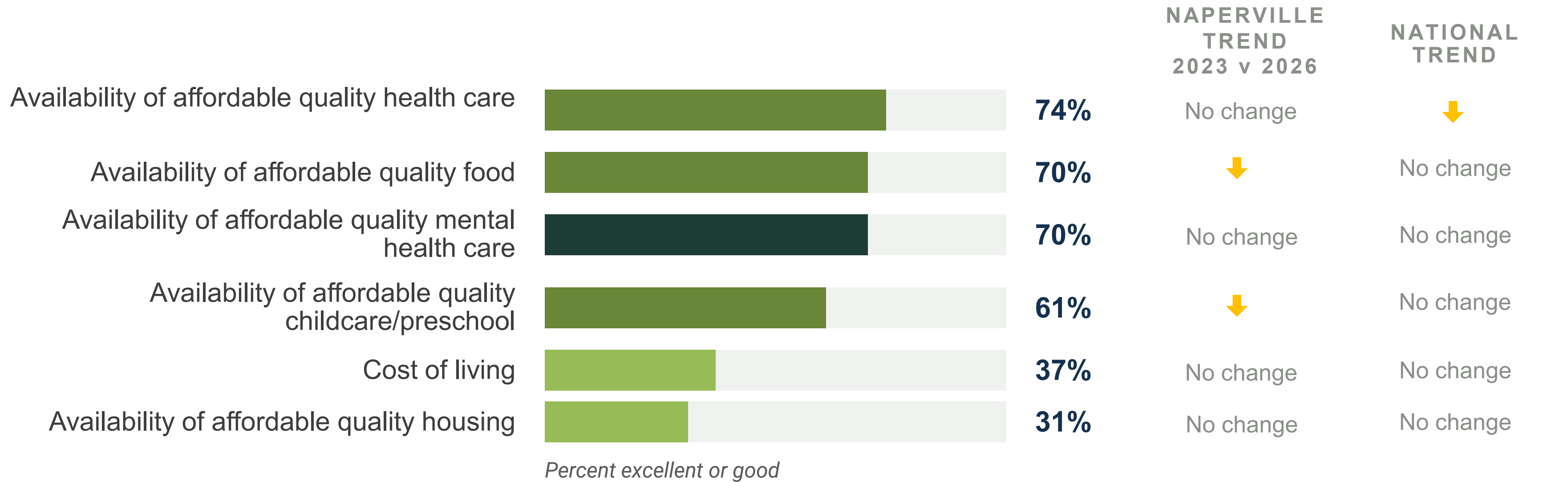

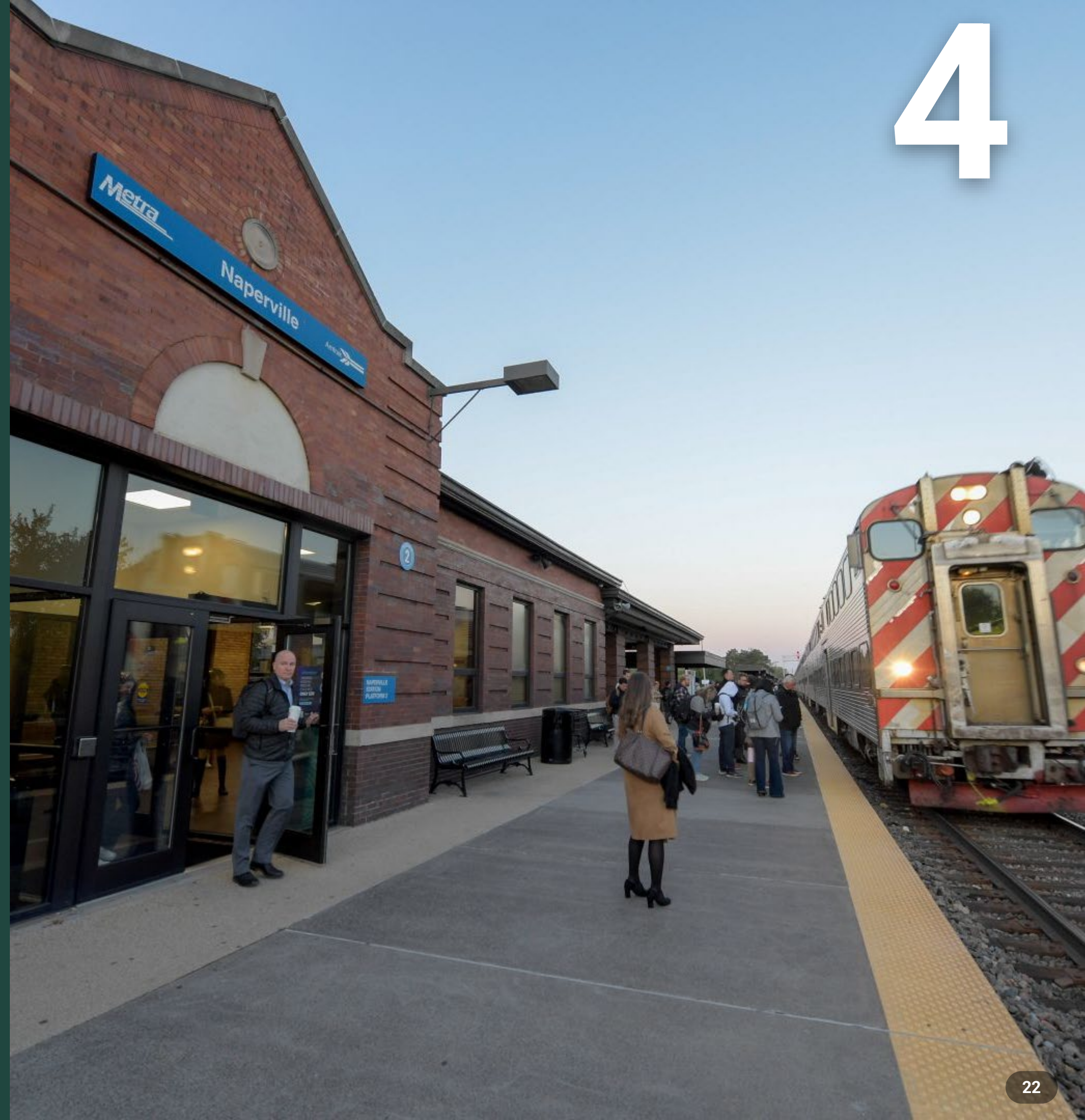

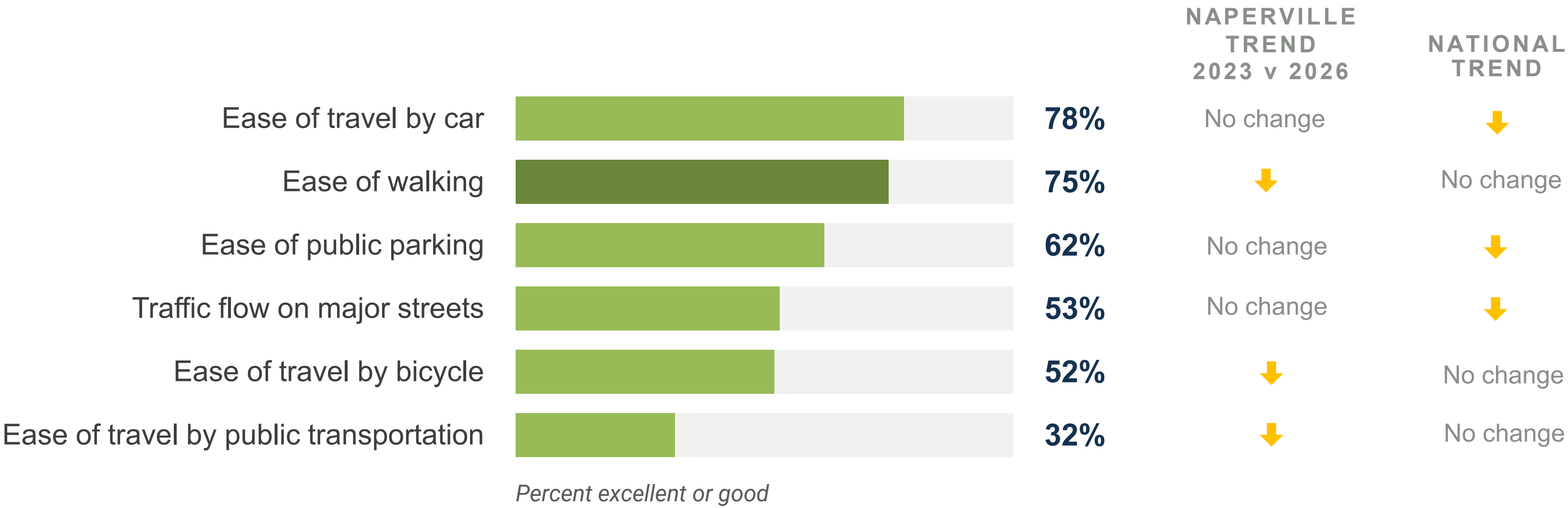
Affordability is Naperville’s lowest-scoring cluster in absolute terms, yet four of the six items still land above the national benchmark.

