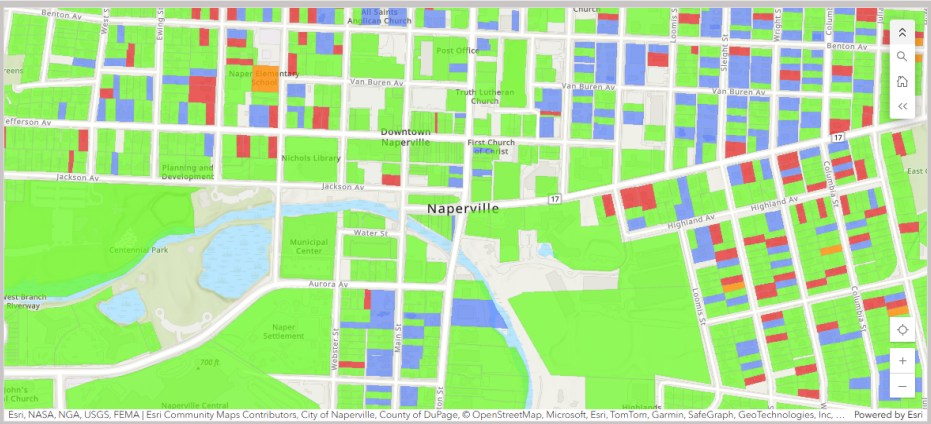


The City of Naperville's **Lead Service Line Replacement Program** is working towards removing all known lead service lines within the city at no cost to homeowners. Local ordinance banned lead pipes in 1960. However, lead water service was not banned nationally by the U.S. EPA until 1986. Beginning in 2024, the Illinois EPA will require all municipalities to establish annual lead service replacement plans in an effort to eradicate lead infrastructure.

Naperville is committed to providing clean, safe, and reliable drinking water to all customers and is taking an aggressive approach to replace lead service lines well in advance of IEPA deadlines. The City regularly tests its drinking water to ensure water quality meets or exceeds all parameters.
