In the matter of Case #19-1-095:

We are original owners of the property at [REDACTED] directly across Feldott from the De Franco property.

We have read the petition and reviewed each document thoroughly and would like to go on record as opposed to the proposed 6 foot fence that would basically encompass the entire corner of the DeFranco property.

In the 25 years that we have lived in Wildflower we have seen the community grow around us. Numerous car dealerships have gone up as well as retail businesses and along with this comes more traffic and more congestion.

In Wildflower, for example, traffic patterns down Feldott have increased and cars have been known to exceed the posted speed limit. The number of children in Wildflower has increased as Naperville has exceptional educational opportunities. With more of us working from home and the increase in the number of children at home, the neighborhood is always bustling. All of this coupled with the increase in Ford dealership trucks, and Amazon, Fed Ex, UPS and other such delivery service trucks makes Feldott a dangerous street for pedestrians and bikers, adults as well as children.

The property in question is also on a slight curve of the street and it is already difficult for a driver to see if there might be a car coming off Caraway Court.

If there was a 6 foot fence all around the corner, it would make it even more difficult for a driver to have a clear view of other traffic. Wildflower has requested many times stop signs in our subdivision to slow traffic down a bit.

As we understand the Naperville ordinance, a house on a corner can only erect a 4 foot fence. We would like to say that this would be an appropriate compromise to the situation.

It is our request that you reconsider the 6 foot fence and compromise with a 4 foot fence for the safety reasons outlined in this email.

It is all of our responsibility to make sure everyone is safe and not put in unnecessary danger by speeding cars and trucks.
