### **BACKGROUND**:

The front plaza and parking deck of the Municipal Center, originally installed in 1991, have seen significant deterioration in areas that have resulted in increased structural failures annually. In September 2008, the Department of Public Works requested the City Council approve funding for the repair of the parking deck and front plaza at the Municipal Center. DPW commissioned a consultant evaluation and the development of a comprehensive plan for repair and maintenance of the front plaza and parking deck.

Phase I of the Municipal Center entry plaza improvements will include the reconstruction of the main entry stairs and construction of a new accessibility ramp to the building and partial hardscape area located by the main entry stairs. Additional work includes replacement of the

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snow melting system for the main stairs and entrance, removal of existing waterproofing membrane as well as installation of additional insulation and a new waterproofing membrane.

Phases 2-5 will include repairs to the upper parking deck and drive between the parking deck and building, repairs to the driveway circle drop-off pavement around the fountain, replacing all of the lighting fixtures, poles and foundations located on the plaza and upper parking deck and finally removing and replacing the remaining hardscape sidewalk around the building.

### **BID TABULATION**

The following bids were received:

Engineer's Estimate	\$326,725
RoMAAS, Inc.	\$379,900
Copenhaver Construction	\$389,000
Troop Contracting Inc.	\$460,000

The low bid was \$53,175 higher than the engineer's estimate. DPW's design consultant reviewed a breakdown of the low bidder's construction costs to understand the difference. The consultant found that the concrete and metal railing costs were higher than anticipated. In addition, it was determined that the estimate was not updated when the area of the snow melt system was increased to include the newly designed accessible ramp area.

The City has not previously worked with RoMAAS, Inc. but staff has checked multiple references provided for work completed in neighboring municipalities and received favorable feedback. Further, staff is confident that RoMAAS, Inc. fully understands the scope of work and has the knowledge and manpower to complete the work on time and within budget.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

CIP #: MB136 – Municipal Center Front Plaza and Parking Deck Repairs and Upgrades

The services for this contract are expensed to the Public Work's Capital Improvement Program within the account listed below. The funding for the project is provided from prior year G.O. Bond Funds. Since the project inception in 2008, a total of \$480,000 has been budgeted and borrowed for MB136. To date the project has expensed \$43,495 and transferred \$124,800 for emergency electric upgrades at the Police Department in 2013 (MB189). The remaining available funds for this project are \$311,625. Savings from other Public Work's CIP projects will be used to offset the overage of \$53,175.

The projects were prioritized by: 1) Safety implications, 2) Structural integrity and 3) MB136. DPW commissioned an A&E consultant to evaluate conditions focused on these two projects to develop a plan for the deck driving surface, joint crack-filling, miscellaneous concrete repairs, upgrading light fixtures, and landscaping.
