Thank you for taking the time to read my concerns regarding the possible housing development on the Nokia property.

- 1. 39th Street continuation: We have recently uncovered there is proposal to connect 39th street to the new housing development. I feel if this were to be allowed to happen it would negligent for the following reasons as outlined below.
 - a. Our neighborhood streets are not designed to allow 2 cars to pass one another at the same time safely.
 - b. Our neighborhood streets do not have street lights, curbs, or sidewalks. Dear Naperville Planning Commission,

I've been a resident of the Fairmeadow neighborhood for more than 19 years, and I'd like to share my concerns with you regarding the proposed development behind the Nokia property adjacent to the Danada Forest Preserve, the Herrick Lake Forest Preserve and our home. I see four major issues with the project that need to be addressed before moving any further.

1.

2. Access

- 3. to 39th Street. In documents provided by Pulte (and
- 4. confirmed in our conversation with their attorney), the current plan includes a connection to our neighborhood at 39th Street, which currently dead-ends at the Nokia property. Anyone who takes the time to visit our neighborhood would quickly see this is a
- 5. terrible idea. Our roads are only 16 feet wide, with no street lights or sidewalks. It is often filled with kids playing and people walking their dogs, riding their bikes or exercising, particularly during this pandemic. Two large SUVs barely fit side by side
- 6. in the street. When visitors park their cars, only one car can pass through. Pulte's attorney off-handedly suggested that residents of their new development wouldn't use our neighborhood as a pass-through, but this is extremely short-sighted. Anyone traveling
- 7. south from Wheaton on Naperville road would make a right-hand turn on Fairmeadow rather than continue onto the entrance at Lucent Lane and potentially have to stop at a light or deal with traffic backed up at the Naperville Road/Warrenville Road intersection.

8.

Those who visit our neighborhood would also see that 39th Street and Delles Road don't meet

at a 90-degree angle. The Y-shaped turn would be challenging for delivery vehicles and trucks to make without driving over our neighbor's yard, even with no other cars around. Navigation software like Google Maps or Waze would send additional traffic our way as people try to avoid the intersection of Naperville and Warrenville Roads. This isn't only about the quality of life in our neighborhood—it's a serious safety issue that could have horrible consequences.

2.

3. Stormwater:

- 4. Our neighborhood, like many over the last few years,
- 5. has seen an increase in flooding. Big rains mean that our yards (and too often basements) are covered in water. This project will only exasperate the situation by taking away valuable wetlands and open space that helps absorb the water. This affects not only
- 6. our neighborhood but also the surrounding areas. We have personally seen 50-year and 100-year floods happen much more frequently than expected in the past decade all around the Chicago area, and taking away a valuable water cache will make the problem worse.
- 7. A high-density development like this proposal is not an appropriate land use.

4. The

- 5. **berm.** Pulte wants to remove the berm that separates
- 6. our development from the Nokia property and its new homes. The berm was created to block sound and light and keep our neighborhood separate from a "temporary" parking lot that Lucent installed more than two decades ago. It has worked well, and the neighborhood
- 7. has benefitted from the added green space. With years of construction ahead if this project moves forward, the berm would be a welcome barrier to diminish noise and light pollution. It also serves as a barrier to separate the water runoff from the Pulte homes
- **8.** and keep it out of our neighborhood.

5. Traffic:

- 6. Nearly 200 homes near the intersection of Naperville
- 7. Road and Warrenville Road are going to be an unwelcome addition to an area that has the potential to be a traffic nightmare. Just south of I-88, a new Costco is opening up. An Amazon Fresh grocery delivery center will mean added delivery vehicles and visitors.

- 8. Freedom Commons will return as a popular dining destination once the pandemic ends. The industrial corridor along Warrenville Road currently has an extremely low occupancy rate. That won't last forever, and if the Nokia property reaches close to its potential
- 9. number of employees (or the building is sublet to other tenants), the intersection at Naperville Road and Warrenville Road will not be able to handle it all. Folks who've been living in this neighborhood longer than I have remember what it was like when Lucent
- 10. was at full capacity, and traffic was routinely backed up past Fairmeadow on Naperville Road. We don't want to return to those days. We, and the rest of Wheaton and other suburbs north of here, want continued access to the shopping and restaurants that north
- 11. Naperville has to offer.

12.

Thank you very much for your attention to this matter. I'm not reflexively against the development of this or any other property. But whatever happens to this lot should reflect the existing land use in the area, protect the bordering forest preserves, and keep in mind the quality of life in neighborhoods that have been here for more than half a century.

City of Naperville, Planning & Zoning Commission:

We are writing to express our concerns regarding PZC #20-1-086, Naper Commons. As Fairmeadow residents and immediate neighbors to this proposed housing development, there are a number of red flags that we feel warrant further consideration. These concerns include the sheer density of the project, the proposed cut through of roads to join the Fairmeadow neighborhood to Naper Commons, and the loss of the berm dividing the neighborhoods.

With regards to density, Pulte's requests for changes in variances with regards to side yards and housing styles indicate that they are primarily concerned with the quantity of homes that can placed as close together as possible. The density of this plan is not consistent with surrounding areas, which includes a relatively small townhome neighborhood, our neighborhood with relatively large lots, and the beautiful acreage of the DuPage County Forest Preserve. Tiny housing lots packed into a relatively small space seems like a lucrative plan for Pulte, but it does not support quality of life for either the new residents of Naper Commons or its neighbors. Issues related to air pollution, noise pollution, stormwater runoff, and irritation to current area wildlife could be lessened with a reduction in density and/or rejection of variances requested by Pulte.

Connecting Fairmeadow neighborhood to Naper Commons via 39th Street would be dangerous to our neighborhood. We are happily unincorporated and have no sidewalks, curbs, or street lights. Our roads are relatively narrow. This current situation works for our neighborhood as we have a single entrance and exit with no through traffic. As the parents of small children, the idea of cars cutting through our neighborhood to reach Naper Commons or to avoid the busy corner at Naper Blvd. and Warrenville Road is frightening to say the least. Our roads and our neighborhood are not built to withstand or safely host that type of traffic. At best this would detract from the quiet and enjoyment of our neighborhood, and at worst, it causes a significant safety risk to all of the neighborhood residents, especially children. Additionally, Naperville Commons already has multiple entrances/exits, and our neighborhood is not required as one of these.

The loss of the berm, which currently (and for the past 60 years) divides our property from Nokia, would be devastating. It provides a natural and beautiful buffer between our neighborhood and whatever lies beyond it to the east. The berm assists with water runoff management (already a

neighborhood concern) and prevents noise pollution and visual pollution. Additionally, the berm is a current sled hill, water slide, hiking area, and location of beautiful mature trees. We realize that the berm is not ours, but perhaps this is an instance where quality of life and privacy might be considered above profit for the developers of this land. In the scope of this multi-million dollar project, could being a "good neighbor" be valued by the City of Naperville and Pulte over potential small percentage of profit lost by leaving the berm in place? A short, see through rail fence, as proposed by Pulte would provide zero benefits to either neighborhood. Additionally, Pulte boasts 30% open space in their plans; are we not able to benefit from some of that green space as a courtesy from our new neighbors?

Thank you for your review and consideration in this matter. We understand that this development will very likely move forward; however, we are wondering if it's possible that our safety, quality of life, and the Forest Preserve around us can be better protected with some modifications to the development plan. There must be a place in this process where our neighborhood is considered, where financial gain does not trump all other issues.

Dear Naperville Planning & Zoning Commission,

We are writing to you in regards to the Naper Commons development. We are 15 year residents in the Fairmeadow community that borders the proposed Naper Commons to the east. We understand this is private property that has been re-zoned to residential, however, the proposed plans for this new development lack concern for it's neighbors; both forest preserve and Fairmeadow residents.

Please consider the following:

Storm Water Runoff: Many in our community have issues with our yards flooding when it rains and we are very concerned that this problem will worsen with the impervious surfaces being added (i.e. roads, roofs, sidewalks). We're concerned that Pulte will grade the property in our direction causing water to flow toward our direction worse than ever before, or raise their elevation higher, as they did with their Loretto Club in Wheaton, causing flooding in Seven Gables Park and the surrounding resident's properties in Wheaton.

39th Street Connection: Traffic is also an enormous concern as they are proposing connecting their neighborhood roads to our 39th St. We currently have only one road in, which is Fairmeadow Lane, and all roads dead end. We only get the traffic of our neighbors and their guests. Connecting their subdivision would increase the traffic greatly on our narrow lanes which is a safety concern considering we have no sidewalks or streetlights. The streets are where we take walks and our children ride bikes.

Privacy: There is a berm currently in place between us and Nokia's property that was installed decades ago as a courtesy to our community by Lucent Technologies. When K. Hovnanian proposed developing the lot two years ago they too stated, out of respect for our community, they would not touch the berm. Pulte plans, however, to flatten it and pack as many homes tightly together against our lot lines as possible on tiny 120 foot deep lots, 4 homes to back on to my lot alone. This is excessive.

We could also go on about the blue herons that are busy building nests every spring setting up house in their rookery, or the deer families that wander the area in winter & the bald eagle sightings amongst other wildlife we will be robbed of due to this development. This saddens me deeply. I don't believe you can squeeze 241 residences against forest preserve and expect it will not have a huge impact on the surrounding wild life and wetlands.

In conclusion, we ask that you take our concerns into account in addition to other residents and agencies that have reached out to you with concerns in regards to this proposed development.

As a neighbor of the proposed Naper Commons development, I have urgent concerns regarding the impact of a huge development on the quality of life in this portion of Naperville. I believe that the proposed development is an egregious and unnecessary use of undeveloped land in an era when many commercial buildings and properties – that have existing infrastructures – are vacant, for sale, and are ripe for rezoning and redevelopment.

These concerns include:

- 1. Population density. Basically, there are too many homes. Pulte is requesting changes to the setbacks of the lots, i.e., smaller lot sizes than zoning allows, in order to squeeze 214 residences into Naper Commons. In addition, that development area includes a small strip of land that begins at Naperville Road and borders Danada Woods Townhomes, where Pulte is proposing to build townhomes. Some of these will abut, within a few feet, the existing southernmost Danada Woods Townhomes on Grove Court. There is no valid reason to stuff (I believe 30) townhomes into this strip of land that is adjacent to these homes and the Danada Woods Townhomes' property.
- **2. Increased traffic on Naperville Road** will be further compounded by traffic generated by the rezoning of the ATT/Lucent/Nokia building at the front of the Nokia complex to accommodate many more businesses and employees, and by the construction of two huge nearby new retail areas, Costco, and a \$19 million shopping center on the northwest corner of East Ogden Avenue and North Naper Boulevard.
 - Naperville Road is our only access to enter and exit Danada Woods Townhomes. Currently, heavy traffic often makes accessing Naperville Road very difficult.
- **3. Stormwater issues** on the Nokia property are well-documented and have been a concern for many years.
 - Pulte's record on environmental issues, as witnessed by numerous successful lawsuits against them, including violating the clean water act, is not good.
- **4.** Three years of construction traffic, heavy machinery, trucks, noise, dust and dirt. That is, if all goes to plan and the new homes sell quickly. If they do not, the construction could take even longer. Would you want three years or more of construction next to your home? This will not only adversely impact the daily quality of daily life throughout the adjacent neighborhoods, but will have a negative effect on any homeowner in these neighborhoods who wants to or has to sell their property during this time.
- 5. The negative impact to the value of the Danada Woods Townhomes. In its presentation to Danada Woods' owners, Rosanova & Whitaker (Pulte's law firm) stated that the price point of the townhomes to be built on the site will be roughly \$330,000 to \$380,000. This will mean that selling townhomes in Danada Woods, a 20-year-old development, will be in direct competition with the new townhomes, especially since the new townhomes are planned to be at or near the same size of those in Danada Woods. When buying a brand new or much older home of the same size for the same price, which would people choose?
- **6. Destruction of the natural environment.** One of the "advantages" of the property listed in the Naper Commons project overview is that "Naper Commons is nestled almost within the Danada Forest Preserve, creating a quiet enclave with unparalleled access to preserved open space and passive recreational

amenities." How can the construction of a large new development "almost" within the forest preserve not impact the forest preserve and wildlife? Where will the wildlife go? What about the blue heron rookery that is very close to the property? It is a natural wonder.

I have encountered animals on the Nokia property that I have never seen on the Danada Woods Townhomes property, which is just a few feet away from the Nokia property.


Included at the end of this letter are photos from the Nokia property of a killdeer, double crested cormorant and of a deer. Also included is a photo of the nearby blue heron rookery and of a sandhill crane encountered on a forest preserve path very close to the Nokia property.

Suburban sprawl has often displaced and decimated the natural environment, and this is no exception.

I sincerely hope that the Naperville Planning Commission will take my concerns, and those of many of my neighbors, into consideration before awarding its seal of approval to this long-term project. Please take the time and effort to thoroughly research its impact to the environment and to the existing community.

As individual homeowners and collectively as the Fairmeadow Neighborhood Association, we have serious concerns about Pulte's proposed development of Lot 4 of the Nokia Property, which shows little respect for its unique location, environment and neighbors (both forest preserve and residential).

The plan is out of proportion to its surroundings and raises many red flags, especially in terms of the many variances it is seeking.

- 1. Pulte's proposed **density** for this development is ridiculously high and not sustainable to the constraints of the land. It is also inconsistent with the surrounding area/neighborhoods in scope and scale.
- 2. Per Pulte's plan, it would like to sacrifice our neighborhood as a cut-through for its large-scale development by connecting <u>39th Street</u>, potentially introducing thousands of cars daily via our neighborhood's **narrow lanes that have no sidewalks nor street lights.** Diverting traffic through Fairmeadow is impractical and downright **dangerous** for our entire neighborhood.

Speaking of traffic, Pulte's proposed high-density plan will add **significant traffic congestion** to already very busy corridors of Naperville Road, Ogden Ave., I-88 and its access ramps, Freedom Drive, Warrenville Road and Butterfield Road—corridors also on the verge of adding a Costco and big-box grocery store in the coming months. Traffic studies commissioned by the builder do not seem to paint a complete and accurate picture of the impacted area.

3. Pulte is also proposing to bulldoze an existing earthen feature (berm) that is a natural, attractive barrier between Fairmeadow, the forest preserve and the proposed development. Removing this **buffer and transitional zone**makes no sense. Same goes for razing the scores of trees (some of them more than 50 years old) on or near this berm. Removing this hill would exacerbate noise and light pollution created by the new development, during construction and after. Conversely, the berm also would serve as a

barrier to Pulte's future customers who will likewise have no protection and privacy under the existing plan.

Furthermore, we would like to see a substantial green-space buffer around the entire development to lessen the project's negative impact in its unique setting.

4. The proposal is excessively close to crucial forest preserve habitat and Fairmeadow neighborhood. The proposed development shares three sides with publicly protected land (two different forest preserves, actually— the 887-acre Herrick Lake and the 797-acre Danada Forest Preserves that serve the people of DuPage County). Both preserves have been carefully compiled and protected by our forest district over the past century. The preserves are home to more than 254 wildlife species and 470 different types of plants, while humans seek fresh air, exercise and refuge here every single day. Specifically, there is a cyclical Great Blue Heron rookery only a few hundred meters from the property.

Now imagine a thousand toilets flushing, thousands of lights and hundreds of cars traveling on the edges of these protected lands. Every single day. Think about the noise and light pollution, the trash generated, the stormwater runoff.

5. Just as alarming, this parcel is a wetland; actually, this whole area is a fragile wetland. This development plan stubbornly ignores that issue and will, in fact, **make already tenuous stormwater issues much worse**, not only for adjacent residents but populations further "downstream" across DuPage County.

We believe that a **full study** needs to be performed of the **entire watershed to reassess flooding risk and elevations.** We believe that there is additional flooding risk to the existing homes that are already experiencing issues as well as risk to the proposed development. **The proposed development's overall impact needs to be assessed with all of the stakeholders in the watershed before any decisions are made.**

6. Pulte also is requesting a significant number of variances to Naperville's zoning ordinances— alterations that make many aspects of the development unpalatable. We ask the Naperville Planning Commission to reject this proposal because it is not in accordance with the existing measures put in place by the City of Naperville to protect this area.

The Fairmeadow Neighborhood Association urges the City of Naperville to reject Pulte's requested proposal for development. The Naperville City Council and the Planning Commission have been given the responsibility to be good stewards of the community, and this project fails to live up the standards that have been put in place to protect both the environment and our overall quality of life in DuPage County.



This recent plan from PULTE homes, LLC has very serious drawbacks, the property is directly adjacent to a thriving Rookery of Ardea herodias, the "Great Blue Heron". They are Federally protected under The Migratory Bird Treaty Act(16 U.S.C.,703–712), henceforth, the "MBTA".

Constitutionally, this law overrides both State and Local regulations, and has been validated in *Missouri v. Holland*, and in a very recent case ruled on August 11, 2020, Federal Judge Valerie Caproni ruled upon contractors who sought to ease penalties on accidental or incidental disturbance of protected birds by the oil and gas industry and construction companies in the course of doing business. Homebuilders are just as liable. Note that MBTA also grants full protection to any bird parts including feathers, eggs, and nests.

She opined: "There is nothing in the text of the MBTA that suggests that in order to fall within its prohibition, activity must be directed specifically at birds". Meaning construction or wetland modification with no "ill intent".

In the fall of 2014, PZC heard planners from the CSO, and the Rookery was documented then.

In winter of 2019, PZC heard from K. Hovnanian Homes, that also had a discussion about the nearby Rookery.

This month, during Pulte's Zoom meeting for locals, the presence of the Rookery was noted by them, albeit dismissively.

In fall of 2011, the Dupage Forest Preserve approached the owners in a bid to buy the land. The offer was rejected on price principals, the Corporate "stewardship" aspect was completely ignored, as was the fact that they own property falling under the MBTA's authority.

The Rookery has been geo-mapped this past Sunday. The water level is very high, alarmingly, it goes to within 30 feet of Nokia land. As does Heron's nests, they are Incredibly close of the west side now, unlike back in 2011 where they were more centrally located.

North side: 2 nests

East side: 12-13 nests (abandoned or under construction causes difficulty counting) West side: 5 nests, 3 of which are almost on the Nokia property line.



Dear Naperville Planning and Zoning Commission members,

In reference to: Case# 20-1-086 - Naper Commons

To start off with I am disappointed with the timeframe given for public comment from the time notices were received in the mail to the time that public comment is due on a project of this size during a time of global pandemic. I am also disappointed with the developers efforts to take input from our neighborhood prior to this past week, their sharing of partial information they clearly felt was safe to present, accepting input and questions but not following up on any of them before public comments were due. Yes, they did not have to do that at all but the whole exercise should not be construed as Pulte involving area residents in the process. This all provided a false sense that they may actually review and or address any questions and issues before bringing this to the Planning and Zoning Commision.

Our neighborhood pre-existed development in the area with houses constructed on farmland in the late 1950s. More than one of our residents has lived in the neighborhood for over 50 years, with many residents having lived here for 30-40 years. Several families have grown up in the neighborhood and have now bought property and are raising their families in the neighborhood. During this time the neighborhood has seen lots of development proposals, lots of actual development, the traffic problems during the peak of ATT employment, and increased flooding. I feel that the proposed development does not necessarily follow the purpose of a planned unit development as defined in Naperville code section: "6-4-2: - PURPOSE AND INTENT" - Unless the creative approach involves packing as many units as close together and making excuses as to why they need to have variances or they will not be able to offer as pleasing of architecture versus just

building less houses. I am also not sure if water detention and a small park area matches the intent of "To preserve natural features and environmental resources, and provide outdoor common area, open space and recreation areas in excess of that required under existing zoning regulations." in the purpose and intent.

