### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3 (BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 3 (LIQUOR AND TOBACCO CONTROL), SECTION 3 (DEFINITIONS) AND SECTION 11 (LIQUOR LICENSE AND PERMIT CLASSIFICATIONS) OF THE NAPERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPERVILLE, DUPAGE AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, in exercise of its home rule powers that:

SECTION 1: Title 3 (Business and License Regulations), Chapter 3 (Liquor and

Tobacco Control), Section 3 (Definitions) of the Naperville Municipal Code is hereby amended

by adding the underlined language as follows:

**3-3-3: - DEFINITIONS:** For the purposes of this Chapter, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

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### ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR through ALTERNATICE NICOTINE PRODUCT

BEER:	A beverage obtained by the alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or concoction of barley or other grain, malt, hops in water, including <u>cider</u> , beer, ale, stout, lager, porter and the like.
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# BREWERY PUB through VENDING MACHINE

VINOUS	Any alcoholic beverage obtained by the fermentation of the natural contents of fruits, or vegetables, containing sugar, including such beverages when fortified by the addition of alcohol or "spirits"; includes Mead.

**SECTION 2**: Title 3 (Business and License Regulations), Chapter 3 (Liquor and Tobacco Control), Section 11 (Liquor License and Permit Classifications) of the Naperville Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding the underlined language as follows:

	twenty-four (24) ounces of beer or six (6) ounces of wine. The permit holder					
	must be able to inactivate the access card if necessary to prevent violations					
	of the municipal code.					
	The permit holder must provide constant video monitoring of the customer					
	operated dispensing devices at all times during which the licensed					
	establishment is open to the public. The permit holder must keep recorded					
	footage from the video monitoring for at least ninety (90) days and must					
	provide the footage, upon request, to any agent of the local Liquor and					
	Tobacco Control Commissioner or other authorized law enforcement agent.					
	The permit holder must provide and maintain one (1) BASSET certified					
	employee to serve as an attendant monitoring the customer operated					
	dispensing devices for every thirty-five (35) customers operating the					
	dispensing devices within an establishment. The attendant(s) must remain					
	stationed within a reasonable distance and within the sightline of the					
	customer operated dispensing devices and monitor the service of alcohol					
	guarding against over and under age service, as well as any other					
	applicable regulations. The permit holder must not allow additional					
	customers to enter the licensed premises unless it is able to appropriately					
	staff attendants.					
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The permit holder and any on-premises manager will be joint and severally
liable for any municipal code violations concerning this permit.

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Entertainment Permit through Temporary Permit

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and

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approval.