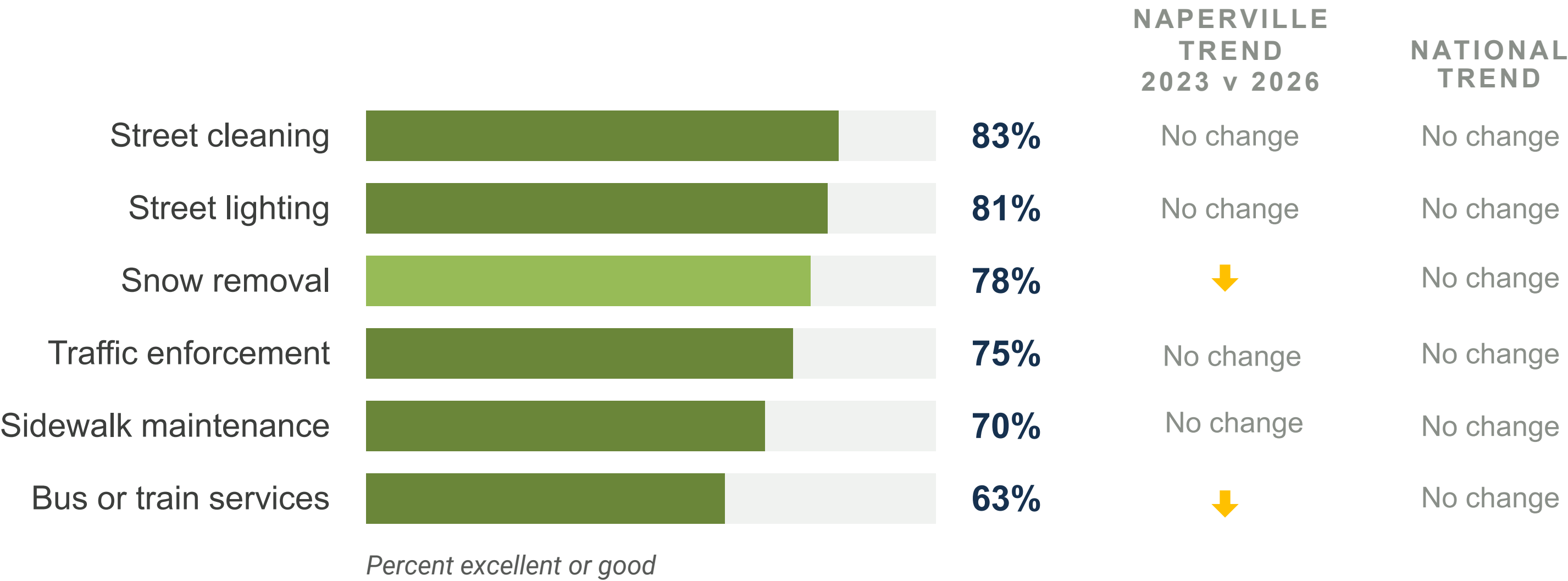

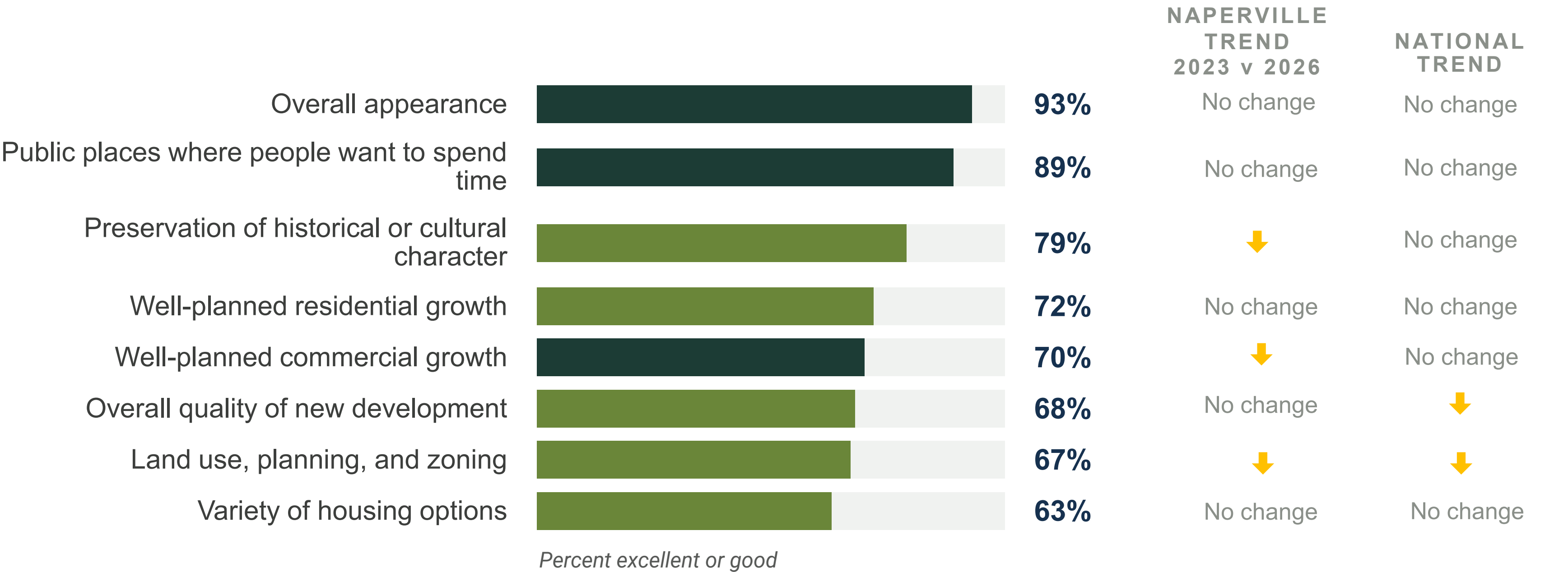
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Community Design in Naperville