Concerns about the Naper Commons Development

Connection to 39th Street

The connection of the Fairmeadow neighborhood to the new development will be disastrous to the Fairmeadow neighborhood. The fairmeadow neighborhood has very narrow 16' wide streets with no street lights or sidewalks and a number of families with young children. Arguments that residents of the proposed development will never drive through the fairmeadow neighborhood is entirely unrealistic.

- 1. We formally request that the new developments roads are not extended to 39th Street in the Fairmeadow neighborhood, as it jeopardizes the safety of our neighborhood.
- 2. Naperville's planning departments assertion that this would be in the best interest of our neighborhood is incorrect.
- 3. How would Naperville and the developer propose to stop people's GPS devices from taking them though our neighborhood?
- 4. In addition the school buses have not picked up on Naperville road but have picked up in our neighborhood for more than a year now.
- 5. We would much rather traffic light interconnection like we have now with the lights at the Forest Preserve headquarters where a sensor at our street will cause the lights to the north of us to turn red.

Traffic

Traffic during rush hour times has already been an issue for Naperville and Warrenville Roads and the submitted traffic study seems to indicate this with the through traffic already having level of service values of D, E, and F. Yes the turn light times are high but the through traffic is still at a D. Especially going north and south on Naperville Road from Warrenville Road to Ogden. Costco will make that worse, this development will make this worse, and increased office occupancy will make this worse.

The existing Nokia Buildings are 1.8 Million Square Feet - the Woodfield Mall is 2.1 million square feet in comparison. At the peak while the buildings were still ATT buildings there were more than 7000 employees in the buildings or 257 square feet per employee. North American average is currently 125-175 sq. ft per employee per the landmark report by Gensler in 2012.

Questions:

1. How many employees does the KOLA believe will work in a 1.3 million square foot office? Based on the 257 square feet per employee number that is far

- higher than the national average that comes out to approximately 5000 employees.
- On Page 12 Table 5 Nokia Vacancies Estimated peak hour generated traffic volumes.
 - a. How could an office with the size of 1.3 million square feet only have 1,092 cars during the weekday morning hour?
 - b. While they show a large number of daily In and Out traffic it seems unlikely that only 1200-1300 people are going to come to work during peak times. Are the other 4000 plus employees going to be getting to work? Or is there an assumption that they are not working typical 8 am to 5pm type jobs?
 - c. When comparing Page 12 Table 5 to Peak hour graphs on page 49 and page 50 it does not appear that the study sites are even half of the square feet of the existing Nokia buildings where the study sites data seems to stop at 500k square feet. Are there more appropriate models or building types that would show similarly sized buildings?
- 1. Has Naperville independently verified the traffic study maps? The data diagrams data plots for Trip Ends and Square footage do not seem so match the values provided in the report.
- 2. It does not appear that occupancy levels of any other the other commercial buildings in the area were taken into account? Is there documentation to support if they were? Is there concern what might happen if the area's overall occupancy increases?
- 3. With the already approved projects of the new grocery store and Costco have those been taken into account in the north south traffic on Naperville Road.
- 4. How many parking spots exist in the parking structures and the parking lots on the Nokia property?
- 5. What are Naperville's long term plans to increase traffic capacity in the area and the area south on Naperville Road/Naper Boulevard from Warrenville Road to Ogden and even further south?

Density

I am highly disappointed at the overall size of the proposed lots - our Fairmeadow neighborhood having lot sizes on average of 26,500 square feet - While allowed the development is certainly on the lowest side of the minimum requirements with the largest "Estates" lots having 8,807 square foot average. There is even a larger disparity when compared to the Indian Hills neighborhood. This is not what was proposed by Nokia during the R2 PUD rezoning meetings, it was proposed that they would look to have similar housing and lots to the surrounding area.

I object to the setback variances requested for the new development. The developer claims that by allowing tighter spacing that it will "provide a more intimate neighborhood" and "side yards serve no practical purpose" and says that without it they will not be able to offer "larger communal and open spaces" and will not be able to put eves on the houses and they will be less attractive could all be solved by building a few less houses. Setbacks and density requirements are there for many reasons in addition to fire concerns, storm run off, and to allow for open space.

The developer is a publicly traded company that is obligated to try to provide return on their investors investments. It is clearly understood why they are asking for these setbacks and that is to pack as many units as possible onto the property.

Stormwater

The proposed site is part of a much larger six square mile area watershed that drains directly through and around the development site and the overall area has a long history of stormwater issues. Since the 1960s ATT/Lucent/Nokia, the DuPage Forest Preserve, the County, the City of Wheaton, the Wheaton Park District have all spent millions of dollars on projects to attempt to protect the area and the Nokia property from flooding and it seems when much of the work was done that there was a pretty clear vision that parts of it would not be built on.

Stormwater issues are very complicated at this site, there are many public entities involved and much was done over 40 years ago and the county has lost much of the original documentation and personnel that originally worked on the issue.

Any changes in the development area could cause flooding problems for Danada Woods, Fairmeadow, Indian Hills, and Lisle.

I stand firm in requesting that development of this area must only happen after a full study of the watershed is completed. Based on a large number of FOIA requests it does not seem that the entire area has been studied as a whole. Even one of the most comprehensive studies that was performed in the early 1980s did not include a large section of the land that is proposed for construction.

Questions:

- 1. Please provide a copy with engineering details of the storm water management plan.
- 2. Provide a copy of the "Wetland Delineation and Assessment Report dated August 17, 2020, prepared by V3 Companies" used to obtain US Army Corps of Engineers Approved Jurisdictional Determination Navigable Waters Protection Rule.
- 3. In the Preliminary Engineering plan sheet 3 Outlot C Stormwater management facility 007 appears to overflow to the wetland area and will intern flow down along the northern fairmeadow border. This is unacceptable, no additional water can be allowed to drain off the development property under any circumstances at that location as it is one of the main sources of flooding in the Fairmeadow neighborhood. It is also likely to lead to deterioration of wetland area.
- 4. When was stormwater engineering surveys done? Were these in understanding of the drought in the fall of this year? What was the scope of stormwater engineering services if performed Please provide a copy with engineering details.
- 5. We have expectations that the area will not be raised beyond its current level allowing additional runoff into the Forest Preserve and Fairmeadows Neighborhoods is this the case?
- 6. Please provide existing grading elevations and proposed grading elevations to understand how much fill is being built up in areas.
 - a. Will all of the grading be changed to be higher than the FEMA base elevation? 740.4 Feet?

- Appears lots 62 78 may have flooding issues? What is being done for those lots? Per FEMA MAP - 17043C0153J - Revised August 1, 2019 The northernmost section of the property is located in a FEMA Flood Zone AE
- 2. The current FEMA flood maps show that the entire area has a flood zone through and around it how is that being mitigated? And what is the impact to the areas outside of the Nokia Property?
- 3. Does the City of Naperville and the developer understand the prior flood mitigations that have been done on the property and in the area?
 - a. Are they aware of the Inter-Governmental agreements with Nokia that cover the section of the hesterman drain storm sewer they intend to move?
 - b. How do they intend to perform the move of the hesterman drain to ensure that flooding will not happen during the construction project?
 - c. Have they reviewed with and received sign off from the other Hesterman drain agreement signatories?
- 1. Have all of the past flood studies and mitigations that have happened in the area since 1960 been taken into account for the development work?
- 2. Are you familiar with the drainage tile systems that were in place at the time of the fair meadows development that were disrupted during the original AT&T/Bell Labs development/Nokia?
- 3. Have the forest preserve, Milton township, and the county been consulted on the drainage?
- 4. Is the developer and Naperville aware during the Danada woods development that off site wetland offsets were utilized and will likely affect the drainage plan?
- 5. It is requested that Naperville get full signoff from the DuPage County Stormwater Management to ensure that all stormwater flooding issues are understood by all affected agencies before approval of the development.

Environmental Concerns

The developer has a history of environmental issues leading to various local, state, and federal violations and fines. The issues are spread across multiple states and range from EPA Clean Water Act violations to stormwater, to disturbing protected animal sites.

The forest preserve is the home of a number of important and protected ecological wonders including the heron rookery within feet of the development site.

Questions:

- 1. What is being done to ensure that during the development that no harm will come to the well of groundwater that will affect the drinking well water within the Fairmeadow subdivision?
- 2. What precautions will be in place to ensure that during and after construction there will be no impact to the surrounding forest preserve?

- 3. Overall Environmental impact to the wetland complex on the west side of Naperville Road supports egrets, woodcocks, painted turtles, chorus and leopard frogs, and a rookery of nesting great blue herons. With more than 12 active nests. Has an environmental impact study been performed?
- 4. Please provide copies of the environmental impact studies and Illinois DNR Approvals for the site.

We're long-time residents of Fairmeadow Subdivision off Naperville and Fairmeadow Rd. in Naperville. Our neighborhood will back up to the proposed Naper Commons.

We wish to voice our opinion and concerns regarding this development:

- We'd like to start off telling you a little bit about our neighborhood. It's close knit in the sense
 everyone knows each other, frequently gets together, has thee best neighborhood picnics, are
 here for each other and help each other out in times of needs. We're not like other
 neighborhoods were people tend to keep to themselves. We truly enjoy each other, that's why
 many people don't move out unless they've passed away or moved to another state.
- In the development meeting held on December 2nd, there was mention of how small and crammed the lot sizes would be in general but also compared to our larger lots that are over a half acre. Developers response was that people aren't looking for larger lot sizes and there are balconies on most houses so people could communicate and get to know one another (possibly because they won't have much of a backyard?). We tend to disagree. People are looking for bigger lot sizes than you are offering. Perhaps not as big as a half acre, but people like some green grass to relax, privacy and have family/company over to show off their house, hold events and be with others. In regards to having balconies to "force" people to see their neighbors and it was put, we don't have that issue in our large-lot neighborhood. You have the option to hang out with neighbors or enjoy your privacy. Most of our neighbors choose to be around each other. We have bon fires in the summer (because we can without the smoke bothering others due to lot size), outdoor movie night, walks, volleyball games, etc.
- A huge concern would be opening up 39th St. (which is currently a deadend) to your proposed neighborhood. This would be disastrous. We have old, narrow streets that can't accommodate that kind of traffic. Trust us, it has a hard time with the weight of the garbage/recycle trucks. We've been trying to get them fixed for over a couple decades, maybe more. We have a small, tight, dead-end neighborhood and the added traffic would make our no sidewalks, no street lights neighborhood unsafe for all the children that are constantly out playing, and making

- it difficult for the rest of us to get in and out of our own driveways. We're talking hundreds/thousands of cars. Our guess would be, if anyone from the proposed neighborhood wanted to go shopping or travel in the direction of Butterfield Rd, they'd drive through our neighborhood.
- Another huge concern is knocking down the berm. Having it up keeps a healthy barrier between both neighborhoods, greatly reduces noise and pollution and has been a staple in our neighborhood since the 60's. The reason people live in Fairmeadow is for the larger lots and privacy. We love our neighbors but don't want to watch them eat meals, if you know what I'm saying. We don't want to be looking into other peoples homes and definitely, don't want them looking into ours.
- Our neighborhood battles floods every time it rains. We're worried it'll even get worse with all the new homes and berm taken down.
- I also can't see if there would still be access to Herrick Forest Preserve where the homes will be built. This is peoples escape from reality, where they can see and listen to nature at its finest. You can't beat the views and beauty. It's also where the amazing, impressive Great Blue Heron's Rookery is, near the current soccer fields where homes will now be.

Dear Plan Commission Members:

We are writing with respect to the proposed Naper Commons development that will be the subject of a public hearing on December 16, 2020. Danada Woods is a 59-unit townhome subdivision adjacent to the property at issue. Pulte, the developer of the project, held an informational meeting with Danada Woods residents on December 1st. We appreciate that Pulte took the time to present the plan to the residents. Because our subdivision will be directly impacted by the use of the property, it is important to provide the Plan Commission with our concerns.

1. <u>Townhomes adjacent to Danada Woods</u>. The proposed development currently provides for 30 townhomes, located on Lots 185-193, on a narrow strip of Lot 4 that adjoins Naperville Road. The odd configuration of Lot 4 is undoubtedly challenging for the developer—the southeastern strip presumably was included in Lot 4 as a way for the development to gain access to Naperville Road. Please recall that one of the objectives of a planned unit development is to "encourage a higher level of design and amenity than is possible to achieve under otherwise applicable zoning regulations." (Section 6-4-2, Naperville Zoning Ordinance). In addition, one of the design standards is "Preservation of established landscaping, natural or cultural features." (Section 6-4-3 11.1.2).

Sandwiching 30 townhomes in to a narrow area flanked by major roads/streets on two sides and located a significant distance from the bulk of the new development and its amenities, is a poor design choice and is highly objectionable to Danada Woods. The existing green space and thick vegetation has provided an excellent buffer between the Nokia office campus and the Danada Woods townhomes. Constructing townhomes in that narrow strip will almost completely destroy that buffer and would be detrimental to Danada Woods property owners. Certainly, when homeowners in Danada Woods purchased their homes, there was no reason to suspect that the buffer zone would ever be developed.

We respectfully request that those 30 townhomes – or, at a minimum, the 16 townhomes located on Lots 189-193 - be eliminated from the plan. If that is not possible, we request that the number of units be substantially reduced and re-configured to increase the back yard setback.

2. <u>Fencing/Screening</u>. The current plans do not provide for any fencing between Lot 4 and Danada Woods. At the informational meeting that Pulte hosted, it appeared that they would be open to the concept of providing fencing if Danada Woods residents requested it. Based on the feedback we have been receiving from residents, it appears that most favor fencing. Therefore, we respectfully request solid fencing (similar to the fencing that already exists in certain areas of Danada Woods) along areas on the perimeter where Danada Woods townhomes are located. If fencing is installed, this would not alleviate the need for plantings—since much of the living space in Danada Woods is located on the

2nd floor, we also ask that trees/shrubs of a projected height that will maximize screening for 2nd floor levels be installed.

3. <u>Masonry</u>. The elevations for the townhomes do not appear to provide for any masonry to be used on the townhomes, although the Petition (page 4 in the Summary of Development section) states that the townhomes will be a combination of siding and masonry materials. Although the use of masonry is under the purview of the Building Review Board, we would also like to convey our concern about this matter to the Plan Commission.

If, in fact, Pulte is requesting a variance from the requirement of using masonry, we strongly oppose this request. The desire of a developer to maximize profit should not come at the expense of adjacent property owners. A lack of masonry would result in a cheaper looking product, thus reducing property values. In addition it would be incompatible with Danada Woods, where all of the townhomes contain brick on the facades. Danada Woods is still recovering from the ravages of the housing recession and that recovery will certainly be hindered by adjacent townhomes that lack upscale architectural features such as masonry.

We respectfully request that Pulte be required to comply with the masonry requirement in Naperville's building regulations.

4. <u>Setbacks</u>. Pulte is requesting a variance to reduce front and side yard setbacks. We strongly oppose this request. Again, the desire of a developer to increase density and maximize profit should not come at the expense of adjacent property owners. A higher density development would result in more traffic and a cheaper looking product, thus reducing property values. In addition, it would be incompatible with other subdivisions throughout Naperville.

We respectfully request that Pulte be required to comply with current setback requirements in Naperville's building regulations.

5. <u>Streets/Traffic</u>. One of the byproducts of new development is, of course, traffic. It appears that the plans provide for Lucent Lane to be publicly dedicated, which we are glad to see. The Development Petition mentions, in various places that the street will be improved "generally consistent with City design standards" (e.g., page 16). We would urge the City to ensure that those design standards are met. Because the portion of Lucent Lane that provides access to Naperville Road is directly adjacent to the south and west sides of Danada Woods and the backyards of many of our homeowners, it will be important that the developer install intensive screening. The current traffic on Lucent Lane is already noisy and intrusive at times, and additional traffic will only worsen the situation.

In addition, at the west end of Danada Woods, there is an emergency access easement across Lot 4 connecting to Danada Woods, where there is a cul-de-sac street and a landscaped island. During the informational meeting with Danada Woods residents, Pulte indicated that there was no intent to make any sort of through-street connection there. Such a connection, if sought in the future, would irretrievably change the character of the Danada Woods neighborhood in an extremely negative manner, given the increased traffic and noise, combined with the relatively modest front yard setbacks of Danada Woods townhomes. Therefore, to help ensure that such a connection never occurs, we

respectfully request that the approved plans be modified to indicate that such a through-street connection is prohibited.

6. **Stormwater**. With any new development, especially a major one like Naper Commons, there is the potential to create stormwater problems for the surrounding area. Although Danada Woods does not currently have any stormwater issues, it is our understanding that the Fairmeadow subdivision, located immediately north of Danada Woods, does. Further development of the area could exacerbate these problems. We urge the City to examine this issue very carefully and ensure that the developer take all necessary actions to prevent any adverse stormwater/drainage issues to the surrounding area.

As a long time resident of Fairmeadow (about 34 years) subdivision I wish to go on record that I am against the proposed Naper Commons development on the Nokia property.

My two main areas of concern are the proposed thoroughfare of 39th street to Lucent Lane and tearing down the berm located directly behind the most westerly portion of the subdivision.

With the addition of some 241 residences our unlit and narrow streets will not be able to handle the traffic when people decide to use Fairmeadow/ 39th Street as a shortcut to their new homes.

I believe the city should review the request and restudy the project and use the land for parks and recreation.



I have the following concerns:

- 1. This project is too high density and its excessive scale is out of proportion to the area which endangers our community and the environment.
- 2. The connection of the development to 39th Street will negatively impact the Fairmeadow neighborhood in which I live by encouraging high amounts of traffic to and from this massive development to and from Naperville Road, as there is no other route to the cities north of it.
- 3. We must keep the existing protective barrier (berm) between neighborhoods
- 4. Stormwater problems
- 5. The increased traffic to the entire area
- 6. The negative impact on the adjacent forest preserves

The Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserves have been carefully curated and protected by the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County over the past century. Regarding the aforementioned proposed PUD by Pulte Homes on the Nokia site I would like to offer up the following comments for consideration:

- 1) Housing and Project Design: The current proposed design of the Townhomes and Single-Family homes although perhaps "innovative and creative" as put forth by the developer does not in any way incorporate design elements pursuant to current LEED standards as set forth by the USGBC. At a minimum, the design standards should incorporate a LEED Gold certification standard. The City of Naperville has always presented itself as a forward-thinking municipality and therefore requesting that developers incorporate energy efficient and eco-friendly design standards into their projects should be a minimum level requirement. Issues like water runoff, light pollution, low carbon and zero carbon design, public transportation, permeable roads and driveways are all issues that can easily be incorporated into this proposed project and which are not addressed in any fashion in the submitted documentation. Whether you believe in climate change or not, we are all stewards of the planet in which we all live and we should all strive to protect the valuable resources that have been entrusted to us to protect for ourselves and for future generations to come.
- 2) Density and requested variances: The PUD as submitted proposes 241 units on lots 1/3 the size of existing surrounding developments. As such a number of variances to the current Naperville Municipal code are being requested in order to accommodate the large number of units. Accordingly, and instead of smaller lots, the developer should modify the lot size to accommodate the current code which was initially written to avoid the exact variances and accompanying small lot sizes that mimic big city housing densities.
- 3) Environmental Impact: The proposed PUD dose not address the environmental impact on the surrounding forest preserve and wetlands. Given the proposed size and density of the project the impact on the forest preserve and wetlands to which it abuts needs to be addressed. As such the normal course of action would be to request and environmental impact study to determine the potential detrimental impact to wildlife and flora. The impact of water runoff from fertilizers and weed killer as well as the light and noise pollution among other issues will most certainly impact forest preserve and its inhabitants. As such, an environmental impact study would be at a minimum a responsible are required course of action.

