Executive Order 2020 - 04

EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NAPERVILLE

RECITALS

- 1. **WHEREAS**, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak to be a public health emergency of international concern; and
- 2. WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a proclamation on declaring a national emergency concerning the COVID-19 outbreak, and
- 3. **WHEREAS**, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued a disaster proclamation due to the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak and activated the State Emergency Operations Center; and
- 4. WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, at an emergency Naperville City Council meeting a local state of emergency and disaster related to the COVID-19 outbreak was declared (see, *Mayor of Naperville's Declaration of a Local State of Emergency and Disaster* and *City of Naperville Ordinance 20-028 pertaining to a local state of emergency and disaster*); and
- 5. WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued an Executive Order requiring all residents of the State to stay at home until April 7, 2020, with certain exceptions of performing essential functions or duties, to help stop the spread of COVID-19.
- 6. WHEREAS, the City collects landscape waste once a week, and requires the purchase and placement of landscape stickers on bags, bundles or containers of landscape waste prior to pick up; and
- 7. WHEREAS, residents would need to leave their homes to purchase landscape waste stickers at various locations to have their landscape waste picked up during the "stay at home" Executive Order; and
- 8. **WHEREAS**, the City of Naperville is a home rule unit of local government and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and



affairs including, but not limited to, the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare, including taking immediate emergency measures to protect the public welfare in response to the COVID-19 outbreak; and

THEREFORE, by the powers vested in me as the Mayor of the City of Naperville, and pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 20 ILCS 3305/11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, Sections 10-1-1 and 1-8D of the Naperville Municipal Code, the Mayor of Naperville's Declaration of a Local State of Emergency and Disaster and City of Naperville Ordinance No. 20-028, I hereby order the following:

SECTION 1: Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made part hereof in their entirety by reference as though fully set forth in this Section 1.

SECTION 2: Section 4-2-3:3.2 of the Municipal Code, requiring an approved sticker affixed on all landscape waste bags, bundles or containers, shall be temporarily suspended and residents may place landscape waste bags, bundles and containers out for pickup without a sticker through April 7, 2020.

SECTION 3: **Effective date**. This Executive Order shall be in full force and effect from 12:00 A.M. on the date listed atop page one of this Order.