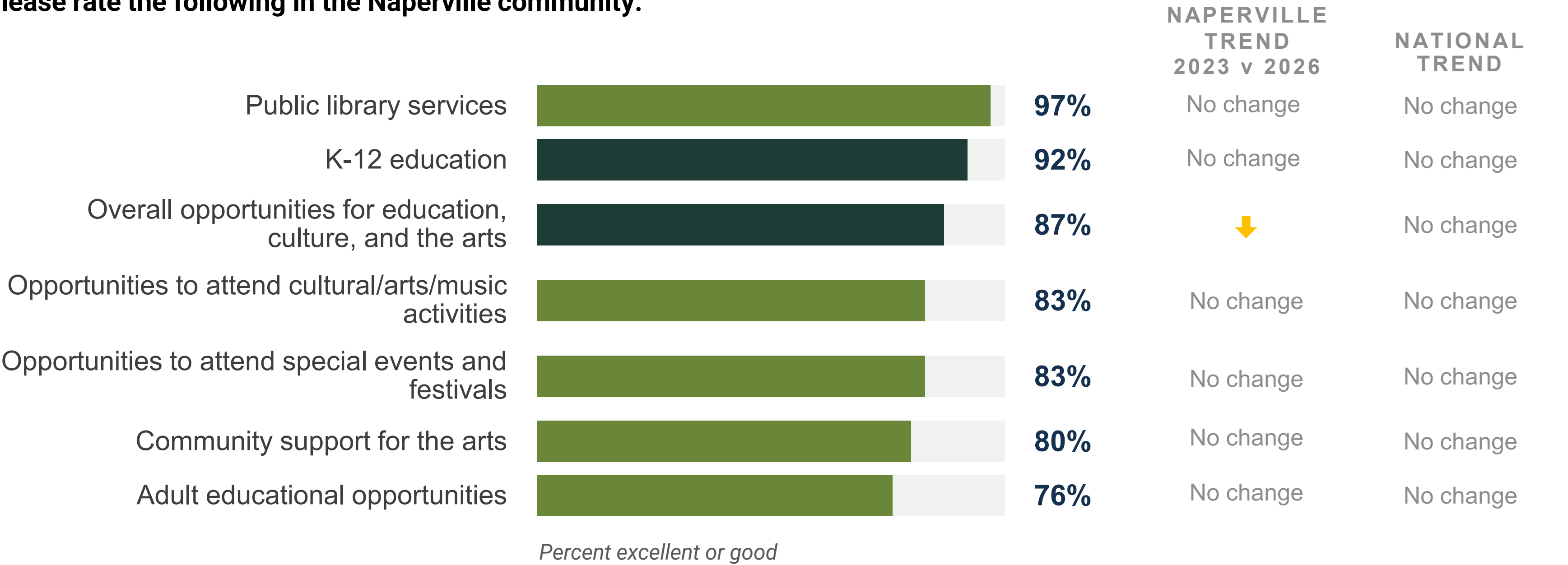

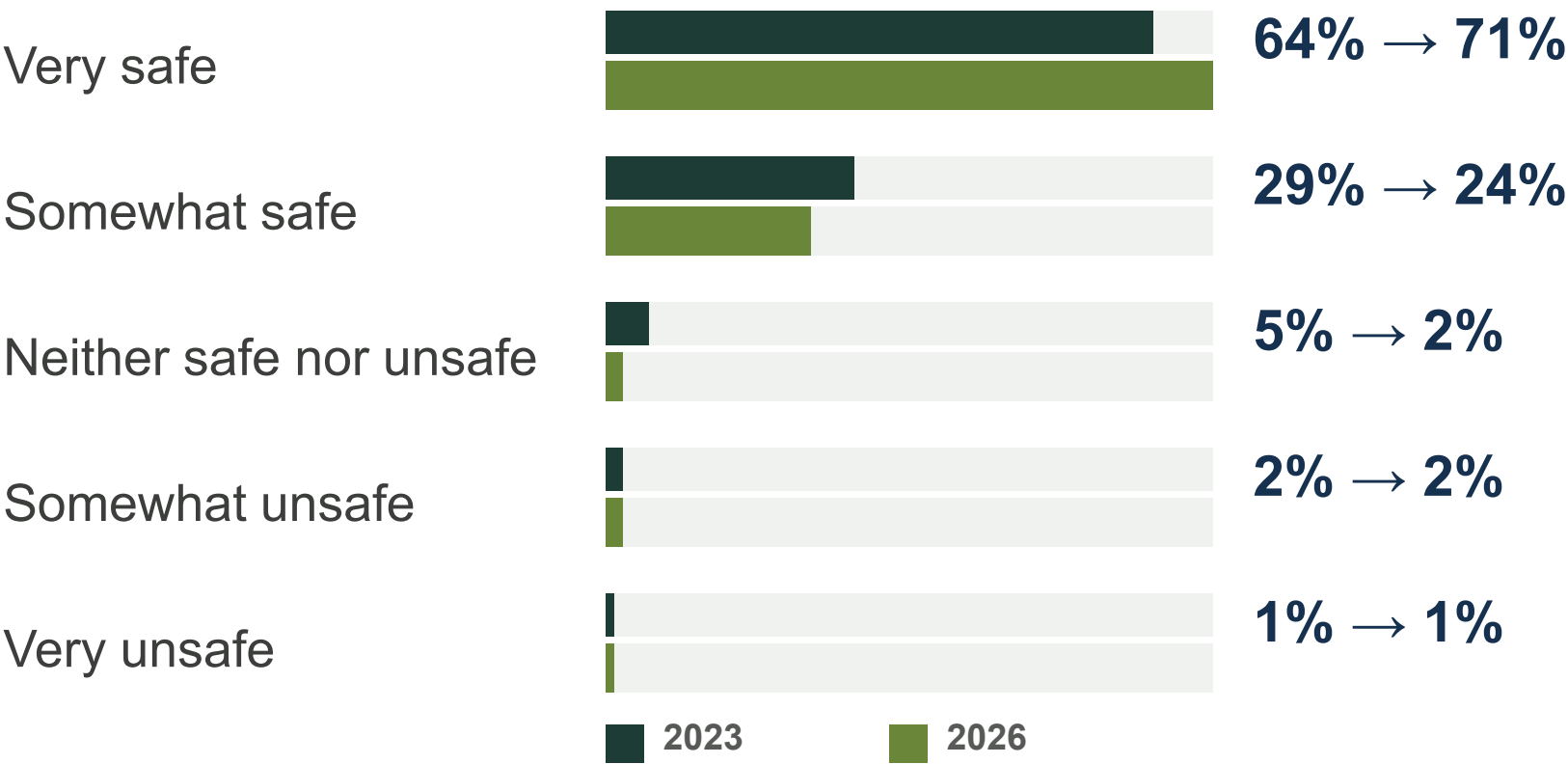