We are writing this to protest the massive residential development identified above. Our objections are listed below.

- 1. While the R2 designation is called "low density", this development is NOT low density. In keeping with the "low density" concept, please consider the neighborhoods in the general area. In particular, review the lot sizes of our treasured Fairmeadow Neighborhood, the neighborhood on the west side of Leask Lane to the east, and the neighborhood on the west side of Herrick Lane to our west. These are low density. Naper Commons is not!
- 2. All of the residents of our Neighborhood agree that we do not want a connection between the massive Naper Commons property and the Fairmeadow Neighborhood's 39th Street. This would become a safety nightmare! The suspect traffic study that Pulte has produced demonstrates that at rush hour times there will be a huge backup at the Lucent Lane East/Naperville Road interchange. Residents of the proposed development will seek out ways to avoid the backup, including using 39th Street. This potential access has a very sharp 30 degree turn from 39th St. to Delles Road, before the 90 degree turn onto Fairmeadow Lane. Our unincorporated Neighborhood has no street lights or sidewalks. Allowing this potentially huge increase of traffic on all the streets in our Neighborhood is a great safety concern, and a recipe for disaster.
- 3. Our neighbors on the west side of Delles Road value the berm that Lucent Technolgies Inc. built long ago, to allow for privacy, security and noise reduction. It is unacceptable to now plan to completely remove this highly valued structure. It CANNOT be replaced by a token split rail fence and a housing structure just feet away from these neighbors. The elimination of this berm violates the safety, privacy and appeal for our neighbors. Additionally there is the concern of how this removal would affect stormwater flow.
- 4. All Fairmeadow Neighbors almost exclusively use well water and septic tanks and drain fields. Through the years almost all of our neighborhood has been impacted by regular flooding. As neighbors we have always helped each other deal with this flooding. We fully expect that Naper Commons will only increase flooding of our neighborhood. Stormwater management for the entire area bounded by Naperville Road, Nokia property, Butterfield Road and Herrick Lane has, at best, been piecemeal. We fully expect that Pulte's stormwater research will only add to this piecemeal analysis.

Dear Commission Members,

I would like to register my objections to the Naper Commons Development as currently proposed.

The extension of 39th Street into the development would prove to be a disaster for our residents, the Highway Department of Milton Township, and the larger community. Our streets, with no sidewalks, no street lights, and their narrow width, were never intended to be thoroughfares. In addition to being utilized by the residents of the new development, with the ubiquity of GPS, the route down Fairmeadow, Delles, and 39th would quickly become a shortcut between Naperville and Warrenville Roads. The intersection at Warrenville and Naperville was already a major bottleneck in pre-COVID days. If we project the addition of more vehicles from the now-vacant but eventually occupied office space in the area, we can predict that traffic will only become worse. For anyone planning to travel westbound on Warrenville from southbound Naperville, or the reverse, this new connector would make a tempting shortcut. The added traffic would make our streets unsafe, noisy, and subject to un-engineered-for wear. The extension of 39th Street must not be allowed.

The removal of the berm west of Delles, between our Fairmeadow subdivision and the new development would likely create major problems for our residents. In addition to serving as a green-space and noise barrier, the berm has the more important function of channeling rainwater around our development to well established drainage routes, rather than flooding our streets and yards. We get our drinking water from wells and our sewage is treated through septic fields; flooded land is good for neither. I'm sure my neighbors can provide photos of yards that flood when the natural flood-plains in the Forest Preserve are filled beyond capacity more and more frequently each year.

Finally, the density of the proposed development is out of character with the surrounding areas. In their "Response to Standards" submitted to the Planning and Zoning Commission

(https://owncloud.naperville.il.us/index.php/s/PLR8bJLxbele2fv#pdfviewer) on pages 12-14, the developer requests permission to deviate from code to add eaves to the buildings so as "to maintain a higher level of architecturally pleasing characters." If your houses are so close together that you need to deviate from code to add such a common and important architectural feature, you're building them too close and building too many for the area.

My neighborhood borders the proposed development. Based on the information I have been able to view I must go on record as opposed to this development for the following reasons.

First and foremost, the layout presented does not appear to be low density as the plan for very small lots with very little space between them. The fact that they are asking for reduced setbacks shows it doesn't meet current standards which are set for a reason.

Second, storm water management is always a concern especially since much of the 60+ acres is currently green space. My concern is that even though the developer is stating they have and will address this once it's built and issues arise who will take ownership?

Next, the existing separation on our West border is a beautifully landscaped berm which the developer intends to fully remove and instead offer a split rail fence to separate the new homes from the existing neighborhood. This I find unacceptable as the existing berm should remain providing privacy for both neighborhoods, beauty, and all important green space. This green space is especially important as much of the proposed development borders one of our lovely forest preserves.

Finally, and arguably most important is the fact that the developers have made known their intention to connect our tiny neighborhood lane (39th Street) to the new development. 

Pulte Homes is proposing to build nearly 200 houses and townhouses on the border of Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserves, which belong to the people of DuPage County. The proposed parcel is Lot 4 of the Nokia property (the big red X on the map) near Naperville and Warrenville Roads, currently 67 acres of open green space surrounded on three sides by the nature preserves.

The proposed mega-development would forever install hundreds of buildings, residents and vehicles within mere feet of crucial preserve habitat. The negative impact would be staggering and irreversible.


The Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserves have been carefully curated and protected by the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County over the past century. It has not been easy, but it has been worth it. These stunning and unique preserves are home to more than 254 wildlife species and 470 different types of plants. Humans seek fresh air, exercise and refuge here every single day.

This whole area is wetlands, with a cyclical Great Blue Heron rookery only a few hundred meters from the property border. Furthermore, the DuPage Forest Preserve's wetlands project is just north of the proposed housing development.

Now imagine a thousand toilets flushing, thousands of lights and hundreds of cars traveling on the edges of these protected lands. Every single day. Think about the noise and light pollution, the trash generated, the stormwater runoff.

Pulte's proposed high-density plan also will add significant traffic congestion to the already very busy corridors of Naperville Road, Ogden Ave., I-88 and its access ramps, Freedom Drive, Warrenville Road and Butterfield Road—corridors also on the verge of adding a Costco and big-box grocery store in the coming months. The quality of life in the greater surrounding area (including Wheaton, Warrenville, Naperville and Lisle) will be permanently diminished.

We urge the City of Naperville to reject Pulte's requested proposal for development. The Naperville City Council and the Planning Commission have been given the responsibility to be good stewards of the community, and this project fails to live up the standards that have been put in place to protect both the environment and our overall quality of life in DuPage County.

Dear Naperville Planning and Zoning Commission- The Conservation Foundation would like to make some comments and recommendations for your consideration to the Naper Commons proposal by Pulte. First, I'd like to thank you for your community service. As a former planning and zoning commissioner myself, I can appreciate the amount of time you spend on these proposals, and the sometimes difficult recommendations you have to make.

In general, we feel the Naper Commons proposal is way too dense, especially considering the surrounding area, forest preserve, and traffic. Here are some specific recommendations:

- Increase the amount of open space within the development (see specific examples below). The proposal is touted as an "open space centric" development. Although we applaud the use of native landscaping and storm-water best management practices, there is not a lot of "usable" open space in the proposal. Without considering internal ROW, the open space percentage is about 24 percent, most of that in storm-water areas.
- Lots 62-79 are very small and should be eliminated. That would create more of an open space buffer to the FPD property and the adjacent heron rookery. These nesting areas are very sensitive to disturbance. That would also create a nice view-shed to the forest preserve open space from Road G and the lots on the other side of the road.
- Lots 148-152 should have at least a 10-15 foot vegetated buffer to the FPD boundary, just like what's behind lots 137-147.
- As an "open space centric" development, we think the entryway into the development should reflect that. Wouldn't it be beautiful if Open Space Area 6 was extended all the way to Naperville Road, planted with trees, welcoming residents and guests to this open space centric development?
- Decreasing the overall density would help with traffic in and out of the proposed development, and on Naperville Road.
- We like the trail connection to the forest preserve's regional trail.



Dear Members of the Naperville Planning Commision,

My name is Kim Wagner and I am an eight-year resident of Wheaton. We live in the Farnham neighborhood just north of Seven Gables Park. I am emailing you today to let you know my extreme disappointment and dismay of the potential sale of the Nokia property (Lot 4) to Pulte Homes. The development of 200+ crowded homes near our beloved Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserve would dramatically destroy the carefully-preserved wetlands, plantlife, and animal habitat that border the Nokia property.

A huge reason that we chose our Wheaton home was to have access to preserved wildlife habitats. We were excited that we could take our two young boys to Herrick Lake to walk, bike, fish, and birdwatch. We would see amazing types of birds and different animals in our backyards that reside in the Danada Forest Preserve. In our eight years of time in Wheaton, we have seen and experienced some great things: coyotes wandering our backyards, a great-horned owl who would regularly visit our oak tree, and the experience of riding our bikes around the trails of Herrick Lake and the surrounding preserved areas. We've been able to experience this wildlife due to the careful balance and preservation of Herrick Lake and the Danada Forest Preserves.

What we **DON'T** need:

- More light pollution that drowns out our beautiful night skyscape and adversely affects nocturnal wildlife.
- More water waste to affect the surrounding wetlands of the property
- More crowded \$600,000 homes generating more trash and stormwater runoff.

What we **DO** need:

- Preserved public spaces where children and adults can spend time outside.
- Protection of plant and animal habitats, such as the Great Blue Heron Rookery that is currently located a few hundred meters from the Nokia property border.
- A better and environmentally-sustainable plan for the Nokia property.

It remains important to iterate that these lands should be saved for wildlife to flourish and people to enjoy. We have realized just how valuable these preserved green spaces and wetlands are, especially during the trying times of Covid-19. People are using them. Once this land is "developed" for human living, it's gone. Please help us maintain the carefully-balanced life that currently resides there. Together, I hope that we can find a better solution to Nokia property than selling it to a real-estate developer.

Dear Plan Commission Members:

I have received information from Pulte, the Naper Common developer with regard to its plans for the development of the Nokia property adjacent to the Danada Woods subdivision where I live. After considering the information provided by Pulte and reading the response to the proposed development submitted by the Danada Woods Homeowners Association dated December 8, 2020, I felt it very important to offer my individual comments on the proposed Naper Commons development.

I reside at Commons development will be built directly behind the building where I live. At present, there is a barrier of trees and bushes which provides a natural buffer between the Nokia property where the townhomes are to be built and Danada Woods. As I understand it, Pulte proposes to build as many as 30 townhomes on the slender strip of land on the other side of the natural buffer that now exists. However, because of the number of proposed townhomes, and the placement of the townhomes, the natural barrier that now exists will be substantially, if not entirely, lost and will result in the encroaching view of townhomes that do not appear to be built with construction materials, spacing, and amenities comparable to our townhomes, and will have a substantial effect in reducing the value of my townhome and other townhomes similarly situated.

The principal location of the homes to be built that will have the greatest value to Pulte will apparently be built on that portion of the Nokia property that will not have the impact on the Danada Woods Subdivision that the above-proposed townhomes will have. For this reason, I wish to strongly support the concerns expressed by the Danada Woods Townhome Association letter dated December 8, and in particular the concerns expressed in Item No. 1 of that letter. Squeezing in 30 townhomes on a small parcel of land which would undoubtedly result in construction that would be different in tone, appearance, character, and value from the rest of the development solely to "utilize" that particular parcel at the expense of the values and established amenities of the Danada Woods Townhomes, seems to me to argue strongly for the elimination of that part of the Pulte development plan. The economic value of the proposed townhomes to Pulte would seem to be relatively nominal given the overall proposed size of the development, especially when contrasted with the corresponding damage they would do to the established environment enjoyed by the Danada Woods Subdivision as well as the value of the affected Danada Wood townhomes.

I am writing with respect to the proposed Naper Commons development. I reside in Danada Woods, which is immediately adjacent to a portion of Lot 4. While I am not opposed to the idea of a residential development on this site, I do have a number of concerns about the proposed plan.

1. Number and placement of townhomes. As proposed, approximately 30 townhomes will be located on a very narrow strip of Lot 4, many of which will be very close to several Danada Woods townhomes. In looking at the overall site plan, the narrow strip of Lot 4 ensures access of the development to Naperville Road—a logical reason for the odd configuration of Lot 4. However, to shoehorn 30 townhomes in to that narrow strip will be to the detriment of Danada Woods homeowners, not to mention resulting in a portion of Naper Commons being disconnected and distant from the rest of the development. It is a poor design.

When Danada Woods was built, that narrow strip of green space and vegetation provided a vital buffer between the Nokia buildings and Danada Woods. It continues to serve that purpose, and is undoubtedly relied upon by purchasers of Danada Woods units. Replacing this with 30 townhomes will diminish housing values in Danada Woods, which are still recovering from the housing recession, and impair the ability of Danada Woods residents to enjoy the attractive wooded environment that they sought when moving to Danada Woods.

I urge the Planning and Zoning Commission to recommend the removal of these 30 townhomes from the plan.

2. Masonry on townhomes. Pulte is requesting a variance from the Building Review Board to eliminate the masonry requirements for the townhomes. To the extent the Planning and Zoning Commission has the ability to comment/recommend on this issue, I urge them to advise against it. Eliminating masonry from the townhomes will further cheapen both the look and the price of the units and would be incompatible with the surrounding area, specifically, Danada Woods, which has brick on every building.

Pulte has stated that modern design standards do not call for masonry. However, at the informational meeting held with Danada Woods residents, Pulte pointed to Bloomingdale Walk as an example of their current developments for townhomes. I have visited that development

and note that many, if not all, of the units were built with a substantial amount of brick on the exterior. There is no good reason to lower Naperville's standards for design, and to do so will be detrimental to the surrounding area, as well as the development itself.

3. **Fencing**. If townhomes are permitted to be constructed on the narrow strip of Lot 4, solid wood fencing should be required along the border with Danada Woods, along with substantial landscaping. This will help to reduce the adverse effects of development in that area.

Please pass these comments along to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Dear Mayor Chirico and the members of Naperville City Council:

Speaking on behalf of my neighbors, I am writing to express our strong opposition to Case #PZC 20-1-086, the proposed rezoning of Lot 4 of the Lucent Lane Nokia Campus in Naperville to accommodate Pulte Home Company's Naper Commons project. The addition of this high-density single and multi-family housing development will compound traffic problems, destroy local wildlife habitat, trigger stormwater issues, negatively impact the forest preserve and potentially lower the property values of the existing community.

Clearly stated in the petition submitted by the developer, Pulte Home Company is seeking a major change to the planned unit development along with a conditional use permit that allows for deviations to the prescribed requirements for the dwellings in the R2 zoning district. I believe that zoning ordinances are enacted to protect public health, safety, comfort, convenience and general welfare of the people. These ordinances, created to accomplish the following objectives, will be violated if the project is approved:

- To lessen congestion on the public streets: Traffic will increase significantly with the opening of the new Costco, \$19 million shopping center and apartments on Ogden. The situation will further be exacerbated with the addition of 241 homes, an act that will cripple our roads and negatively impact safety for drivers and pedestrians.
- To avoid undue concentration of population and prevent the overcrowding of land, thereby insuring proper living and working conditions: The number of proposed units would exceed current acceptable limits. By cramming in as many buildings as possible in the smallest amount of land available, Pulte would create a highly dense state of over-population.
- To zone all properties with a view to conserving the value of buildings and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the City: The plans for the project do not respect the boundaries of the existing buildings, Herrick Lake Forest Preserve or the Danada Forest Preserve. The PUD plat shows townhouses (a total of 30 individual units) in a narrow strip of land that parallels Lucent Lane at Naperville Road that is adjacent to the Danada Woods Townhomes. These new structures will be far removed from the main body of Naper Commons and will lie within a few feet of the townhomes in the Danada complex without a buffer. The parcel cannot accommodate the size and number of the proposed buildings and approval of the plans will result in a misuse of the land that will only add congestion to the already over-taxed Naperville Road corridor. Plans to further saturate the land include nearly 40 single family homes that will abut the borders of the forest preserve, again without buffers. It should be noted that the Great Blue Heron rookery is only a few hundred yards from the property border and will suffer because of this project.

■ To avoid the inappropriate development of lands and provide for adequate drainage, curbing or erosion, and reduction of flood damage: The proposed site is part of a much larger area that has been plagued with stormwater issues for more than 40 years. DuPage County, DuPage Forest Preserve, the City of Wheaton, and the Wheaton Park District have invested millions of dollars to protect the Nokia property from flooding, citing open space as a part of the wetland solution. If this land is developed as planned, serious flooding problems for the surrounding area will result. (It is interesting to note that the developer has a history of environmental violations leading to various local, state, and federal penalties and fines. The violations include EPA Clean Water Acts, stormwater management and the disruption of protected animal sites.)

It is for these reasons (and more that were not stated here) that we urge you to disapprove the proposed rezoning.

Attached please a pdf. file with two site plans. The first site plan is Pulte's proposed layout of 30 townhomes at the east-most parcel of land at the corner of Naperville Road and Lucent Lane. Their layout proposes to construct the new townhomes right up to the 25 ft. setback at the property line between Pulte and the existing Danada Woods subdivision. This layout eliminates the majority of existing trees and shrubs that block views of the Nokia buildings and parking garage.

While the large parcels of land directly to the north of the Nokia building have always be looked at as possible future development, I suspect few local residents, and in particular those residing in Danada Woods, ever expected to see the narrow landscaped buffer between them and the Nokia buildings disappear. This is, in my opinion, a major concern both in respect to diminished privacy and property values.

Elimination of any development and retaining all existing landscaping in the narrow piece of land is clearly the most preferable option. If some development is deemed acceptable by the PZC, then elimination of the group of 16 buildings furthest east and reorienting the remaining 14 buildings to the west closer to Lucent Lane would seem a reasonable alternative.

The second site plan is an alternate building layout that maintains the proposed quantity of 30 townhomes if that is what the PZC approves. It only increases the number of entrances onto Lucent Lane by one, from three to four. And most importantly, it retains many of the existing trees and shrubs.


I respectfully ask that the Planning and Zoning Commission and their staff review the alternate site plan and provide comments at the December 16 PZC meeting. Please

also advise if submitting this email and attachment is satisfactory for inclusion at the PZC meeting or do I need to resubmit it through the PZC website.



According to a study cited by the US Forest Service they found that developments placed on the edge of forests had a universally negative impact on native wildlife, forest health, water quality, carbon storage, and recreational benefits. In the study cited (Forrest on the Edge) they found that there was a drastic decline in the presence of native wildlife, even to the point of the elimination of some species altogether. The Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserves are home to over 254 wildlife species, and it would be a shame to see some of those be negatively impacted or wiped out altogether. However, perhaps the most troubling result from the survey was the impact housing developments had on the quality of water. Considering the work that has been done to preserve and even restore the natural wetlands of this area, it would be very counterproductive to allow those wetlands to be polluted by the presence of these new developments.

