2018 RECOMMENDATION #1 - UPDATE


Create objective criteria and an associated point system to score applications

- Amended Final Report document to include quantitative metrics
 - Attendance, additional revenue sources, self-sustaining
- Researched Midwest arts councils (Indiana, Wisconsin, Ohio)
- Received feedback from several current grantees
- Developed qualitative evaluation criteria
 - Quality, feasibility, benefit to community, benefit to artistic community, and self evaluation
 - Commission to develop common definitions around criteria

2018 RECOMMENDATION #2 - UPDATE

Maintain diversity of the SECA Grant Fund awards


- Funding for cultural experiences and other celebrations will decrease without continuous evaluation of special event costs
- Stakeholder consensus is to stay true to SECA mission and encourage a variety of applications
- Funded 54 events and celebrations in CY19



2018 RECOMMENDATION #3 - UPDATE

Reinstate the 2% annual escalator, or CPI, whichever is lower

- 2013 implemented
- 2014 removed from SECA and obligated to the Sportsman's Park remediation
- 2016 terminated and final Sportsman's Park payment was made from SECA Grant reserve funds
- 2019 reinstated and realized \$38,000 for SECA applicants
 - \$948,567 available in discretionary funding



2018 RECOMMENDATION #4 - UPDATE

Eliminate the Legacy Events category and return Ribfest and the Last Fling to the Special Event category to receive the same funding and logistic evaluation as all other events

SECA Commission evaluated the events and received support from a consensus of the City Council for funding recommendations

- Creation of grant fund sub-categories
- No implementation of a sunset policy
- Revise application and reduce workshops
- Christkindlmarket and Ribfest awards
 - 2019 Christkindlmarket
 - 2020 Ribfest and Christkindlmarket

Creation of grant fund sub-categories changes to provide more funding level detail

- Special Events 50%
- Cultural Amenities 50%
 - Capital projects/permanent 25%
 - Visual arts/temporary 15%
 - Performing arts 20%
 - New initiatives 20%
 - Annual Call for Projects theme 20%

- Applications must meet same eligibility and reporting requirements
- Unallocated funds will be made available to other grant categories

Sunset Policy

- Pro:
 - Define the purpose of SECA Grant Fund program
 - Seed new applications or support in perpetuity
- Con:
 - Implementation timing
 - Likely exceptions to the policy
- Negative recommendation to implement a Sunset Policy
- Commission deem grantee ineligible if receiving awards for a number of years with no effort to become self-sustaining
- Commission evaluate evidence of community support to continue funding and appropriate funding level

Application and Workshops

- Revise application
- Eliminate one SECA Commission workshop
- Implement Q/A process in lieu of workshop
- Proposed 2020 application season:
 - September 2019 Applications due
 - October 2-9, 2019 Q/A
 - October 12, 2019 SECA Commission workshop with applicants
 - November 6, 2019 SECA Commission meeting to finalize funding
 - recommendations
 - Nov/Dec 2019 City Council review of SECA Commission
 - recommendations

Christkindlmarket will not return to Naper Settlement beginning in 2019 and Ribfest will relocate outside of Naperville for 2020

- ▶ 4a) Reallocate the award to fully fund all 2019 city services requests; remaining "underspend" applied to the 2021 grant year; or
- ▶ 4a) Reallocate the award to fully fund all 2019 city services requests; table applying the remaining "underspend" to the 2021 grant year; direct the Special Events Team to accept applications from the Naper Settlement and provide a recommendation to the City Council to be approved at a regularly scheduled public meeting
- 4b) Use SECA Challenge software as a survey tool to get public input on how the award funds should be reallocated; results presented to the City Council in July and staff directed accordingly