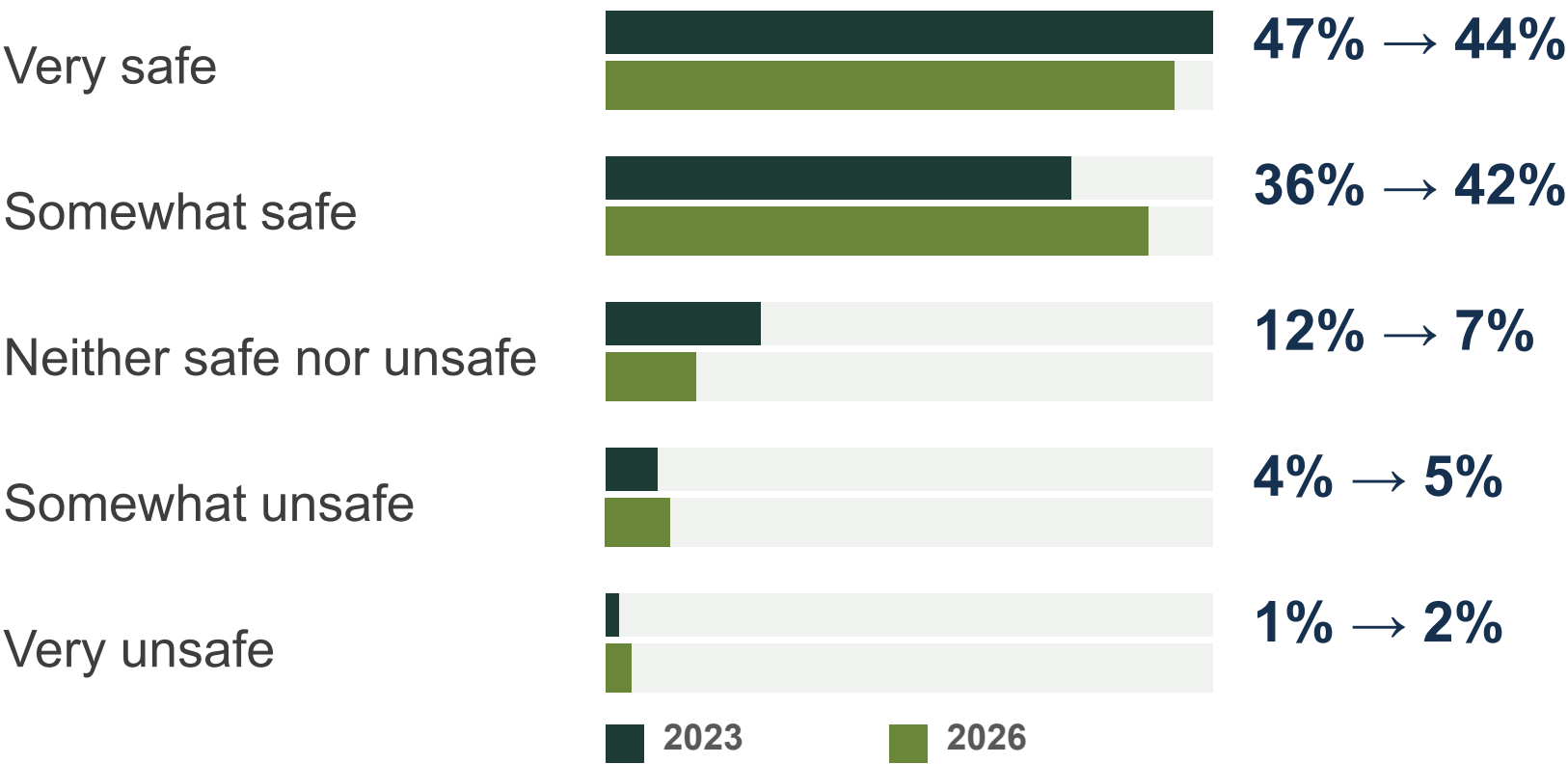

Please rate how safe or unsafe you feel in downtown Naperville at night.