In another study done in 2013 titled, "The Characteristics, Causes, and Consequences of Sprawling Development Patterns in the United States." Researchers specifically looked at the negative impacts suburban sprawl (spread of housing) was having on fragile ecological systems such as wetlands. They found that the increase in driving (even over short distances), increases in waste, pollution and foot traffic had dramatically negative impacts on wetland ecosystems. If we want to actually make a concerted effort to restore and preserve the natural wetlands of this area, we must resist the urge to allow land value and money to drive all of the decisions we make for this area. We have a responsibility to protect our green spaces and forest preserves. This proposed development will undoubtedly have a negative impact on this specific preserve and protecting that is more important than the money that can be made of a development like this.

Dear Plan Commission Members:

I have received information from Pulte, the Naper Common developer with regard to its plans for the development of the Nokia property adjacent to the Danada Woods subdivision where I live. After considering the information provided by Pulte and reading the response to the proposed development submitted by the Danada Woods Homeowners Association dated December 8, 2020, I felt it very important to offer my individual comments on the proposed Naper Commons development.

I reside at 1330 Danada Court. The townhomes that are proposed to be constructed as part of the Naper Commons development will be built directly behind the building where I live. At present, there is a barrier of trees and bushes which provides a natural buffer between the Nokia property where the townhomes are to be built and Danada Woods. As I understand it, Pulte proposes to build as many as 30 townhomes on the slender strip of land on the other side of the natural buffer that now exists. However, because of the number of proposed townhomes, and the placement of the townhomes, the natural barrier that now exists will be substantially, if not entirely, lost and will result in the encroaching view of townhomes that do not appear to be built with construction materials, spacing, and amenities comparable to our townhomes, and will have a substantial effect in reducing the value of my townhome and other townhomes similarly situated.

The principal location of the homes to be built that will have the greatest value to Pulte will apparently be built on that portion of the Nokia property that will not have the impact on the Danada Woods Subdivision that the above-proposed townhomes will have. For this reason, I wish to strongly support the concerns expressed by the Danada Woods Townhome Association letter dated December 8, and in particular the concerns expressed in Item No. 1 of that letter. Squeezing in 30 townhomes on a small parcel of land which would undoubtedly result in construction that would be different in tone, appearance, character, and value from the rest of the development solely to "utilize" that particular parcel at the expense of the values and established amenities of the Danada Woods Townhomes, seems to me to argue strongly for the elimination of that part of the Pulte development plan. The economic value of the proposed townhomes to Pulte would seem to be relatively nominal given the overall proposed size of the development, especially when contrasted with the corresponding damage they would do to the established environment enjoyed by the Danada Woods Subdivision as well as the value of the affected Danada Wood townhomes.

I would appreciate this communication being read into the record at the February 3, 2021 meeting, and also ask that the commission provide response on the requested action items.

As an 18+-year resident of Danada Woods, I am very concerned about the impact to the residential communities adjacent to the proposed Naper Commons development. I was present on-line for the entire December 16, 2020 meeting call, have reviewed all of the provided developer documents, had discussions with multiple neighbors, and offer the following comments / requests:

Density: The developer team repeated referenced a "city feel" to the proposed development. The vast majority, if not all of the adjacent residents, have repeatedly voiced objections to the proposed housing density, as we chose our homes based partially on the nature-oriented, peaceful, "outskirts" feel of our area. The proposed plan is a highly-unwelcome one as it contradicts our desired lifestyle rather than complementing it. The significant likely increase in noise, congestion and negative environmental impact will permanently diminish our enjoyment of our homes. While we understand the desire to develop the property, its use should be in concert with the established local environment, which is largely driven by the Forest Preserve and surrounding nature. This very dense, city-like development plan is not a complementary fit to our established community, and we call on the Planning and Zoning Commission to protect us from it. We ask the Planning and Zoning Commission to existing development standards.

Fencing: Any development of this property should respect the adjacent neighborhoods by providing closed fencing for the entire length of the property lines adjoining the Nokia property. Fencing is critical to supporting our ability to maintain some semblance of our existing look-and-feel.

<u>Drainage</u>: Danada Woods' pond significantly contributes to our neighborhood's look-and-feel. Explanations provided during the December 16 call were insufficient in assuring us that our pond would not be at risk for diminishing water levels. We ask that Naperville Staff (PZC and/or City of Naperville, as appropriate) review the plan in detail and provide objective confirmation that there will be no negative effects on our pond's water levels.

Traffic: Similar to the stated drainage concerns, the traffic analysis information provided on the December 16 call was insufficient in assuring us that our access to and egress from Naperville Road will not be significantly impacted. It is already difficult and fraught with delays, having been negatively impacted by the turn lane established in recent years with the opening of an adjacent office building. We ask that Naperville Staff (PZC and/or City of Naperville, as appropriate) review the plan in detail and provide objective confirmation that there will be no significant impact on our ability to access our homes and Naperville Road (in both directions) safely and in a reasonable amount of time.

We appreciate the Planning and Zoning Commission's efforts in providing an open forum for discussion and seeking to provide community growth while protecting our existing neighborhoods and homeowners.

In an effort to provide the City of Naperville the most complete information, the following in the form of a letter is being sent to residents of the Fairmeadow Subdivision regarding Nokia becoming aware, though the public process surrounding Pulte's development application on Dec. 16th, of unauthorized use and encroachment on the property by residents to the east. Nokia's position contained in both the letter and in discussions with their operations, legal and property teams is as follows, as to the unauthorized use of the property that was disclosed during the December 16th hearing by the residents:

- 1. The Berm was an accommodation installed to minimize impact from surface parking lot. The installation of the berm did not give any property rights to residential owners. It is Nokia property and has been maintained as such.
- 2. It has recently come to Nokia's attention that neighbor's use has "creeped" onto Nokia property. Nokia is in the process of notifying neighbors that all encroachments must be removed. Nokia would like to state for the record that public use of the property is forbidden as it creates an insurance problem and legal liability Nokia is not willing to assume.
- 3. While we acknowledges that there is a lack of park space currently available to service the adjacent existing residential developments, that is a product of those developments and is not Nokia's problem to solve. However, with the proposed development of the Nokia property to residential use, the neighbors will be benefitted by new trail connections and dedicated public park spaces that will help address the needs that were not met by original development of their subdivisions.

The text of the letter sent to residents is as follows:

Dear Resident:

Nokia of America Corporation ("Nokia"), formerly known as Alcatel-Lucent USA and Lucent Technologies Inc., is your neighbor and the owner of the property located at 1935, 1940, 1960, 1980, and 2000 Lucent Lane, Naperville, Illinois 60563 (we refer to it as the "Nokia Campus").

It has been noted that during a public hearing conducted by the City of Naperville's Planning and Zoning Commission on December 16, 2020, multiple residents testified, under oath, as to their use of portions of the Nokia Campus for recreational or other purposes. Specifically, residents testified as to the use of the area around a berm located in the northwest portion of the Nokia Campus and proximate to the Fairmeadow Subdivision. This letter is to notify you that such use has never been and is not authorized by Nokia.

This berm, that you have been using without the authorization of Nokia, was installed by Nokia to provide a visual buffer between you, the residents in the Fairmeadow Subdivision, and the parking lot that exists at the Nokia Campus only and not for the personal use of the residents of your community. To be clear, at no time has Nokia given the residents or you or your community or anyone else an easement right, license right, any form of oral or written approval or other right to access and/or use the berm located on the Nokia Campus. Therefore, your past, present and continued use are considered a trespass onto the Nokia Campus. To avoid any further action by Nokia regarding this unauthorized use of the Nokia property, we are asking that you stop any further and future access and use of the berm for any purpose.

Please note that Nokia is posting "No trespassing" signs on the berm and security personnel will be more closely monitoring this portion of the property to enforce Nokia's rights. Nokia will have no liability to you for your unauthorized use of the berm and will, if it chooses to do so, enforce its rights under the law as it relates to the trespass.

For your safety and in the spirit of being a good neighbor, we respectfully request that you discontinue any and all access and use of the berm or other portions of the Nokia Campus except as needed to conduct business with Nokia . Dear Mr. Whitaker:

After being contacted by Greg Sagen, Pulte's Landscape Architect, the Board met with him at Danada Woods on Tuesday, December 22nd. We walked the perimeter adjacent to the proposed development and had a very informative discussion. We appreciate Pulte's outreach and, especially, the time Mr. Sagen spent on site. We talked about various issues and he suggested that the next step would be for us to send you a letter with our comments/concerns.

General Notes:

- 1. <u>Fencing.</u> Where fencing is planned or contemplated, we request that solid board on board fencing be erected similar to what is currently on our east property line along Naperville Road, at the maximum height allowed by Naperville codes without necessitating a variance.
- 2. <u>Landscaping</u>. It is our desire to retain as much existing landscaping along our south and west property lines as possible. As such, we request that underground utilities be relocated away from our south and west property lines wherever possible to provide planting areas.
- 3. Plant materials. The plant material legend indicates that ornamental trees and large evergreen trees will be 6' tall and upright evergreens will be 4' 5' tall. We understand that Pulte generally plants 8' trees in their developments. We believe 8' tall trees should be a minimum. In addition, we request that a combination fast and medium growing items be utilized.
 - Specific Notes (references to building numbers are taken from the Preliminary PUD Plat included in the Plan Commission agenda package):
- 1. South property line, first approx. 100' west from Naperville Road, adjacent to 2204 Grove Ct. We understand that relocating the currently planned underground utilities in this area is being contemplated. This is appreciated. We are extremely interested in retaining the large, established arborvitae and evergreen trees and adding new plants, as needed.
- 2. South property line, next approx. 100' 150' west, adjacent to 2203 Grove Ct. We understand that relocating planned underground utilities is not contemplated. We would like you to reconsider. Providing a landscaping buffer between your Building 190 and 2203 Grove Ct. is particularly important to us, and we are sure will also be for future owners of units in Building 190. Trees tagged 551 554 are on or near the property line.

These trees should remain, if at all possible. If retaining other existing landscaping is not possible, we request substantial landscaping using 8' or taller evergreen vegetation to provide solid screening in this area.

In addition, when discussing this area with Mr. Sagen, he indicated that a large Ash tree on the Danada Wood's side that has roots extending to Pulte's side of the property line would likely be adversely impacted or possibly killed by the proposed utility installation. This is an extremely large tree and a substantial asset to the Danada Woods community. We request further discussion with regard to mitigation/compensation of this situation.

- 3. South property line, next approx. 200' 250' west, adjacent to the proposed stormwater basin. The current drawings indicate the regrading to begin immediately north of the property line. This area has trees tagged 556 560 on or near the property line. These trees are noted in your tree inventory to be removed. We are extremely interested in retaining these large, established trees. We are concerned that the proposed regrading will damage the tree roots. We understand that immediate slope is required to provide stormwater volume as well as meet City of Naperville grade maximums. We request that the proposed regrading be adjusted south in order provide a level buffer for the existing trees as well as new landscaping. If grading right up to the property line is necessary, we could discuss allowing new Pulte-provided landscaping to be planted on our side of the property line. Although the proposed basin is directly across from our existing pond, it is important that this area also have trees to block diagonal views to/from each other's buildings.
- 4. South property line, next approx. 200' west, adjacent to proposed Buildings 184 and 186. As these proposed buildings are directly across from 1328 1334 Danada Ct and 1340 1346 Danada Ct., it is important to us that landscaping be provided. We understand that arborvitae planted 10' 12' on center is contemplated at the end of the proposed driveway between Buildings 184 and 186. With that spacing, it will take many years to provide a screen from vehicle headlights. We request that, in addition to the landscaping, a fence be erected beginning at the north end of the driveway and extending northwest along the property line up to the west property line of Danada Woods.
- 5. South property line, next 100' 150' west, adjacent to 1316 1322 Danada Ct. Like indicated in Note 3, this area is immediately adjacent to a sloping stormwater basin. It is important that regrading not damage existing plants and suitable grading conditions be provided along the property line to plant new trees. In particular, there are a few large trees that Mr. Sagen indicated were not ideal from a landscape architect standpoint, but provide substantial screening. We would like these to stay in place.
- 6. West property line. Like the area adjacent to the large stormwater basins, the whole west property line is adjacent to immediate regrading. The tree inventory indicates approx. a dozen trees along this property line most noted to be removed. We would like as many to remain as possible. We also request that fencing, similar to that described earlier in this letter, be installed the full length of the west property line that abuts Danada Woods property. Fencing north of the emergency access lane would not be necessary unless you are also installing fencing on the immediately adjacent Fairmeadows property line.

Once again, we appreciate Pulte's outreach and consideration of our concerns. If any of the above is unclear or needs further discussion, we would be happy to meet again. We would also appreciate being informed as the plans continue to evolve.



Mr. Chairman and Members of the Commission:

I am Joe Suchecki, a resident of Naperville. I am submitting written comments today in opposition to the Proposed Unit Development (PUD) referenced above due to its impacts to adjacent neighborhoods and properties. These include the public lands owned by the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County (District) which are directly adjacent to the proposed development and include unique wetlands and wildlife.

By way of background, I am a trained ecologist with an M. S. in Zoology and a 45-year career in wildlife ecology, environmental management, and government affairs. In addition to my professional career, I have been the Volunteer Natural Resources Steward and Bird Monitor for the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County at Springbrook Prairie Forest Preserve in Naperville for 26 years. In that capacity, I have assisted the District by completing plant and wildlife inventories, providing on-site management of prairie restoration areas and bird habitat, and leading hundreds of volunteer workdays and field trips for the public.

Usually, I come before the Commission and City Council on issues related to impacts of proposed developments on Springbrook Prairie, but felt compelled to provide comments on the proposed development adjacent to another important preserve – the Danada/Herrick Lake complex.

For clarity, the following comments are my own and do not reflect comments or positions of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County.

1. The proposed development as currently configured will have a significant adverse impact on adjacent lands and should not be approved.

During the Pulte presentation of the proposed development at the December 16, 2020, public hearing of the Naperville Planning and Zoning Commission (Commission), the developer touted the proposed development as an open space centric development. He further indicated that potential home buyers would be very attracted to the location due to the surrounding forest preserve land and the open spaces that it provides. Although citing the amenities and value of the adjoining forest preserves to future home owners, the developer failed to address the impact of the development on those very open space lands that will make home sites so attractive. While minimizing the actual amount of open space land (about 32%) within the PUD to that required by ordinance and seeking variances to setback and encroachment standards in order to fit in more home sites, the proposed PUD hardly qualifies as an open space centric development. The proposed PUD is a high-density development that is not compatible with adjoining public lands and the existing residential subdivision.

The proposed development directly borders forest preserve property on the west, north, and northeastern sides. The adjacent public lands include extensive wetlands as well as unique and unusual wildlife resources. Placing a high-density residential development without a necessary and sufficient buffer area threatens those important natural resources and will have negative impacts on certain birds that nest there. In particular, there is a long-established rookery of Great Blue Herons just to the northeast of the PUD boundary. Importantly, there also is an active Bald Eagle nest very near the proposed development. Those birds are very sensitive to disturbance, and the Pulte development may result in abandoning their nesting locations.

Just as significant are potential disruptions to the wetlands adjacent to the site. The development of the PUD may disrupt the wetland and drainage flows, thus changing current water levels and the hydrology of the wetlands on public and private lands. In addition, the presence of the housing development and increased human activity in the area will disrupt the adjacent forest preserve habitats and its wildlife thus decreasing their ecological value. The PUD does not include a sufficient buffer between the development and District property to minimize such impacts.

The District's public lands were set aside to provide open space in DuPage County and are an invaluable resource that needs protection. Pulte recognizes that value by taking credit for District open lands in their development proposal and marketing plans. However, the PUD is woefully inadequate in providing safeguards and mitigation measures to protect those very lands from negative impacts and degradation.

The City of Naperville Zoning Ordinance, Title 6, Section 6-1-2 Purpose and Intent, Item 7 states that one of the objectives of the ordinance is:

"To protect all areas alike from harmful encroachment by incompatible uses and to insure that land allocated to a class of uses shall not be usurped by inappropriate uses within the parameters of the standards and requirements of this Title".

Item 8 of the Ordinance further states that another objective is:

"To avoid the inappropriate development of lands and provide for adequate drainage, curbing or erosion, and reduction of flood damage."

As specifically stated in the Ordinance, the planning and zoning approval process is intended to regulate development and protect adjacent lands from developments that are incompatible and to ensure that developments do not contribute to storm water or flooding issues. The proposed PUD currently does not assure that the intent and objectives of the Ordnance will be met, and thus should not be approved until those criteria are satisfied.

2. The PUD does not meet the Chapter 4, Planned Unit Development Design Standards.

The PUD as proposed does not meet the following design standard and requirements of the PUD Ordinance:

Title 6, Chapter 4, PUD, Section 2 – Purpose and Intent, Item 3

"To preserve natural features and environmental resources, and provide outdoor common area, open space and recreation areas in excess of that required under existing zoning regulations".

The proposed PUD does not protect natural features or environmental resources within the PUD or on adjacent public lands.

Title 6, Chapter 4 PUD, Section 3 Design Standards, Item 3.1

"Outdoor common areas and site amenities shall be provided in planned unit developments as a means of passive or active recreation, site amenity, environmental protection or beautification".

The above design standard requires that a PUD provides outdoor common areas and site amenities that protect the environment. The proposed PUD does not protect the environment, and indeed may have harmful impacts on the local environment within and surrounding the PUD.

Title 6, Chapter 4 PUD, Section 3 Design Standards, Item 5

"Landscaping, Screening, And Tree Preservation: A planned unit development shall comply with regulations for landscaping, screening, and tree preservation as set forth in Title 5 of this Code".

Title 5, Chapter 10, Section 1 for landscaping requirements states:

"Specifically, these regulations are intended to increase the compatibility of adjacent uses by requiring a buffer or screen between uses, and in doing so, minimize the harmful impact of noise, dust and other debris, motor vehicle headlight glare or other artificial light intrusions, and other objectionable activities or impacts conducted or created by adjoining or nearby uses; reduce topsoil erosion and storm water runoff and replenish ground water supply; reduce energy consumption through windbreak and shade; <u>preserve nesting for birds and wildlife (emphasis added)</u>; and control insects".

The PUD does not meet the intent and purpose of the landscaping standards since the landscaping and buffer proposals are inadequate to preserve nesting birds. In particular, additional measures are needed to assure the Great Blue Heron nesting colony and the Bald Eagle nest are protected. There is an insufficient buffer area along the north and eastern boundaries of the PUD and proposed homes and existing natural habitats.

3. The PUD does not meet the Criteria for Approval as delineated in Title 6, Chapter 4 PUD, Section 7.

Section 7 of Title 6, Chapter 4 sets forth the criteria for approval of a proposed PUD by the Commission. The proposed PUD fails to meet two of these criteria.

First, as detailed previously in Section 2 of my comments, and as required in Item 1.2 of Section 7, the PUD does not meet all of the requirements and standards of the PUD regulations.

Second, as required by Item 1.6 of Section 7, the PUD as presented is not compatible with the adjacent properties and nearby land uses. In fact, the proposed PUD will have a negative impact on District public lands that surround the site including the potential to alter wetland habitats and the unique wildlife that is present on those lands. Pulte has not presented sufficient information or an adequate site design to assure that the PUD is compatible with those adjacent lands.

