Greetings. I am Selvei Rajkumar, a resident of Naperville since 1998 writing this letter to you to give an introduction about us and our proposed project in the City of Naperville. We have applied for annexation and zoning with the City of Naperville team on September 7th, 2018. We met with a few neighbors in October, sent a letter to all the neighbors and hosted an open house to present our project. We are in the December 19th agenda for the Planning commission. I am attaching the recommendation letters from a few families from our Plainfield school and a recent news article regarding children being prepared for Kindergarten.

Who we are: My husband Kumar and I are the founders of KLA Schools of Plainfield, a franchise of KLA Schools; which is a Reggio Emilia Inspired preschool serving North Plainfield and the surrounding communities. We opened our doors in 2013 with the vision of *"Leaving traces in the community by nurturing young minds to be responsible, respectful, caring citizens and leaders"* and have been dedicated to the most exceptional learning environment for children. Since we opened our school, the results have been nothing short of humbling in their blessings to us, our staff, and most importantly the children and their families. We are also the founders of M.P.Foundation, with the intention *"to eliminate homelessness, by empowering Teachers, Families, School Leaders and Community Leaders by Creating Awareness for Early Education."*

Our Proposal:

My husband Kumar and I are humbled by this opportunity to present our proposal to build KLA Schools of Naperville, at 5S241 Tuthill Road and 5S255 Tuthill Road, Naperville, IL 60543. The sites are currently in unincorporated DuPage County and zoned residential. We request your approval to annex the property to the City of Naperville and grant us OCI zoning to operate a daycare center to help us serve the Naperville community.

Demand in Naperville: We are Naperville residents since 1998, and our son is now a sophomore in high school in Indian Prairie School District 204 (IPSD 204). We recognized the need for a high-quality preschool environment in Naperville since our son started his preschool education. I would like to share a recent Naperville Sun News article that corroborates our understanding for the need for a high-quality preschool here. On August 20, 2018, Naperville Sun News released a report from Illinois State Board of Education that showed 28 percent of kids who entered kindergarten in IPSD 204 last fall lacked skills in all three categories that experts say are keys to long-term academic success: social-emotional development, language and literacy, and math. In Community Unit School District 203, 19 percent of those tested last year did not have adequate skills in any of the three categories. Across Illinois, only 25 percent of students show full readiness for school, according to the State Board's first-ever statewide snapshot of kindergarten readiness based on observations conducted in kindergarten classrooms last fall.

It is critical that children are ready and prepared for Kindergarten, as it directly impacts their self-confidence, self-esteem, and long-term success in life.

Importance of high-quality early childhood education:

According to Heckmanequation.org, this graphic shows that the highest rate of economic returns come from the earliest investments in children, providing an eye-opening understanding that society invests too much money on later development when it is often too late to provide great value. It shows the economic benefits of investing early and building skill upon skill to provide greater success to more children and greater productivity and reduce social spending for society.