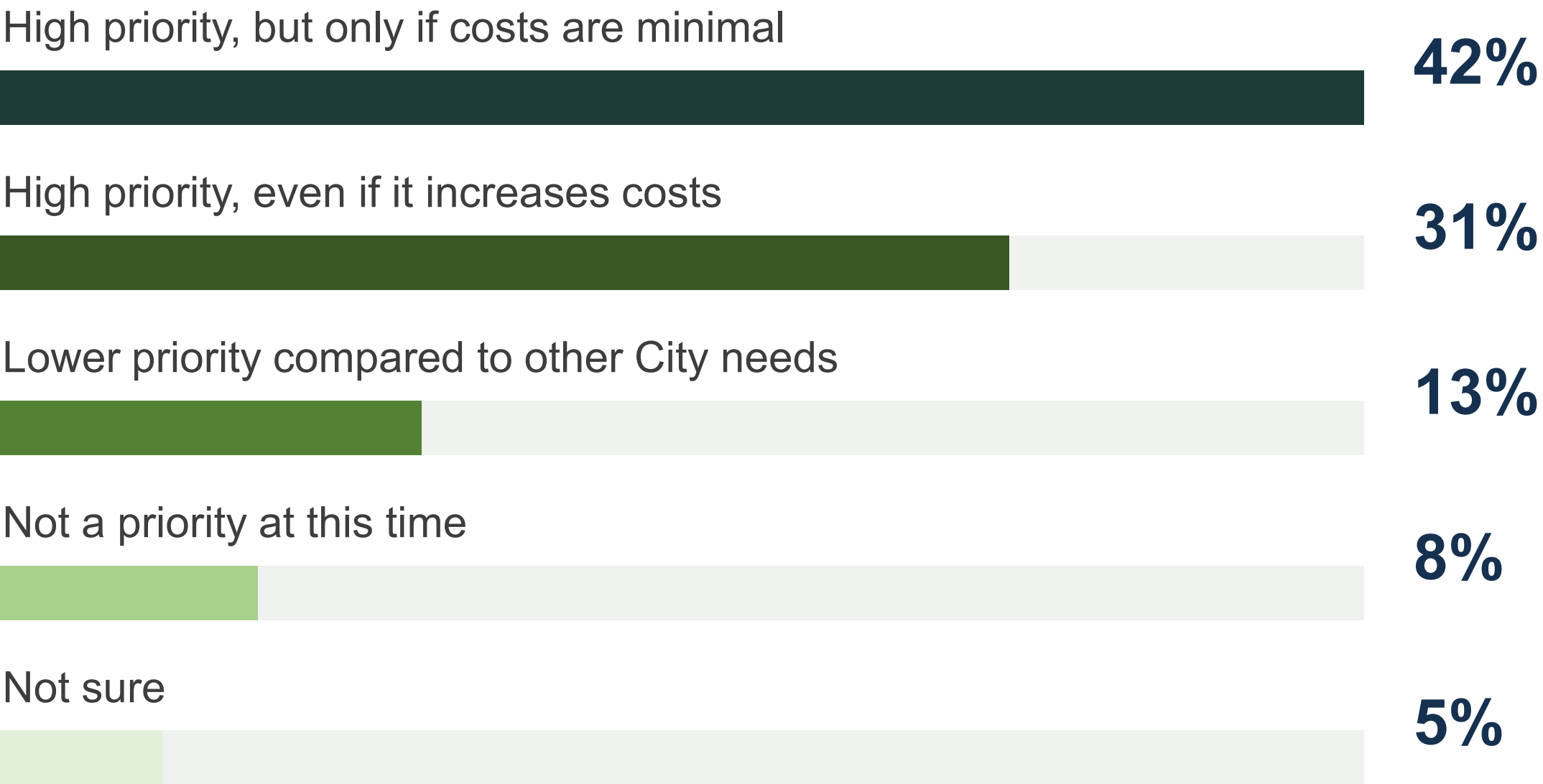

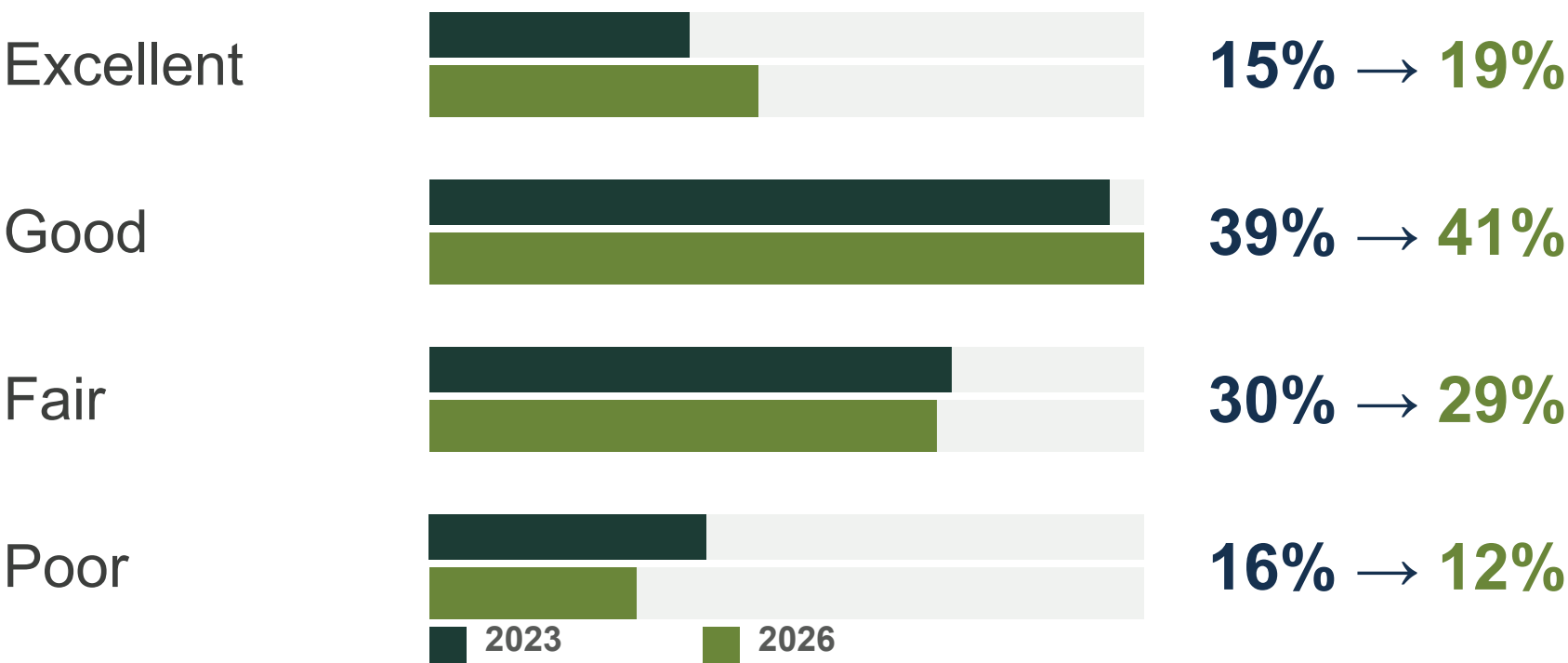

Please rate the ease of parking in downtown Naperville.