Furthermore, based on the comments and concerns of adjacent home owners, the proposed PUD will have an adverse impact on residents in the neighborhood directly to the east of the site. The Commission should ensure that the issues brought up by those adjacent landowners are adequately addressed prior to approving the PUD.

4. Significant issues regarding the impacts of the PUD on adjacent District public lands, wetlands, and wildlife resources need to be resolved prior to approval of the PUD based on the Criteria to assure that the final PUD is compatible with adjacent land uses.

As currently configured and presented, the proposed PUD will negatively impact adjacent District lands, wetlands and natural habitats and is incompatible with adjacent land use. Pulte's proposed buffer areas and storm water/wetlands plans are insufficient to mitigate potential impacts.

Of particular concern are the impacts to wetlands as well as the nesting Great Blue Herons and Bald Eagle. Although Great Blue Herons are not a threatened or endangered species, local

disturbance and development that causes the birds to abandon the colony is of concern, and I would hope that Pulte would be concerned that their "open space concentric" development would create such an impact.

Regarding the Bald Eagle nest, Bald Eagles also are no longer considered threatened or endangered due to the concerted efforts or ornithologists, conservation groups, and federal and state agencies to bring them back from the brink of extinction as a nesting species in the lower United States. Bald Eagles and their nests continue to receive special federal protection under the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act that prevents taking of Bald Eagles and affords special protections to their nests and nest sites. Human activity that results in nest abandonment may be considered a taking under the Act.

Bald Eagles have only recently begun nesting in DuPage County, and only a few nests are known throughout the county. Existing nests need to be protected to ensure the continued recovery of the species. As the developer of the PUD, Pulte needs to complete additional and formal consultations with the District, Illinois Department of Natural Resources (reported consultation from 2019 is outdated and does not address the nest), United States Fish and Wildlife Service and the agency with regulatory authority (DuPage County or Army Corps of Engineers) over wetlands permitting. Such consultations and mitigations measures must assure that the PUD does not adversely affect the nesting eagles.

Regarding a final determination as to whether the PUD is compatible with adjacent land uses, Pulte needs to meet with District staff to address the above issues as well as those brought up in the District letter dated December 14, 2020. It is my understanding that the Petitioner and the District have not resolved all the issue since the December public hearing. I ask that the Commission not approve the PUD until all of the issues have been resolved and the impacts of the PUD on District lands have been minimized.

5. Recommended changes to address the impacts of the PUD on environmental resources and land use compatibility issues

The Petitioner needs to revise the PUD proposal to ensure that the impacts to adjacent District property and habitats, as well as those to the existing private landowners, are minimized. With additional changes to minimize those impacts, I believe that a revised PUD can be compatible and a final development can proceed.

With regard to the impacts on District land, I recommend the following:

• The Petitioner needs to work with the relevant authorities and experts on stormwater and wetlands management to ensure that the PUD does not negatively impact the wetlands on District property, particularly the wetland surrounding the heron and eagle nests. Of course, any solution needs to consider and address flooding concerns by the adjacent homeowners.

- The proposed buffer on the north and northeastern boundary of the property is inadequate. A much larger buffer is needed to protect District property and to shield nesting birds from human disturbances created by the PUD. The Petitioner has proposed a large buffer of wetlands and native planting at the northeast corner of the proposed development (Area 1, Open Space Exhibit). A similarly-sized buffer area should be expanded along the entire northeast and east side of the development. At a minimum, any buffer area should be at least 100 ft wide.
- The landscape plan should include additional screenings to minimize disturbance to nesting birds. The current wooded areas to the north and east should be maintained (including those on the existing berm). That wide area of dense woodland provides a good barrier between the site and critical habitat. The proposed split-rail fence and occasional trees in the current landscape plan will not provide the screening needed to prevent disturbance. If an expanded buffer zone cannot be agreed to, the split-rail fence should be changed to a board fence to provide the necessary property separation.
- With the need for additional buffer, the Petitioner should consider changing the proposed storm water management plan to consolidate the many small and ecologically insignificant wetlands into one larger wetland and natural area on the north and northeast sides of the property. This would be sited within the extended buffer zone thus freeing up other space within the development for construction while creating the buffer needed to minimize impacts. Doing so would actually create significant ecological value, especially for wetland birds, compared to the currently proposed small and isolated wetlands.

There are several great examples of this at Springbrook Prairie where the Forest Preserve District and developers cooperated to create wetlands for storm water runoff. Those areas became important, high quality habitats for many wetland species including some state-endangered and threatened birds. So, it is possible to create win-win situations - if done correctly.

The current development plan negatively impacts adjacent public lands and natural areas, and should not be approved as proposed. I ask that you vote no on the current plan and direct the Petitioner to make changes needed to protect the adjacent forest preserve land that was set aside to preserve public open space and provide habitat for native plants and wildlife.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments on the proposed PUD.

We wish to echo the concerns expressed by the Forest Preserve District of DuPage regarding the proposed housing redevelopment adjacent to the Danada and Herrick Lake Forest Preserves. These concerns were articulated in the District's letter to you dated December 14, 2020, which include:

- Stormwater runoff impacts on the nearby Great Blue Heron rookery.
- Use non-native plant species for landscaping.
- Impact of light pollution.
- Potential use of asphalt sealants derived from coal tar.
- Use of sodium chloride (rock salt) for deicing.

A buffer or conservation easement is needed near the northern end of the project due to the nearby presence of a Great Heron rookery. These magnificent birds are generally not tolerant of human activities near nesting sites, and have been denied access to good habitat by human encroachment. Moreover, given the increase in 100-year flooding events, we consider it likely that stormwater basins will not protect the rookery from an influx of contaminated water.

We believe that the use of native vegetation, and complete avoidance of species of plants that are considered invasive in this geographic region, will be important and can realize attractive landscaping. Asian honeysuckles, for example, are particularly troublesome at the Danada Forest Preserve, and must be avoided. Provision must be made to keep residents from installing harmful vegetation in the future.

Trail access is commendable, but we recommended a conservation easement with a vegetative barrier along the west side of the project so that trail users are not looking at the back side of private homes and yards, as this impacts the outdoor experience that trail users seek.

We encourage provisions that require purchasers of the single family homes to maintain dark sky compliant lighting and motion sensors where appropriate, to minimize bright and obtrusive lighting that would impact their neighbors and the forest preserves.

We understand from remarks made at the December 16, 2020, Planning and Zoning Commission meeting that Pulte Homes and the Forest Preserve had been discussing these concerns and are hopeful that they have been addressed, and that the Commission will impose any needed provisions.

I am not going to get in a long dialogue with you about the berm, as Russ knows my position on it. We held off on submitting a formal opposition for a bit, hoping that Pulte would consider setting aside the berm for open space or some alternative that suited both sides of the issue. This has not happened, and indeed we see less than what we knew Pulte could accomplish within reason... now coupled with statements at hearing by Russ (quoting Nokia) and letters concerning a newfound concern about berm use that has been regular and longstanding.

Suffice it to say that the neighbors have cared for the berm (maintenance included) and they have used the berm. It's obviously not a matter of adverse possession, but the value of this berm as open space is pretty clear to one side of this. The letter received from Nokia is just one of the problems with communication on this development.

Hopefully, Nokia does not take too much offense at the slide in the PowerPoint depicting year-round use of the berm. I would suggest that the tenor of communications be returned a bit more to normal on that issue.

I do not think there is much to discuss about our respective positions on the matter. I am copying this to staff informationally. I did address this with Bill Novack by telephone and he understands our view that Nokia needs to do what it can to operate it's property and, in the spirit of being a good neighbor, Pulte should consider the use of the berm over the years and preserve it as open space--whether or not it allows use by the public. Thank you for copying me on the letter.

I am legal counsel for Nokia of America Corporation and in receipt of a copy of the email you sent to Ms. Shyrlene Foster, the Nokia North American Area Manager. This letter is in response to your email.

First, your allegation of a newfound concern about the berm use that you claim (and your clients have acknowledged) has been regular and longstanding. The use by your clients has been without the consent of Nokia, the owner of the property. The berm was placed there in the 1990's to obstruct the view of the parking lot built by Nokia so the owners of the homes would not be bothered by the lights and other visuals that come with a parking lot. It was not placed there for the pleasure of your clients yet they have admitted that they have unlawfully accessed and used property owned by Nokia. As a good neighbor, we placed the berm, which we have maintained for years so as not to create an unsightly landscape for the residents, and in return they have behaved as bad neighbors, violating Nokia's right of ownership by using the Nokia property without its consent. This illegal use must cease and desist.

As to the neighbors caring for the berm, that too is a misconception. Once again to prevent it from being an eye-sore to our neighbors, Nokia has maintained that property, moving it and removing dead trees. As a

matter of fact, one neighbor contacted us and complained that one of the trees was encroaching on his property or causing problems and Nokia had that tree removed. At no time has this property been maintained by your clients. We have proof that the mowing and maintenance of the property has been done by Nokia. Anything your clients have may have done on this berm is without the knowledge and consent of Nokia. They have clearly been trespassing and taking advantage of the Nokia property for their own needs. This must cease and desist immediately. In addition, you are correct as it relates to the communications on this development, at no time during the years that your clients has been trespassing have they communicated with Nokia regarding their unlawful use of the Nokia property. There are markers on the property that delineate the property lines as well as the fences your clients have built along the property lines. Please have your clients cease and desist all current and future use.

Nokia does take offense for the unlawful use of its property. Placing a slide on the Nokia property, if it was there, placed Nokia at risk of liability claims for potential injuries. Constructing a slide on the property is proof of the trespass. Nokia trusted that its neighbors would respect its property as Nokia respected their property by installing the berm to ensure their property values would not be devalued or that the visibility of their homes from the parking lot would be obstructed. Without the berm, the neighbors would have been subject to lights shining into their windows as well as giving strangers the ability to see into their homes. The berm was placed in consideration for the privacy and respect for homeownership of the Nokia neighbors. Nokia expected the neighbors to respect the ownership of the Nokia property as well. Unfortunately not only have they used the property without the right to do so, they are now making a claim that they are entitled to continued use after unlawfully accessing and using the property.

As to this being open space, it never was open space but has been used without authorization by your clients. Once again, we request that they cease and desist any further use or claim to the right to use.

I am writing to oppose the current plan by Pulte to develop the 67-acre Nokia property that shares a one-mile border with Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserves.

I am a DuPage County resident, former resident of Naperville, and frequent user of the Forest Preserves. The plan as proposed by the developer does not do enough to protect the world-class Forest Preserve system that we all enjoy in DuPage County.

Although billed as a revision, Pulte's "revised" plan maintains almost the same high housing density (it removed what looks like a meager six lots/units from the original 240), as is the same glaringly lack of open space. In terms of open space, Pulte should, at a minimum, preserve an L-shaped berm area surrounding the property. The many mature trees in this buffer should remain as an open space transition between the proposed development and forest preserve as well as an existing small neighborhood. In the past two decades, this connected berm space has become a safe corridor for wildlife. Although the plan entails adding trees once the area is razed, the new trees (mostly birches) will not ever provide the same functions as the existing mature trees and would take many years to provide even minimal "screening" as proposed. This berm area accounts for a small portion of the overall acreage and its preservation is a small concession for helping to maintain the beauty and ecological value of the nearby Preserves.

Naperville Zoning Board Member,

I have reviewed the latest version of Pulte's plans and despite Pulte's admission that the connection to 39th Street is not needed, they are still showing a connection to 39th Street on the plans. I thought we established during the last zoning meeting that the connection to 39th Street be removed!

I strongly urge you to consider the following (these views are shared by all 25 households in the Fairmeadow subdivision):

- The last version of the Pulte plan shows the proposed new subdivision connecting to 39th Street in the Fairmeadow subdivision. There are already two other points of access to the new subdivision without the connection to 39th Street, and both of these have stoplights (at Naperville Road and at Warrenville Road & Freedom Drive). Therefore the connection at 39th Street is unnecessary. 39th Street in the Fairmeadow subdivision should remain a dead-end for the following reasons:
 - If connected it will be used as a shortcut to access Naperville Road to head north toward Danada for shopping, etc.
 - o There is no stoplight where Fairmeadow reaches busy Naperville Road. The addition of 150-200 Pulte homes will cause hazardous traffic turning onto Naperville Road from Fairmeadow Lane.
 - The Fairmeadow subdivision has no sidewalks. The streets are narrow and were not designed for heavy traffic. Our children and all pedestrians use the streets. The increased traffic will cause hazardous conditions.
 - Milton Township Highway Commission does not support the connection. They are responsible for maintaining the roads in the subdivision. The streets are narrow and were not designed to be a major thoroughfare to another subdivision. If a car is parked on the street there is just enough room for another car to pass.
 - The District 200 school bus comes down Fairmeadow Lane and backs up and makes a u-turn at the T now, so there is no reason the bus can't continue to do so and then enter the new subdivision further south on Naperville Road to access the new subdivision. District 200 officials agreed that the connection to 39th Street is unnecessary.

We were silenced by the over two-hour sales pitch from Pulte's representatives who repeatedly touted their plans for a creative design with an urban feel. This concept appears to be counter-intuitive: wouldn't a builder want to showcase the bucolic setting and work with the natural surroundings? Wouldn't families prefer a glorious wooded view from their windows instead of the view of the sided wall of their neighbor's house? Pulte proposes rows and rows of frame houses built so closely together that homeowners, left without a backyard, would have to barbeque in the front. Perhaps another builder could envision a better plan for this prime property – one that would embrace the beauty of a forest preserve setting, not destroy it.

The residents of the immediate community sought out this area because of its peaceful tranquility. We don't want to lose that which drew us here. In a show of good sportsmanship, Russ Whitaker, an attorney for Pulte Homes, told NCTV 17 that the Pulte group has been in discussions with neighbors and has updated its site plans to help alleviate some concerns. "We lost units and we've increased costs in order to make this happen," said Whittaker. He then said the original number of 241 residential units for the project has been reduced to 239.

It is hard to imagine that a reduction of less than one percent of the project's scope will make an impact of any kind. We will still be facing a high-density housing development that will compound traffic problems, destroy local wildlife habitat, kill countless mature trees, cause stormwater issues, and drive down the property values in the existing neighborhoods.

Instead, I am submitting the following viable revisions for consideration:

- Create a reasonable buffer adjacent to the forest preserve by eliminating the undersized Lots 62-79. This would create more of an open space and help to maintain the integrity of the blue heron rookery.
- Eliminate the density created by the townhouses in Outlot H, and instead plant trees and greenery to create an "open space centric" entryway into the development. This will not only increase the perceived value of the project, but also generate a welcoming ambiance for guests and residents.
- Decrease the overall density of the project to reduce traffic in and out of the proposed development and on Naperville Road.
- Preserve the L-shaped berm area as an open space transition between the proposed development and forest preserve as well as a buffer to the existing small neighborhood. This connected small berm space has become a safe corridor for wildlife and will act as a buffer for all residents, new and existing.
- Allow a 15-foot vegetated buffer behind lots 148-152, similar to that behind lots 137-147.

As Naperville citizens, taxpayers, community members, neighbors and friends, we ask the members of the Planning and Zoning Commission to please take our voices into consideration when placing your vote on Pulte Home Company's proposal.

Fairmeadow Subdivision lies directly east of the southern portion of the Nokia site, with the single-family homes in it being on well and septic. A review of Illinois State Geologic Survey (ISGS) records indicates that the wells are all in the range of 100 to 140 feet deep (typically over 125') and extend into bedrock. This is what I expected and is considered fairly common for the area.

Cohesive fill and stiff to hard native silty clay soils predominated in the thirty (30) soil borings that we drilled for Nokia, extending to the bottom of all of them at 10 to 25 feet below existing grade. The deeper native clays are estimated to have very low coefficients of permeability in the range of 10⁻⁶ to 10⁻⁸ cm/sec, making them practically impervious. Design infiltration rates for these soil types would also be very low.

On the basis of the above outlined information, it is our opinion that the proposed residential development of the Nokia site will have no or very minimal impact on the existing wells in Fairmeadow Subdivision. In this regard, little to no infiltration is thought to be occurring at present given that cohesive/impermeable soil types predominate to at least 25 feet in depth (and likely much greater). After construction this would not be expected to change significantly, taking into account that associated excavations (i.e. for basements, sewers, detention basins, etc.) will stay within this stratum.

I support the conditional use for single-family attached units and the Elevations & Masonry Variance, but oppose all other deviations and variances.

- The park on outlot D will be a public park. It is about half the acreage that would be required for a full land donation rather than cash. It is not a common area that would be exclusively used by the residents. It should not be used as a justification to reduce the setbacks. Similarly, the much of the remaining common area is for stormwater retention/detention. It too should not be used as a justification to reduce the setbacks.
- It is disappointing that the developer prefer to build an inferior home by eliminating the eaves rather than reduces the number of homes to be spacing them appropriately apart.
- Stormwater management is one of the major complications of this development. Fewer dwelling units rather than deeper basins is the proper solution.

Naperville Zoning Board Member,

I have reviewed the latest version of Pulte's plans and despite Pulte's admission that the connection to 39th Street is not needed, they are still showing a connection to 39th Street on the plans. I thought we established during the last zoning meeting that the connection to 39th Street be removed!

I strongly urge you to consider the following (these views are shared by all 25 households in the Fairmeadow subdivision):

- The last version of the Pulte plan shows the proposed new subdivision connecting to 39th Street in the Fairmeadow subdivision. There are already two other points of access to the new subdivision without the connection to 39th Street, and both of these have stoplights (at Naperville Road and at Warrenville Road & Freedom Drive). Therefore the connection at 39th Street is unnecessary. 39th Street in the Fairmeadow subdivision should remain a dead-end for the following reasons:
 - o If connected it will be used as a shortcut to access Naperville Road to head north toward Danada for shopping, etc.
 - There is no stoplight where Fairmeadow reaches busy Naperville Road. The addition of 150-200 Pulte homes will cause hazardous traffic turning onto Naperville Road from Fairmeadow Lane.

- The Fairmeadow subdivision has no sidewalks. The streets are narrow and were not designed for heavy traffic. Our children and all pedestrians use the streets. The increased traffic will cause hazardous conditions.
- Milton Township Highway Commission does not support the connection. They are responsible for maintaining the roads in the subdivision. The streets are narrow and were not designed to be a major thoroughfare to another subdivision. If a car is parked on the street there is just enough room for another car to pass.
- The District 200 school bus comes down Fairmeadow Lane and backs up and makes a uturn at the T now, so there is no reason the bus can't continue to do so and then enter the new subdivision further south on Naperville Road to access the new subdivision. District 200 officials agreed that the connection to 39th Street is unnecessary.

Dear Bruce,

While we hoped over the last several weeks Pulte would take to heart the honest feedback from commissioners, the city and the public and improve its development proposal for the Nokia parcel, disappointingly, the corporation has not budged in any meaningful way.

Despite the SLIGHT tweak of it numbers, Pulte's "revised" plan remains excessively dense, seriously deficient of open space and lacking reasonable transitions between neighborhoods and the forest preserves. We all know this.

What we don't know is why. Why does this out-of-state corporation feel that it is above and immune to reasonable local ordinances and the intent of the PUD put in place in 2020 by the Naperville to protect this parcel? Why does Pulte demand so many variances?

In his Dec. 16 presentation, Naperville City Planner Scott Williams said Pulte's plan "lacks creativity and innovation." He has an excellent point. This proposal is very dense and by Pulte's own description "urban." Quite uncreative, especially considering the parcel's rare position in the middle of two forest preserves. It is a privilege living this close to nature, and an innovative plan should reflect that.

Of course, living close to nature requires responsibility—hence one of the main purposes of the existing PUD "to preserve natural features and environmental resources, and provide outdoor common area, open space and recreation areas IN EXCESS of that required under existing zoning regulations."

Considering these crucial design REQUIREMENTS, Pulte's plan ranks at the bare minimum, nowhere near "in excess." Specifically to this point, for example, Pulte has refused requests by neighbors to preserve a two-acre berm open space with scores of mature trees that serves as a natural transition for the parcel, the forest preserve and longtime neighborhood. This naturalized area is also a well-used corridor for wildlife (such as deer, coyotes and sandhill cranes).

Not only is this berm area ideal as creative open space, it fits perfectly with the Naperville's Planning and Zoning Commission's recent feedback on updating the city's comprehensive plan. What jumps out and specifically relates directly to our situation is this:

"The City Council is sending a revised plan back to the commission that would give the city flexibility to develop housing diversity and give residents the peace of mind that the integrity of their neighborhoods would be maintained."

Clearly, we are simply trying to maintain the integrity of our 60-year-old neighborhood, asking Pulte for a reduced density, more open space, actual tree conservation and preservation of the berm area as a logical transition between neighborhoods.

If you build a new neighborhood at the expense of another, you live in a world that is constantly degenerating. That's hardly innovative. Naperville deserves better.

One simple solution would be to follow the precedent set by Atwater, another recent Pulte project in Naperville. Neighbors there had the same concerns as we do--high density, glaring lack of open space and no natural buffer between the development and their neighborhood. Pulte reduced density, increased open space and granted a conservation easement.


We respectfully request the same considerations.

I would like to thank you for our service to the city and the opportunity express my thoughts and concerns regarding the Naper Commons Project. I am a current resident of the Fairmeadow Neighborhood, and like my fellow neighbors and friends, I have concerns about the Pulte project that is being proposed next to our neighborhood.

I understand that this area of land will be utilized at some point in time and there is no expectation that it will continue to stay as it is now. This has become very evident over the years with certain businesses or companies expressing interest. In my opinion, it seems that the best use of the land would be for residential use/homeowners. However, it would be incredibly helpful if Pulte and the Naperville Zoning and Planning Commission could help keep the integrity of our neighborhood that has been present for approximately 60 years. There has been previous discussions of 39th street and Naper Commons connecting in order to make our neighborhood another access, or cut through, to Naperville Blvd. This is still in the revised plans for Naper Commons and completely jeopardizes the safety of our neighborhood on many levels. As mentioned by previous homeowners of Fairmeadow, our small neighborhood

does not have the infrastructure for this type of traffic. There are no sidewalks, no street lights, no designated shoulders, and just enough room for two cars to pass. If these two roads were to connect it would completely change the environment and safety of our neighborhood in a very negative way.

The density of this project is very concerning. A 27%-30% percentage of green space does not show a consideration for the adjacent forest preserve or our neighborhood. A solution that could help keep the integrity of our neighborhood would be to leave the existing berm. Pulte could also utilize this berm (conservation donation) as a show of good faith to our neighborhood and any future projects that could affect surrounding neighborhoods. This helps create a buffer for our neighborhood, increases the percentage of green space to more in line with the surrounding environment, and will only decrease the number of units within the project by a small margin.

I respectfully request that the council take these concerns into consideration. As mentioned previously, I am open to having new neighbors but would like that to not be at the cost of the integrity and character of what drew us to the Fairmeadow Neighborhood.

I am including this letter because we echo what Jen Banowetz feels:

Dear Naperville Planning Commission,

While we hoped over the last several weeks Pulte would take to heart the honest feedback from commissioners, the city and the public and improve its development proposal for the Nokia parcel, disappointingly, the corporation has not budged in any meaningful way.

Despite the SLIGHT tweak of it numbers, Pulte's "revised" plan remains excessively dense, seriously deficient of open space and lacking reasonable transitions between neighborhoods and the forest preserves. We all know this.

What we don't know is why. Why does this out-of-state corporation feel that it is above and immune to reasonable local ordinances and the intent of the PUD put in place in 2020 by the Naperville to protect this parcel? Why does Pulte demand so many variances?

In his Dec. 16 presentation, Naperville City Planner Scott Williams said Pulte's plan "lacks creativity and innovation." He has an excellent point. This proposal is very dense and by Pulte's own description "urban." Quite uncreative, especially considering the parcel's rare position in the middle of two forest preserves. It is a privilege living this close to nature, and an innovative plan should reflect that.

Of course, living close to nature requires responsibility—hence one of the main purposes of the existing PUD "to preserve natural features and environmental resources, and provide outdoor common area, open space and recreation areas IN EXCESS of that required under existing zoning regulations."

Considering these crucial design REQUIREMENTS, Pulte's plan ranks at the bare minimum, nowhere near "in excess." Specifically to this point, for example, Pulte has refused requests by neighbors to preserve a two-acre berm open space with scores of mature trees that serves as a natural transition for the parcel, the forest preserve and longtime neighborhood. This naturalized area is also a well-used corridor for wildlife (such as deer, coyotes and sandhill cranes).

Not only is this berm area ideal as creative open space, it fits perfectly with the Naperville's Planning and Zoning Commission's recent feedback on updating the city's comprehensive plan. What jumps out and specifically relates directly to our situation is this:

"The City Council is sending a revised plan back to the commission that would give the city flexibility to develop housing diversity and give residents the peace of mind that the integrity of their neighborhoods would be maintained."

Clearly, we are simply trying to maintain the integrity of our 60-year-old neighborhood, asking Pulte for a reduced density, more open space, actual tree conservation and preservation of the berm area as a logical transition between neighborhoods.

If you build a new neighborhood at the expense of another, you live in a world that is constantly degenerating. That's hardly innovative. Naperville deserves better.

One simple solution would be to follow the precedent set by Atwater, another recent Pulte project in Naperville. Neighbors there had the same concerns as we do--high density, glaring lack of open space and no natural buffer between the development and their neighborhood. Pulte reduced density, increased open space and granted a conservation easement.

We respectfully request the same considerations.

Thanks you for your time, expertise and diligence as good stewards of our land and community.

Naperville Zoning Board Member,

I have reviewed the latest version of Pulte's plans and despite Pulte's admission that the connection to 39th Street is not needed, they are still showing a connection to 39th Street on the plans. I thought we established during the last zoning meeting that the connection to 39th Street be removed!

I strongly urge you to consider the following (these views are shared by all 25 households in the Fairmeadow subdivision):

- The last version of the Pulte plan shows the proposed new subdivision connecting to 39th Street in the Fairmeadow subdivision. There are already two other points of access to the new subdivision without the connection to 39th Street, and both of these have stoplights (at Naperville Road and at Warrenville Road & Freedom Drive). Therefore the connection at 39th Street is unnecessary. 39th Street in the Fairmeadow subdivision should remain a dead-end for the following reasons:
 - If connected it will be used as a shortcut to access Naperville Road to head north toward Danada for shopping, etc.
 - There is no stoplight where Fairmeadow reaches busy Naperville Road. The addition of 150-200 Pulte homes will cause hazardous traffic turning onto Naperville Road from Fairmeadow Lane.
 - The Fairmeadow subdivision has no sidewalks. The streets are narrow and were not designed for heavy traffic. Our children and all pedestrians use the streets. The increased traffic will cause hazardous conditions.
 - Milton Township Highway Commission does not support the connection. They are responsible for maintaining the roads in the subdivision. The streets are narrow and

- were not designed to be a major thoroughfare to another subdivision. If a car is parked on the street there is just enough room for another car to pass.
- The District 200 school bus comes down Fairmeadow Lane and backs up and makes a uturn at the T now, so there is no reason the bus can't continue to do so and then enter the new subdivision further south on Naperville Road to access the new subdivision. District 200 officials agreed that the connection to 39th Street is unnecessary.

I am writing to oppose the current plan by Pulte to develop the 67-acre Nokia property that shares a one-mile border with Herrick Lake and Danada Forest Preserves.

I am a DuPage County resident, former resident of Naperville, and frequent user of the Forest Preserves. The plan as proposed by the developer does not do enough to protect the world-class Forest Preserve system that we all enjoy in DuPage County.

Although billed as a revision, Pulte's "revised" plan maintains almost the same high housing density (it removed what looks like a meager six lots/units from the original 240), as is the same glaringly lack of open space. In terms of open space, Pulte should, at a minimum, preserve an L-shaped berm area surrounding the property. The many mature trees in this buffer should remain as an open space transition between the proposed development and forest preserve as well as an existing

small neighborhood. In the past two decades, this connected berm space has become a safe corridor for wildlife. Although the plan entails adding trees once the area is razed, the new trees (mostly birches) will not ever provide the same functions as the existing mature trees and would take many years to provide even minimal "screening" as proposed. This berm area accounts for a small portion of the overall acreage and its preservation is a small concession for helping to maintain the beauty and ecological value of the nearby Preserves.

Please vote against the proposed Naper Commons housing development, on the Danada Forest Preserve, and against the rezoning requested by Pulte to build houses with reduced setbacks and small backyards. The development is much too dense and the proposed "urban" feel of the community is in opposition to the idyllic feel of the surrounding neighborhood. A development of this size comprised of wood houses and townhouses is totally out of character with this section of Naperville.

As you know, there are also drainage, traffic, and wildlife concerns.

Do note that as of today, over 4,100 people have signed a petition on **change.org** opposing this development.

Those of us in the surrounding neighborhoods did not purchase homes next to a large, open farmer's field, ripe for development. We purchased homes adjacent to a commercial property developed five decades ago, abutting a forest preserve. We never imagined that the property would be rezoned to accommodate a huge residential complex!

It is the duty of the city government to protect and support taxpayers. But this development, with THREE YEARS of proposed construction, and townhomes at or near the same price point as those in Danada Woods, will only damage our quality of life and reduce the value of our homes.

How would you feel if this development were being built right next to you? Would you want three years of trucks, construction noise, dirt and dust on a daily basis? Would you be able to sell your home, if you had to, in those three years? How would you feel if the value of your home plummets, or if you were unable to sell your home at all? How would you feel if everything you loved about your neighborhood changed?

Dear Mr. Hanson,

We wish to echo the concerns expressed by the Forest Preserve District of DuPage regarding the proposed housing redevelopment adjacent to the Danada and Herrick Lake Forest Preserves. These concerns were articulated in the District's letter to you dated December 14, 2020, which include:

- Stormwater runoff impacts on the nearby Great Blue Heron rookery.
- Use non-native plant species for landscaping.
- Impact of light pollution.
- Potential use of asphalt sealants derived from coal tar.
- Use of sodium chloride (rock salt) for deicing.

A buffer or conservation easement is needed near the northern end of the project due to the nearby presence of a Great Heron rookery. These magnificent birds are generally not tolerant of human activities near nesting sites, and have been denied access to good habitat by human encroachment. Moreover, given the increase in 100-year flooding events, we consider it likely that stormwater basins will not protect the rookery from an influx of contaminated water.

We believe that the use of native vegetation, and complete avoidance of species of plants that are considered invasive in this geographic region, will be important and can realize attractive landscaping. Asian honeysuckles, for example, are particularly troublesome at the Danada Forest Preserve, and must be avoided. Provision must be made to keep residents from installing harmful vegetation in the future.

Trail access is commendable, but we recommended a conservation easement with a vegetative barrier along the west side of the project so that trail users are not looking at the back side of private homes and yards, as this impacts the outdoor experience that trail users seek.

We encourage provisions that require purchasers of the single family homes to maintain dark sky compliant lighting and motion sensors where appropriate, to minimize bright and obtrusive lighting that would impact their neighbors and the forest preserves.

We understand from remarks made at the December 16, 2020, Planning and Zoning Commission meeting that Pulte Homes and the Forest Preserve had been discussing these concerns and are hopeful that they have been addressed, and that the Commission will impose any needed provisions.

NOW COME the "Fairmeadow Neighbors," JEFFREY AND JEN BANOWETZ,

JAMES AND SANDRA BUTT, and TIMOTHY AND KAREN FELDBALLE, and submit the
following as their opposition to the petition of PULTE HOME COMPANY, LLC for the Naper
Commons Preliminary PUD and approval of a PUD plat with deviations and for a conditional
use for single family attached units, all situated on Lot 4 near Naperville and Warrenville Roads
(the "Subject Property"):

PARTIES

- 1. JEFFREY AND JEN BANOWETZ are the owners of 3S718 Delles Road, Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois 60563 (Permanent Index No. 05-32-401-006), situated in unincorporated DuPage County and a part of Fairmeadow Unit 2 Subdivision recorded as Document No. 1957-833256 (the "Banowetz Parcel").
- 2. JAMES AND SANDRA BUTT are the owners of 25W130 Fairmeadow Lane, Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois 60563 (Permanent Index No. 05-32-402-012), situated in unincorporated DuPage County and a part of Fairmeadow Unit 1 Subdivision recorded as Document No. R1956-800545 (the "Butt Parcel").
- 3. TIMOTHY AND KAREN FELDBALLE are the owners of 3S634 Delles Road, Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois 60563 (Permanent Index No. 05-32-401-001), situated in

unincorporated DuPage County and a part of Fairmeadow Unit 1 Subdivision recorded as Document No. R1956-800545 (the "Feldballe Parcel").

FAIRMEADOW SUBDIVISION

4. Fairmeadow Subdivision is a 36-lot two-unit single family detached residential subdivision that lies directly east of most of the Subject Property and between 415 feet and 740 feet from the southeasterly extension of the Subject Property to Naperville Road:




- 5. All the homes in Fairmeadow Subdivision rely on private wells for water service and, on information and belief, all but two of the homes in Fairmeadow Subdivision rely on private septic/sewerage systems for sanitary wastewater.
- 6. Fairmeadow Subdivision relies on the intersection of Fairmeadow Lane for its access to public rights of way outside of the subdivision. The intersection features an automated

detection system that allows for connectivity with the signalized intersection of Naperville Road with the DuPage County Forest Preserve main entrance to the north.

- 7. Internally, Fairmeadow connects with a north-south street (Delles Road) that also connects with 39th Street, a right of way dedicated from the lots in the southeast corner of the subdivision to its west terminus at the Subject Property.
- 8. Fairmeadow Subdivision does not have sidewalks and its streets have a width of between 18 feet (internal width) and 24 feet (width approaching Naperville Road).
- 9. The streets are a combination of asphalt and stone (at the edges) and a system of pipes, street grading and soft culverts adjacent to the streets operates with two Delles drains to the Subject Property in order to direct stormwater out of Fairmeadow Subdivision.
- 10. Fairmeadow Subdivision generally drains to its north, east, south and west perimeters. Lots situated along the west side of Delles Road drain to the west, south or north. The center and internal streets drain to the west then to the south over the Subject Property:






- 11. The average lot size in Fairmeadow Subdivision is roughly 0.60 acres.
- 12. Fairmeadow Subdivision has a density of 1.4 dwelling units per acre.

THE BANOWETZ PARCEL

- 13. The Banowetz Parcel is situated on Lot 30 in Fairmeadow Unit 2—the second lot north of 39th Street on the west side of Delles Road.
- 14. The Banowetz Parcel hosts a two-story residence situated 95 from the west lot line abutting the Subject Property.
- 15. The berm (depicted below) and its plantings fully screen the Subject Property from upper and lower elevations on the Banowetz Parcel as well as the Feldballe Parcel:



16. The Banowetz Parcel benefits from streetside stormwater lines required for its protection. The lines take stormwater from the Delles Road and areas east through Banowetz Parcel into the stormwater systems on the Subject Property and elsewhere within the Nokia Campus.

- 17. The Banowetz Parcel has an area of 0.51 acres and a rear lot line that is 126 feet long.
- 18. Since the 1950's it has been impacted only by residential use of a similar scale to Fairmeadow Subdivision to the north, east and south and by open space to the west:
 - Until the expansion of the temporary parking lot, there was no berm, but the
 acreage west of the Banowetz Parcel comprised pervious greenspace with ball
 fields and recreation space;
 - b. The berm arose roughly twenty years ago with the expansion of parking to include a temporary parking area west of the berm; and
 - c. Over the past twenty years, the berm and its attendant landscaping full screened the parking area so that it was not visible to the southwest, west and northwest.
- 19. The berm to the east lot line of the Subject Property and from the east lot line of the Subject Property to Delles Road contains underground pipes believed to be 18 inches in diameter.
- 20. Due to the two drains on the parcel, the Banowetz Parcel does not flood frequently, but the Banowetz Parcel conveys a large volume of stormwater onto the Subject Property from the center of Fairmeadow Subdivision and the Banowetz Parcel.

THE BUTT PARCEL

- 21. The 0.62 acre Butt Parcel is three lot frontages west of Naperville Road on the north side of Fairmeadow lane.
- 22. The Butt Parcel shares topographic features with the adjacent Forest Preserve District property to the north and the adjacent residential lot to the east that amounts to 0.62 acres at or below an elevation of 740, covering much of the rear yards of the two residential lots and

extending into the interior side yard between the two residential lots and often topping over into the front yard.

23. The frequency of flooding on the Butt Parcel has increased from once per year to two or three times per year, with two occasions per year during which the front and rear yard are flooded as rising waters from the north encroach through the rear and interior side yard and into the front yard. Indeed, Applicant's exhibits include old and new FEMA maps that indicate the impact of drainage problems on the Forest Preserve Headquarters site on the Butt Parcels.

THE FELDBALLE PARCEL

- 24. The 0.57 acre Feldballe Parcel is situated at the furthest northwest corner of Fairmeadow Subdivision and adjacent to the Subject Property.
- 25. The very west rear of the Feldballe Parcel is roughly the same elevation as the area of the Subject Property east of the berm on the Subject Property.
- 26. The rear yard of the Subject Property is roughly level with three homes to the south.
- 27. The Feldballe Parcel, its neighbor to the south and the Banowetz Parcel host residences with architectural features designed to take advantage of views to the west and northwest, including substantial open space and natural areas.
- 28. The Feldballe Parcel does not experience frequent flooding since the parcel is at a higher elevation than large surrounding areas and much of the stormwater is directed away from the Feldballe Parcel, either to the north or to the south. However, during heavier rain events, a portion of the rear yard will flood in a fashion that is similar to flooding on the Subject Property east of the berm.

THE SUBJECT PROPERTY


29. In 1987, the Subject Property was part of the Bell Laboratories complex and hosted open space comprised of baseball and other sports fields and areas for passive activities and recreation:



30. With building expansion in the center and south portions of the Bell Laboratories complex, the area of the playing fields and open space gradually diminished as the Subject Property became the host of expanded parking that occurred in phases (most of which was, on information and belief, approved as temporary parking):



31. By 2002, the parking expanded nearly to the north line of the Subject Property:





- 32. Bell Pond remained of a similar size and no independent stormwater capacity was added during the parking expansion.
- 33. On information and belief, the parking lots themselves and underground stormwater improvements were planned to contain stormwater.
- 34. Since 2002, a large 8'-12' berm has extended from west of the west line of Fairmeadow Subdivision for a distance of 800 feet before turning west.
- 35. The berm provides a complete terrain screen, and it is extensively planted in a fashion that provides year-round landscape screening between for the large residential lots in Fairmeadow Subdivision due to scores of large trees on and east of the berm.
- 36. The berm also maintains a drainage separation between the Subject Property and Fairmeadow Subdivision.