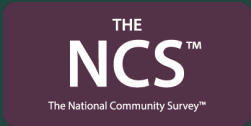

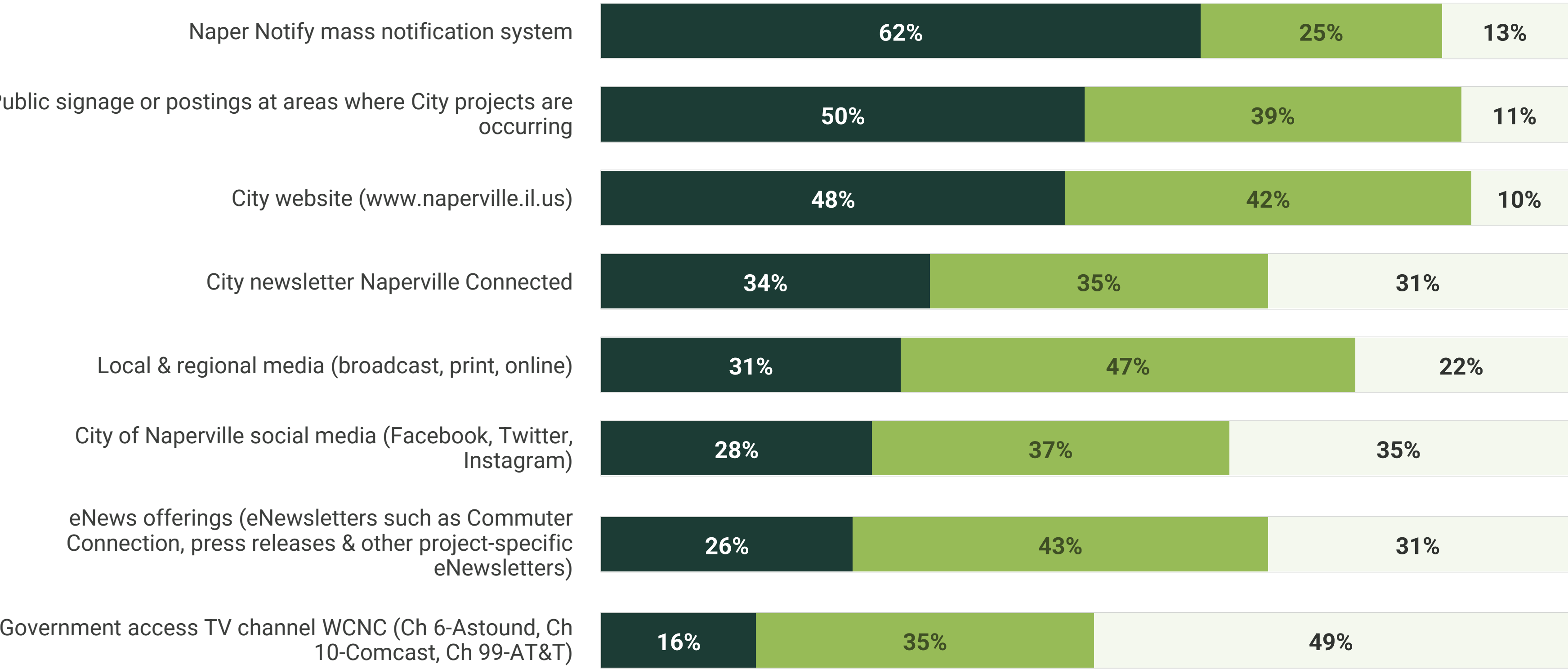

Summary of Findings



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- Naperville earns high praise as a place to live and raise children.
- Residents feel safe and give public safety services good marks.
- The economy scored very well, though affordability remains an area to improve.
- Mobility services scored well, though ratings for ease of travel varied by transportation mode.
- Appearance and community design were highly rated, despite modest declines in some planning measures.
- Residents voiced strong support for educational and cultural offerings, with the library topping the ratings.