- 37. The parking lots north of Lucent Lane generally drain from north to south before water reaches Lucent Lane and flows west or further south then southeast.
- 38. The elevations of the Subject Property along the west line of Fairmeadow Subdivision range from 738 near the southwest corner to 742 roughly 70 feet south of the Forest Preserve District property.
- 39. The berm, with its elevation of 748 (to 750) and its large evergreens, pines and other trees, has been a part of the environmental since the late 1980's or early 1990's.

THE HESTERMAN DRAIN

40. An improvement known as the Hesterman Drain created a ridgeline north of Fair Meadow Subdivision that causes flooding of properties in the subdivision. The Hesterman Drain is a large drain system that serves territory from Butterfield Road south to Warrenville Road, traversing private and public land from northwest to southeast along a route that runs across the northernmost part of the Subject Property and along a line parallel to the north line of Fairmeadow Subdivision before crossing Naperville Road, turning south, and eventually daylighting at the northeast corner of Naperville and Warrenville Roads:







Without the Hesterman Drain, conditions may not permit either the project or continued maintenance of Fairmeadow Subdivision, but the Hesterman Drain has created problems by imposing a flood hazard on the Butt Parcel and on the Subject Property among others.

- 41. The above-referenced berm is a key component of area stormwater improvements since it was constructed as an emergency overflow berm that would direct overland storm flow during a 100-year storm to a catch basin west of the berm and to Bell Pond (the detention basin situated west and south of proposed Outlot B on the Subject Property) and away from Fairmeadow Subdivision -- an area that cannot incur additional stormwater burdens.
- 42. The berm has existed for parts of three decades to direct stormwater from points less than 100 feet west of the Banowetz Parcel and the Feldballe Parcel to locations west of the Subject Property that are more than 2,000 feet west of Fairmeadow Subdivision.

TRAFFIC

- 43. Streets in Fairmeadow Subdivision serve only the homes in Fairmeadow Subdivision. As of this submittal, it appears that connection over Road D and 39th Street will be for pedestrian/bicycle use only.
- 44. Fairmeadow Lane, Delles Road and 39th Street are narrow roads under Milton Township jurisdiction and, though constructed and maintained for the limited purpose of serving 35 homes (one home had a driveway onto Naperville Road), are neither designed, constructed, nor maintained for a broader population or residential density.
- 45. Area school districts have been comfortable with plans for busing students from Fairmeadow Subdivision.

- 46. The apparent indication from local schools indicating that a vehicular interconnection between the Subject Property and Fairmeadow was not approved by Milton Township.
- 47. On information and belief, there is correspondence in the zoning file for the project on the Subject Property that indicates that no school district desires a vehicular interconnection between Fairmeadow Subdivision and the Subject Property for any purpose, including purposes relating to student safety and busing.
- 48. Roads in Fairmeadow Subdivision do not allow for cut-through traffic in order to reach other developments.

RECITATION OF SPECIFIC OBJECTIONS TO THE PETITION

- 49. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose any vehicular interconnection between Fairmeadow Subdivision and the Subject Property for purposes other than pedestrian or bike path purposes, including but not limited to the extension of any road from Lucent Lane east to the line between the Subject Property and Fairmeadow Subdivision. An adjustment of plans should address this.
- 50. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the removal of the berm that is currently situated on proposed Outlot C, Outlot G, Lots 1-78 and Lot 182. At a minimum, the east portion of the berm, adjacent to Fairmeadow Subdivision should be preserved as open space.
- 51. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the replacement of the berm on Outlot C with Stormwater Facility No. 7 which has a high-water line of 739.8 and specifically conveys stormwater to the north and east across the north lot line of the Subject Property into an area identified as a critical wetland through which a 2,400-foot stretch of the Hesterman Drain passes. The Cemcon preliminary engineering plans (Sheet 3 of 4) only show part of the

Hesterman Drain but omits the stretch that extends from north of proposed Lot 62 southeast to the northeast corner of Fairmeadow Subdivision. Plans should avoid conveying any water to areas north of the Subject Property because doing so increases stormwater burdens for homes on Fairmeadow Lane.

- 52. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the development of duplexes or attached single-family residences on Lots 181, 182 and 183. The plan should be modified to allow for single-family detached homes on Lots 182-183 and more open space on Lot 181.
- 53. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the proposed project density of 3.73 dwelling units per acre (241 units on 64.63 acres) with zero transition from the lower density development of Fairmeadow Subdivision.
- 54. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the proposed single-family detached project density of 3.4 dwelling units per acre (175 units on roughly 51.5 acres) with zero transition from the lower density development of Fairmeadow Subdivision.
- 55. BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the severe restriction of stormwater flowing across the Subject Property and Fairmeadow Subdivision when the Subject Property is not only highly susceptible to flooding at all areas, but there is no current restriction on the rate, volume or direction of flow from points west of the berm across the Subject Property to the overflow or Bell Pond. The City cannot legally authorize a change in drainage from Fairmeadow Subdivision onto and through the Subject Property.

ZONING EVALUATION

56. Attention to the objections noted in Paragraphs 49-55 will meet the purpose and intent of the Zoning Title as noted in Section 6-1-2:

- a. Eliminating the extension of any roadway from the Subject Property to Fairmeadow Subdivision will lessen congestion on the public streets, facilitate the provision of adequate public services such as transportation, conserve the value of buildings and encourage the most appropriate use of land, protect Fairmeadow Subdivision from harmful encroachment by incompatible uses for which its roads were not constructed and are not maintained, and foster a more rational pattern of relationship between uses for the mutual benefit of all;
- b. Maintaining the berm that is currently situated on proposed Outlot C, Outlot G, Lots 1-78 and Lot 182 will avoid undue concentration of population, prevent the overcrowding of land (thereby insuring proper living conditions), maintain existing adequate standards for the provision of light, air and open spaces, facilitate the provision of adequate public services such as sewerage, open space and parks, conserve the value of buildings and encourage the most appropriate use of land, protect areas from harmful encroachment by incompatible uses and insure that land allocated to a class of uses shall not be usurped, avoid the inappropriate development of lands and provide for adequate drainage, curbing of erosion, and reduction of flood damage, and foster a more rational pattern of relationship between residential uses for the mutual benefit of all;
- c. Avoiding the replacement of the berm on Outlot C with Stormwater Facility No. 7 which will divert roughly 1.5 acres of drainage into a critical wetland at the same elevation as wetlands on and along the respective north lines of the Subject Property and Fairmeadow Subdivision will maintain existing adequate standards for the provision of light, air and open spaces, facilitate the provision of adequate


public services such as sewerage, open space and parks, conserve the value of buildings and encourage the most appropriate use of land, protect areas from harmful encroachment by incompatible uses and insure that land allocated to a class of uses shall not be usurped, avoid the inappropriate development of lands and provide for adequate drainage, curbing of erosion, and reduction of flood damage, and foster a more rational pattern of relationship between residential uses for the mutual benefit of all;

- d. Avoiding attached single family residences on Lots 181, 182 and 183, in part by modifying attached single-family homes on Lots 176-181, will lessen congestion on the public streets, avoid undue concentration of population, prevent the overcrowding of land (thereby insuring proper living conditions), maintain adequate standards for the provision of light, air and open spaces, facilitate the provision of adequate public services such as transportation, open space and parks, conserve the value of buildings and encourage the most appropriate use of land, protect areas from harmful encroachment by incompatible uses and insure that land allocated to a class of uses shall not be usurped by inappropriate use, avoid the inappropriate development of lands and provide for adequate drainage, curbing of erosion, and reduction of flood damage, and foster a more rational pattern of relationship between residential uses for the mutual benefit of all.
- e. Reducing the project density (3.73 dwelling units per acre (241 units on 64.63 acres)) and the single family detached project density (3.4 dwelling units per acre (175 units on roughly 51.5 acres)) will lessen congestion on the public streets, avoid undue concentration of population, prevent the overcrowding of land

(thereby insuring proper living conditions), establish adequate standards for the provision of light, air and open spaces, facilitate the provision of adequate public services such as transportation, open space and parks, conserve the value of buildings and encourage the most appropriate use of land, protect areas from harmful encroachment by incompatible uses, insure that land allocated to a class of uses shall not be usurped, avoid the inappropriate development of lands and provide for adequate drainage, curbing of erosion, and reduction of flood damage, and foster a more rational pattern of relationship between residential uses for the mutual benefit of all.

- 57. Section 6-4-1 of the Zoning Title provides that "The planned unit development shall conform to the intent and character of the zoning district in which it is located." The project proposed for the Subject Property calls for development inconsistent with the City's R-2 zoning regulation in several respects:
 - a. The Outlot F attached single family dwellings on Lots 176-181 are too dense inasmuch as 32 units are proposed and 28 are permitted under the 4,000 SF per dwelling unit area requirement in Section 6-6C-5(2);
 - b. Lot 1 does not meet the 6,000 SF minimum in Section 6-6C-5(1);
 - c. Petitioner seeks deviations from the front yard requirement and from the side yard requirement under a threat (or hint) that it will not provide amenities common to single family living in Naperville (such as front porches or eaves) without this relief—admitting that the planned development is too dense when the 191 cannot fit on a generally flat parcel:

i. Of 175 single family detached residential lots, only 44 comply with front yard regulations (Lots 1-15, 37-38, 59-63, 84, 120, 125-130, 135-137, 147-149, 152-156, 163-165), and the 25% that meet the regulation generally occur where it is only convenient to the Petitioner (along curved or entry street where the reduced front yard would leave insufficient lot width):



- ii. There are 66 units in 16 attached single family buildings and only four of these are planned in an environment deemed proper by the City;
- iii. A mere 25% of the dwelling units in the development will be in a block face environment that the City views as suitable in the R-2 zoning classification;


- iv. Note that the percentage of people living in a proper residential environment falls rapidly once one considers the interior yard setback relief; and
- v. The narrative refers to front porches that can extend six inches into the front yard, but assuming that Petitioner will extend front porches up to five (5) feet into the front yard, this leaves 15 feet of green space below homes that are up to 35 feet tall and townhomes that are 35-40 feet tall;
- d. Buildings 186 and 187 and Buildings 188 and 189 do not appear to meet the 12' primary structure separation requirement in Section 6-6C-7(3);
- e. Buildings 176-181, 182, 183, 185, 187 and 189 do not meet the 25' front yard requirement in Section 6-6C-7(1)(3);
- f. Buildings 186, 188 and 190 appear not to meet the rear yard requirement in Section 6-6C-7(1)(3);
- g. Even with the benefit of Section 6-2-3(4), allowing an election of which yard is the corner side yard, Building 182 appears to violate the 25' rear yard requirement in Section 6-6C-7(1)(3) and its excessive corner side (west) yard appears only because Petitioner plans a monument sign west of the building;
- h. Buildings 176-181 appear to offer decks that appear to extend further than ten(10) feet into the rear yard setback in violation of Section 6-2-3(3.2);
- i. Section 6-9-3(1) mandates 542 parking spaces, and the ability to select one of a number of single car garage/driveway designs amid an environment with no identified residential street parking other than the 18 spaces adjacent to Outlot D leaves doubt as to whether the balance of parking in the development will meet


- the minimum number or remotely justify an administrative reduction in required parking;
- j. Section 7-3-5(1) of the Subdivision Regulations requires 8.6 acres of park space per 1,000 residents, but while eliminating existing open space, Petitioner proposes only 2.02 acres of the 5.0-5.5 acres of park land that could be required (the plans provided do not allow an accurate population count).
- 58. Section 6-4-2 provides that a planned unit development is intended "to provide an alternate zoning procedure under which land can be developed or redeveloped *with innovation*, *imagination, and creative architectural design when sufficiently justified*. . . ." The PUD does not offer a higher level of design and amenity than is possible under otherwise applicable zoning regulations or a design that fulfills the objectives of the comprehensive plan and planning policies of the City." There is no basis for relief from the strict application of the use and bulk regulations of the Zoning Title and the design standards of the subdivision control regulations.
- 59. The planned unit development is intended to permit and encourage such flexibility and to accomplish the following purposes, but the proposed development fails the listed purposes in Section 6-4-2:
 - To stimulate creative approaches to the residential, commercial, and industrial development of land.
 - b. To provide more efficient use of land.
 - c. To preserve natural features and environmental resources, and provide outdoor common area, open space and recreation areas in excess of that required under existing zoning regulations.

- d. To develop new approaches to the living environment through variety in type, design and layout of residential structures, commercial and industrial buildings, transportation systems, and public facilities.
- e. To unify buildings and structures through design.
- 60. Section 6-4-7 sets out the criteria for approval and the Planning and Zoning Commission shall not recommend approval *unless the proposed development or change complies with all ordained criteria*. The project fails the following Section 6-4-7 criteria:
 - a. (1.1.The design of the planned unit development presents an innovative and creative approach to the development of land and living environments.)
 - i. The flexibility allowed in the PUD context is not intended to allow deviations from requirements under a threat to proceed with planning without customary design features; rather, the PUD requires innovation and creative approaches that actually add to what is customarily planned;
 - ii. There is little innovation or creativity in creating a stratified living area with townhomes facing Road D and Lucent Lane and placing the next two more expensive housing level a step further from the non-residential uses (townhomes could wrap the southwest corner of the Subject Property and open space could be created in the dense southeast corner);
 - iii. There is no innovation in managing stormwater and wetlands as has been proposed because (a) Petitioner does not solve any issues other than those on site and, even those issues are solved with efforts to claim detention areas are open space and an intent to alter longstanding Fairmeadows drainages, (b) an entire common stormwater management area does not

become active recreation through the mere placement of a bench and a walking path, (c) interior wetland issues (3 exist) and perimeter wetland issues (3 exist, with four PUD boundaries affected) are not the subject of any resolution tied to a single deviation;


- iv. The claim that the creation of the 2.09 acre central park area justifies front yard or side yard relief anywhere is simply unreliable and unsupportable because the PUD density requires more park land and, further, the developer provides compliant front yards only where it is convenient to do so (it readily admits that lot width would be a problem on curved roads if the setback were closer than 35 feet);
- v. Placement of a home in the front yard view of another homeowner (such as on Lots 15, 48, 93, 107, 108, 110, 111, 114, 115 and 119) is not innovative and, in fact, it is one of the earliest foundational reasons for zoning and yard regulation in the first instance:





- vi. The landscape plan sheets contain zero indication of the use of planting and other landscape installation and maintenance techniques that will serve the Forest Preserve District property that abuts nearly a mile of the PUD boundary (2,100 feet of which is adjacent to a critical wetland) and there are unaddressed opportunities to address this innovation on Lots 62-79 and Lots 137-153;
- vii. There is no indication that Petitioner intends to compensate for the mapped wetlands on the Subject Property that are being lost;
- viii. Petitioner plans to do away with a large berm and scores of trees and to eliminate this natural and open space amenity in favor of homes with triple the density of homes in Fairmeadow Subdivision and it will do so when it fails to contribute sufficient park land necessary as a result of the project density;
 - ix. Plans for the development indicate that Petitioner will eliminate substantial trees and tree buffer areas and that there will be a substantial thinning of other tree buffers that benefit abutting land in the City and County;
- b. (1.2.The planned unit development meets the requirements and standards of the planned unit development regulations.)
 - The PUD does not comply with Section 6-4-3(1) inasmuch as it appears
 that the PUD plat includes more land than is under the control of
 Petitioner by placing restrictions on Lot 3 in the Nokia Campus

Subdivision (see notes concerning future dedicated right of way and elimination of parking on Nokia Campus Lot 3):




- ii. The PUD does not comply with Section 6-4-3(2) inasmuch as:
 - 1. Merely 25% of the lots are designed to comply with the front yard requirement;

- 2. Far fewer than 25% of the lots will meet the interior side yard requirement;
- Lots are not designed to meet the minimum lot area requirement
 (Lot 1 and the uses on the interior of Outlot F);
- 4. Attached single family buildings are too close to one another; and
- 5. There is nowhere near the 25 parking spaces that should be required for a 2.09-acre park with playing surfaces (see Section 6-9-3(7)).
- iii. The circumstance that the Preliminary PUD Open Space Exhibit does not remotely track either the preliminary plat, the Nokia plat or the PUD provisions in the ordinance is a strong sign that the project does not comply with Section 6-4-3(3) inasmuch as:
 - Petitioner uses the area of Lot 4 of the Nokia Campus Plat
 (67.6388 acres) but the engineer's report on the final plat table
 states that the total area is 64.63 acres;
 - Petitioner uses 15.05 for "internal ROW" but the engineer reports
 11.92 acres of gross public right of way;
 - There is no differentiation between land use areas in calculating
 the required open space (30% for attached single family and 25%
 for detached single family) which is between 13.27 acres and 16.91
 acres;
 - 4. Using the engineer's preliminary plat data, the total area of the attached single family area (Outlots E, F, G, H and Lots 176-191)

- is 12.37 acres and this area includes no public right of way, so a minimum of 3.71 acres of open space is required for the attached single family housing component;
- 5. The area of Lots 1-175 and Outlots A, B and C is 38.2 acres (there are no public rights of way in these areas), so, a minimum open space area of 9.56 acres is required for the detached single family housing component.
- 6. Petitioner claims Area 1, comprised of 4.75 acres, is open space, but none of Outlot A is creditable as open space under Section 6-4-3(3.2.4)(3.2.6)(3.3.4) as it is a typical stormwater facility and has no active recreational area;
- 7. Petitioner claims Area 2, comprised of 3.11 acres, is open space, but none of Outlot B is creditable as open space under Section 6-4-3(3.2.4)(3.2.6)(3.3.4) as it is a typical stormwater facility and has no active recreational area (indeed it bends credulity to think that a substantial portion of Outlot B beyond the unapproved bicycle connection into the Forest Preserve would constitute open space despite the attempt to label a 10-foot deep stormwater facility and its northerly extension behind Lots 136-148 open space);
- 8. Petitioner claims Area 3, comprised of 1.01 acres, is open space, but none of Outlot C is creditable as open space under Section 6-4-3(3.2.4)(3.2.6)(3.3.4) as it is a typical stormwater facility and

- existing wetland area with a standard plan for division of the two and has no active recreational area;
- 9. Petitioner claims Area 4, comprised of 3.08 acres, is open space, but none of Outlot E is creditable as open space under Section 6-4-3(3.2.4)(3.2.6)(3.3.4) as it is a typical stormwater facility (testimony concerning fish and fishing opportunity is not supported by plans that show mere compliance with detention design regulations) and has no active recreational area other than a boardwalk with an overlook that is not a standard sidewalk which may be independently creditable for the area of the 50' x 120' area of the path and the actual area of the path south of this lot for a total of up to 8,000 SF;



- 10. Petitioner claims Area 5, comprised of 0.56 acres, is open space, but much less area from within Outlot F is creditable as open space under Section 6-4-3(3.2.3);
- 11. Petitioner claims Area 6, comprised of 4.40 acres, is open space, but very little of Outlot H is creditable as open space under Section 6-4-3(3.2.3)(3.2.4)(3.2.6)(3.3.4) and the area does not qualify as a

non-sidewalk path to a recreation area or common area not located within five feet of structures, etc. or as a non-typical stormwater facility;