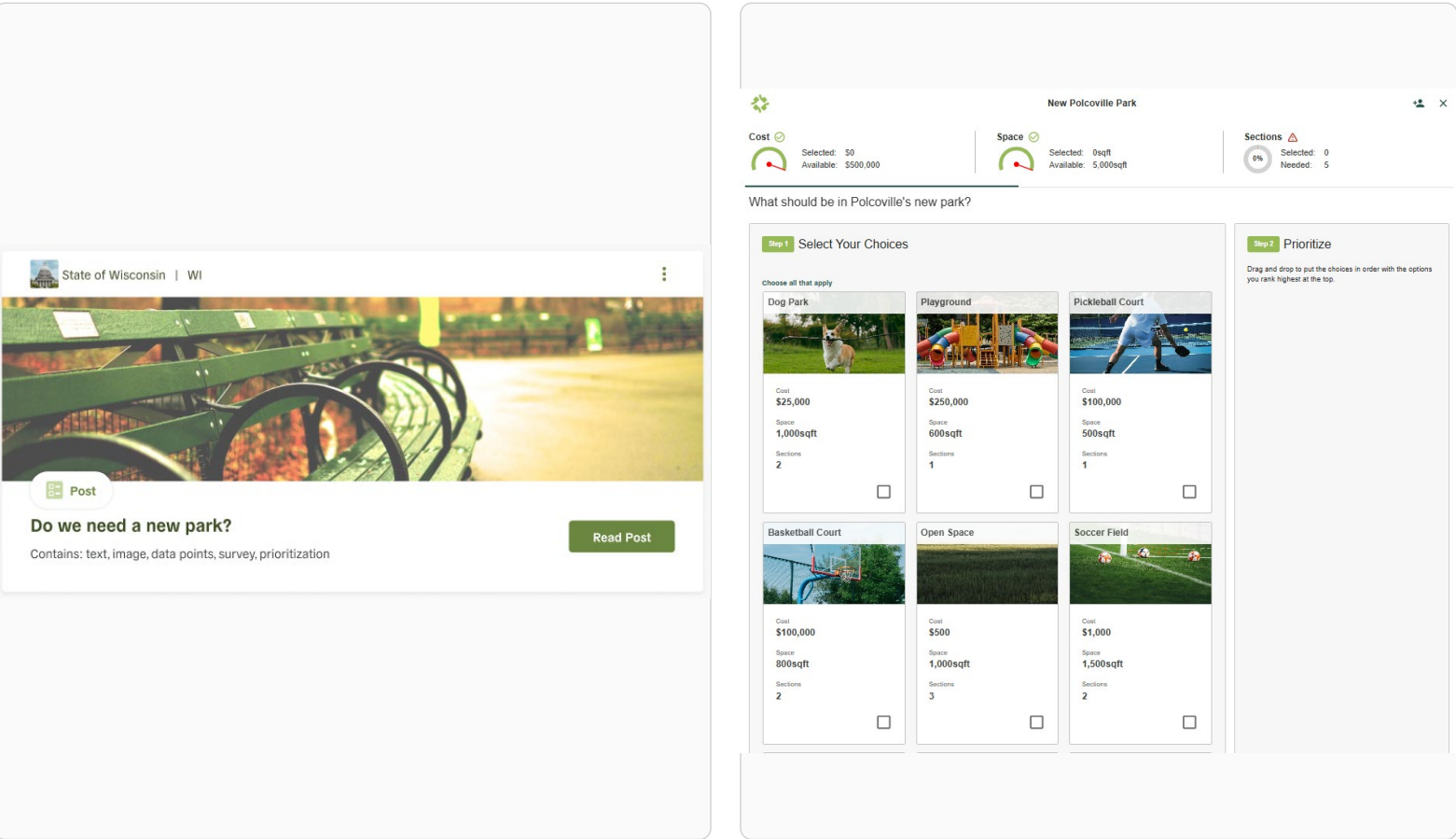

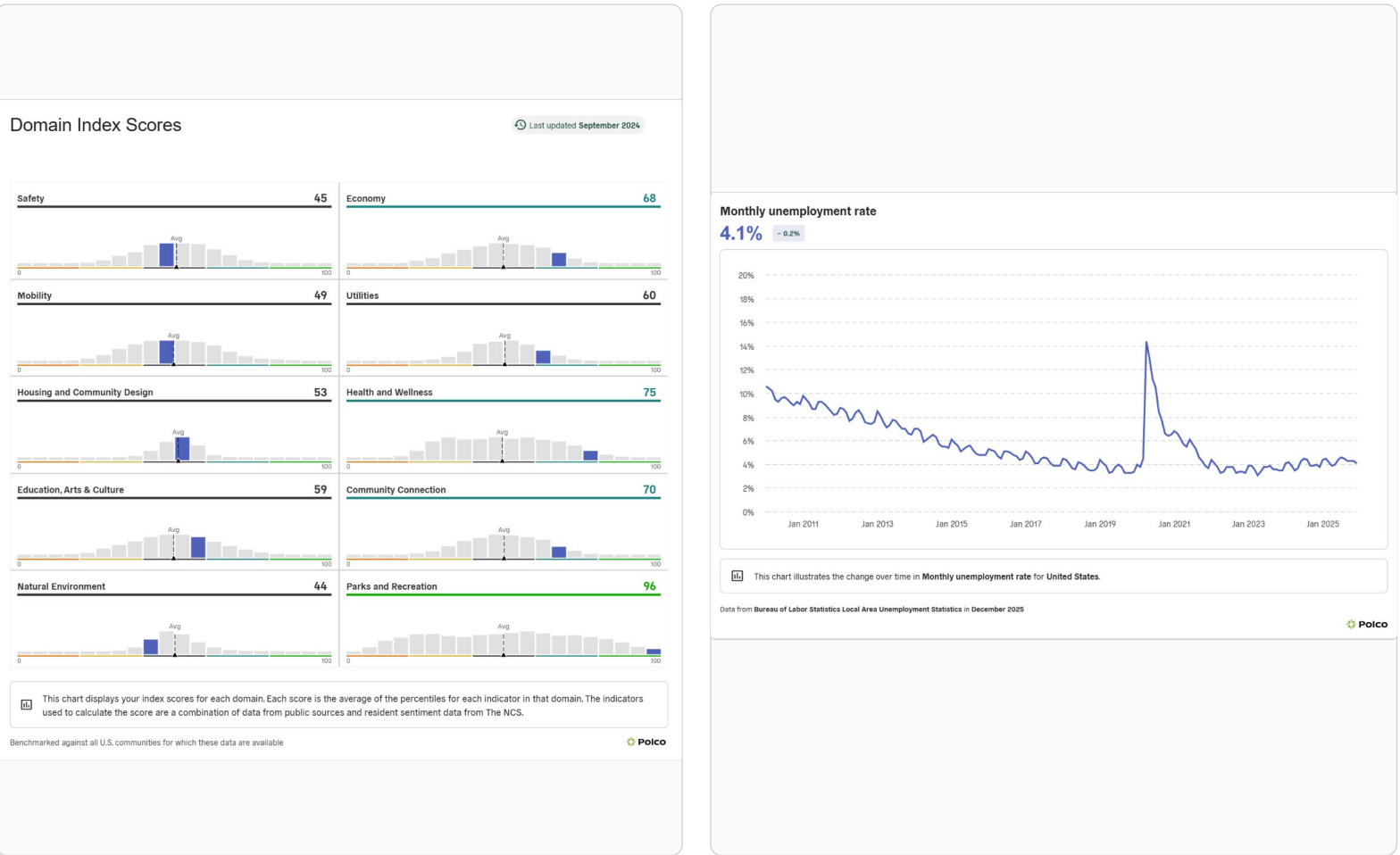