- 12. As a result there are only 5.23 acres of the required 13.6 (+/-) acres of open space.
- iv. The PUD does not comply with Section 6-4-3(4) inasmuch as it fails to provide sufficient park space (5.53 acres are required for the likely 640-plus residents, but only 2.09 acres are provided)—also note that preservation of the berm and conversion of Lots 1-15 and Lots 182-183 to a park with Outlot C would make up some of the shortfall;
- v. The PUD does not comply with Section 6-4-3(5) inasmuch as it violates

 Section 10-5-3(5.2.1) because the parking lot closest to Naperville Road

 (in Outlot H) omits the minimum five-foot wide landscape area which

 shall be provided around that part of the perimeter of all parking lots with

 10 or more spaces which abut another parcel or the public right-of-way;
- vi. The PUD does not comply with Section 6-4-3(8) because it cannot provide for the required width of right of way along Road D (west of Lucent Drive) without including land from Nokia Campus Lot 3 that has not been dedicated for street purposes (technically, the street plan should be part of the process because most of Road D is not on the Subject Property);
- vii. The PUD does not comply with Section 6-4-3(10) because the design does not recognize prior open views and because it offers three strata of home

- areas in three neighborhoods divided not only by design and wealth but also by unnecessary signage;
- viii. The PUD falls short under Section 6-4-3(11) because the PUD is not designed in accordance with applicable provisions of the comprehensive master plan as contained in Section 1-11-1 (none of the 11.1.1 through 11.1.9 factors are met except at the boundaries of wetlands governed by federal and state law and, perhaps, on attainability of housing if numbers were provided and available); and
 - ix. The deviations proposed as well as deviations that have not been noticed fail to meet the standards for deviation under Section 6-4-3(12).
- c. (1.3.The physical design of the planned unit development efficiently utilizes the land and adequately provides for transportation and public facilities while preserving the natural features of the site.)
 - While there can be little doubt that the developer has efficiently utilized
 the land to create homebuilding opportunities, efficiency must be
 considered in light of the capacity of the site to host such a dense
 development;
 - ii. Developer admits in its proposed preliminary PUD plat that Lot 4 for in the Nokia Campus subdivision is incapable of sustaining 191 buildable lots and providing dedicated rights of way required by the Subdivision Regulations (indeed, the five-foot jog in the westerly part of the south lot line is necessary as part of a right of way to be dedicated later whenever

- Lot 3 and, possibly Lot 2, in the Nokia Campus proceed to permitting or to amend their development entitlements and engage in further platting);
- iii. The plans reflect an utter waste of the east portion of the Subject Property abutting Fairmeadow Subdivision as an opportunity to engage in transitional planning so that the external effects of the rapid increase in density and visual massing of homes can be minimized (the PUD should include this land as active recreational space, park space or, at a minimum, lots planned more similarly to those in Fairmeadow Subdivision);
- d. (1.4. Open space, outdoor common area, and recreational facilities are provided.)
 - Such areas are provided, but the park land contribution is less than half of what may be required;
 - ii. The open space planning falls short of providing the combined open space area that amounts to 30% of the attached single family area and 25% of the detached single family area; and
 - iii. Common fences on the east line should be solid fences.
- e. (1.5.The modifications in design standards from the subdivision control regulations and the waivers in bulk regulations from the zoning regulations fulfill the intent of those regulations.)
 - i. Petitioner approached the front yard relief purely from a profit perspective and without regard to meeting the intent of the R-2 district inasmuch as it proposes compliant from yards only near the entrance to the residential area before one reaches the cavernous areas to the west and northwest and,

- in those areas, Petitioner determined to comply only where it could not have a reasonable or lawful lot width (see most lots on curved roads);
- Petitioner ignores that Naperville's yard regulations serve the purpose of avoiding too much lot coverage (there is no lot coverage regulation) and building massing;
- iii. Petitioner openly admits that it incorrectly believes side yards are irrelevant except for the purpose of connecting front and rear yards for access purposes;
- iv. Petitioner has ignored the 25% and 30% open space regulations applicable to the unit mix;
- v. Applicant has not dedicated sufficient park space under circumstances where park space in addition to the linear 2.09-acre park is readily available;
- f. (1.6.The planned unit development is compatible with the adjacent properties and nearby land uses.)
 - The single family lots in Fairmeadow Subdivision will lose the benefit of a long standing, planted berm area with mature trees that serves stormwater management purposes and also serves to screen the Subject Property at upper and lower levels;
 - ii. Each single family lot on the west line of Fairmeadow Subdivision will individually abut either the duplex townhomes (on Lots 182 and 183) or as many as three or four residential lots (Lots 1-11) while the two homes at

- the northwest corner of Fairmeadow Subdivision will view as many as six or seven homes;
- iii. While the R-2 regulations allow homes on the Subject Property to be constructed with smaller front and side yards than exist in Fairmeadow, the reduction of yards operates as a wholesale abandonment of the lot coverage planning in an area with wetlands (some critical) that was formerly a farm that benefitted from multiple drain tiles (the removal of which remains a serious concern when planning stormwater facilities);
- g. (1.7.The planned unit development fulfills the objectives of the comprehensive plan and planning policies of the City.)
 - i. The "Naperville Comprehensive Master Plan, 1998 East Sector Update" sets forth land use policies under "Future Land Use Goals – Residential" various goals (Pages 39-43):
 - 1. The diminished front yard on 75% of the lots, the side yard relief, the lack of sufficient open space, and the small amount of park space does not satisfy the plan provision that residential developments should include adequate open spaces, in either private yards or common areas, to provide for residents' open space and recreational needs;
 - 2. Fairmeadow Subdivision is one of the area subdivisions that should be protected from the encroachment of incompatible activities or land uses which may have a negative impact on a residential development, and the failure to plan appropriately for

- the east line of the Subject Property removes existing protections that serve to screen a change in the intensity of land use and serve stormwater purposes for an area already challenged in stormwater management; and
- 3. The project does not resemble the overall low density residential character of this sector indicated on the future land use map (Existing Land U, at 16-17; Future Land Use Map, at 62-63);
- ii. While there is a mixture of housing types, the townhomes and duplexes are not blended in a way that is either unified (neighborhoods are divided by housing type, affordability, design, and signage) or imaginative (the layout is typical);
- iii. There is no reason other than profit for placement of two duplexes on Lots 182-183, townhomes could wrap the southwest corner, density could be softened a bit on the east line and a townhome mix could avoid the misalignment of yards between Lots 14-16, 45-46 and 120;
- iv. While 6,000 square foot lots may be viewed by many as allowed as of right, the reality is that they are not allowed because the pressure to attain such a lot size throughout the development (again, a typical effort) leads to intra-block lot and yard relationships that conflict as a result of forcing so many units with interior lots bookended by corner lots that can be constructed such that rear yards appear in front yard environments;

- v. "Predominantly low density" (see page 40) is encouraged, but not attained and the front yard deviations leaving a mere 10-15 feet of green space in many instances will leave an impression that the area is not low density;
- 61. Perhaps most telling on the issue of the claimed rights under R-2 zoning is the principle set forth on Page 41 of the 1998 East Sector Update:

When changes to the residential densities indicated on this plan are proposed, the City should consider such factors as neighborhood character; compatibility of land uses; and impacts on livability, services, community facilities, schools, and traffic levels. Because most new residential developments will occur as infill development, they must be compatible with surrounding properties and exhibit extreme sensitivity to the preservation of natural features and existing residential developments. The City will take into consideration the prevalent characteristics of an area when reviewing individual development projects.

As a result, as of right development hinges more on zoning regulations. Though large, the project is infill development occurring on a challenging site adjacent on five of its sides to sensitive areas, one being Fairmeadow Subdivision.

- 62. The project proposed for the Subject Property fails the standards for deviation set forth in Section 6-4-3(12).
- 63. The requested deviations are so widespread that they undermine the intent and purpose of the underlying zoning district and Petitioner admits that the side yard relief relies on the argument that side yards provide no practical purpose. (Resp. to Standards at 10)
- 64. As noted above, the front yard variations cover 75% of the proposed lots, the side yard variations likely cover many additional lots, and all the yard variations affect lot coverage, drainage and storm management in the area has proven to be a complex problem for many decades—due in part to public and private land management that preceded Petitioner's interest both on the Subject Property and on other public and private properties.

- 65. The omitted deviations include the park contribution because the population of the development calls for a contribution of at least five acres of park land.
- 66. The omitted deviations include apparent rear yard dimension and rear yard encroachment issues along areas claimed by the Petitioner to be open space.
 - 67. The omitted deviations include a shortage of open space.
- 68. The omitted deviations include a significant uncertainty relating to required parking for the detached and attached components of a development with limited street parking and pavement widths that may not meet the required widths
- 69. Section 12.1.2 regarding deviations touches on detriments to the provision of municipal services and infrastructure. In this regard the Commission needs to consider that fire ratings on walls as close as they might limit the number of windows in side yards and create a sense of monotony. Further, the administrative adjustment for available guest parking may be available, but parking should be considered as a whole at this point—at least based on Petitioner's anticipated unit blend, driveway locations and all other relevant elements. Lastly, Fairmeadow Subdivision's experience with the office development, stormwater planning and with the Hesterman Drain has it pinched by two government efforts promising improvement but not delivering. The conversion of so much open space to impervious surface causes great concern in the area for the proper planning of oversized facilities, as-built review, and follow-up lookback review for performance.
- 70. The deviations do not meet the Section 12.1.3 demand for a "planned unit development which offers a superior level of design, amenity enhancement, or environmental benefit; or would enhance community vitality through the inclusion of attainable or barrier free housing." While attainable or barrier free housing might be viewed as available, it is stacked in

an overly dense area adjacent to the remainder of the Nokia Campus development on Lots 2-3. There is a clear divide between the townhomes and single-family use when these uses could be blended on some of the perimeter curves to allow at least some townhomes near the natural amenity west and north of the Subject Property.

71. Section 12.2 addresses outdoor common area and site amenity deviations. There is no request for a deviation to reduce the minimum required percentage of outdoor common area for a planned unit development. Petitioner does not meet the outdoor common area or open space requirement of Sections 6-4-3.1.2 and 6-4-3.1.3. No reduction of the required common open space (between 13.27 acres and 16.91 acres) may be offered because the requested deviation is not in harmony with the intent and purpose of the zoning ordinance and 1998 East Corridor plan and it is not consistent with the low-density residential that the 1998 East Corridor plan calls for. Other than the park (to be dedicated to the Naperville Park District and excluded from the lower end of the range in parentheses above), limited acreage is active or passive recreational space not situated in or at a stormwater facility. Environmental benefits from the project do not exceed those that would result as a matter of the application of law and ordinance during the permitting process, and recreational interconnectivity between neighborhoods and resources is not an environmental benefit that justifies a reduction in common open space planning under Section 12.2.2 or Section 12.2.3. Under Section 12.2.4, the planned unit development achieves ordinary and expected pedestrian amenity, but not special amenity. The level of environmental design is limited even though Cemcon's work is complex and extensive. The work is unrelated to providing additional measures that enhance the area beyond what is expected for this development. Indeed, there are no off-site solutions or benefits that would justify the waiver or

reduction of open space or the misattribution of allowable common open space to entire stormwater facilities.

- 72. Petitioners have not reviewed the project for signage purposes because there is no noted deviation that is subject to Section 12.3. There should be no deviation for signage as regulated under Title 5, Chapter 4. The interior signage is simply another means through which to segregate the housing, and signage should not be required for each sub-area within the development.
- 73. Considering Section 6-4-5, the Fairmeadow Neighbors note that much information was provided in the preliminary engineering. The landscape plan was lacking in any effort to preserve meaningful trees or description of the basis for removing trees (based on health or damage or other factors). The planned unit development plat does not provide necessary current detail on how a half-street is not planned for the Road D area roughly 200 feet east of the southwest corner of the Subject Property where a five-foot offset exists for a length of roughly 1,000 feet extending east. The central-south line of the PUD plat does not match the same line of Lot 4 in the recent Nokia Campus development. While this may be explained, it should be under the purview of the Commission during this process. The plat under review lacks some of the necessary detail and conflicts in some respects with the preliminary engineering (townhome information, lot area conflicts, yard measurements, density calculation by use area, parking supply and demand calculation). The plat omits total and footprint square footage for accessory structures and for outdoor common area by type. There is no phasing plan. While building information is provided, site specific lot design criteria are not provided for the mixed-use residential development or the single-family attached planned unit development. Landscape Plan information appears to be lacking when compared to Title 5.

- 74. Section 6-3-8 offers standards in relation to the conditional use application for townhomes upon which the Commission's recommendation must be predicated:
 - a. Contrary to Section 6-3-8(2.1), the establishment, maintenance or operation of the conditional use *will* be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, and general welfare because:
 - i. The townhomes surround an otherwise single-family environment at the southeast corner of Fairmeadow Subdivision;
 - ii. The townhomes are massed in a walled grouping along Road D when they could share in the benefit of surrounding open space to the north and west;
 - iii. The duplexes are on the opposite side of Lucent Lane from the larger townhomes and, as a result, invade across a reasonable line of demarcation between single family or open space use and townhome use;
 - iv. Walks and bikeways near the townhomes are not wide enough (see typical sections) for bike routes;
 - v. The townhomes along Road D appear to lack guest parking spaces and none of the parking spaces near the park on which they may rely are designed to provide an accessible route (or an accessible space);
 - vi. There appears to be a conflict in townhome rear deck planning and Comment 17 on Sheet 1 of the PUD plat; and
 - vii. Guest parking appears to be insufficient.
 - b. Contrary to the required finding in subsection 2.2, the townhome conditional use *will* be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate area for the purposes already permitted because the townhomes envelope the two lots

- in the southwest corner of Fairmeadow Subdivision. The circumstance of rear lot line transition to townhomes is not out of the ordinary, but allowing expansion to front and side yard impacts to any home is poor planning.
- c. In derogation of subsection 2.3, the establishment of the conditional use will impede the normal and orderly improvement of adjacent Fairmeadow Subdivision property for uses permitted in the district because:
 - The elimination of the berm unnecessarily destroys open space without any basis and replaces it with a different residential use and density that is many times greater than abutting blocks;
 - ii. The reduction of front yards creates visual annoyance and unnecessarily increases the apparent height of buildings that are as tall as 40 feet due to their location closer to the sidewalk;
 - iii. The townhomes east of Lucent Lane and the close massing of townhomes on Road D, when viewed from the east, northeast and southeast, leave the impression of a continuous wall absent significant on-site and off-site landscaping.
- d. Contrary to subsection 2.4, and as noted above, the establishment of the conditional use conflicts with the adopted comprehensive master plan because it does not comprise low density housing, particularly with the planned massing of the townhomes.

RESPONSE TO HEARING TESTIMONY

CONCLUSION

There is no reason that the development of the Subject Property cannot proceed in line

with the recent Pulte developments that provide more open space. Even though some open space

decisions may have been compelled by the physical parameters of the development, Petitioner

has shown that it is fully capable of providing a better product than that which is presently under

review for this difficult site that is quite highly visible not only to Fairmeadow Subdivision, but

also to thousands of visitors and tens of thousands of passersby who will easily observe the

density from open space, County highways and Forest Preserve District areas.

WHEREFORE, the Fairmeadow neighbors respectfully request that the Planning and

Zoning Commission refer this matter to the City Council with a negative recommendation or

with a favorable recommendation only upon the presentation of revised plans that accomplish the

following:







DANADA-HESTERMAN DRAIN IMPACT




FEMA MAPS BEFORE (LEFT) AND AFTER (RIGHT)





Goal 1: Preserve/create high quality residential developments.

Policies:

- Require residential developments to include adequate open spaces, in either private yards or common areas, to provide for residents' open space and recreational needs.
- Protect residential neighborhoods from the encroachment of incompatible activities or land uses which may have a negative impact on a residential environment.
- Of ive priority to the protection, rehabilitation, and improvement of existing neighborhoods and communities through code enforcement and preservation.
- Retain the overall low density residential character of this sector as indicated on the future land use map.

Goal 2: Promote diversity in housing types (detached single-family, duplexes, townhomes, apartments) and costs.

Policies

- Use zoning regulations to promote a mixture of lot sizes and housing types.
- Encourage developers to combine a variety of housing types such as townhouses, duplexes, and apartments blended with single-family detached units in a unified and imaginative land use arrangement through the planned unit development process.
- Medium/high density residential development should be located to provide accessibility and a transition between low density residential and more intensive uses or transportation elements.

Implications for Future Land Use - Residential

While this plan seeks to encourage a variety of housing types and sizes (including townhouses, duplexes, and apartments), the East Sector will maintain its predominately low density residential character. Approximately 8,689 acres (49 percent of the total East Sector land area) have been allocated for low density single-family residences. This land area includes over



620 acres of vacant land. It is anticipated that most of this land will be developed for single-family detached housing at a modified gross density of 2.5 dwelling units per acre. (Modified gross density is the number of dwelling units divided by the residential acreage including land utilized for residences, road right-of-way, detention facilities, open space, and land dedicated for school and park purposes. This calculation does not include land intended for nonresidences, such as churches, day care centers, commercial, or any other nonresidential structures.) The modified gross density of 2.5 dwelling units per acre is intended to apply to any vacant properties that are zoned or platted after the adoption of the 1998 East Sector Plan. Residential developments zoned or platted prior to the adoption of this plan may have densities that exceed 2.5 dwelling units per acre. Residential development occurring on infill sites will also be subject to the City's teardown and infill development policy.


DENSITY COMPARISON






TYPICAL WET (RETENTION) BASIN

I am including this letter because we echo what Jen Banowetz feels:

Dear Naperville Planning Commission,

While we hoped over the last several weeks Pulte would take to heart the honest feedback from commissioners, the city and the public and improve its development proposal for the Nokia parcel, disappointingly, the corporation has not budged in any meaningful way.

Despite the SLIGHT tweak of it numbers, Pulte's "revised" plan remains excessively dense, seriously deficient of open space and lacking reasonable transitions between neighborhoods and the forest preserves. We all know this.

What we don't know is why. Why does this out-of-state corporation feel that it is above and immune to reasonable local ordinances and the intent of the PUD put in place in 2020 by the Naperville to protect this parcel? Why does Pulte demand so many variances?

In his Dec. 16 presentation, Naperville City Planner Scott Williams said Pulte's plan "lacks creativity and innovation." He has an excellent point. This proposal is very dense and by Pulte's own description "urban." Quite uncreative, especially considering the parcel's rare position in the middle of two forest preserves. It is a privilege living this close to nature, and an innovative plan should reflect that.

Of course, living close to nature requires responsibility—hence one of the main purposes of the existing PUD "to preserve natural features and environmental resources, and provide outdoor common area, open space and recreation areas IN EXCESS of that required under existing zoning regulations."

Considering these crucial design REQUIREMENTS, Pulte's plan ranks at the bare minimum, nowhere near "in excess." Specifically to this point, for example, Pulte has refused requests by neighbors to preserve a two-acre berm open space with scores of mature trees that serves as a natural transition for the parcel, the forest preserve and longtime neighborhood. This naturalized area is also a well-used corridor for wildlife (such as deer, coyotes and sandhill cranes).

Not only is this berm area ideal as creative open space, it fits perfectly with the Naperville's Planning and Zoning Commission's recent feedback on updating the city's comprehensive plan. What jumps out and specifically relates directly to our situation is this:

"The City Council is sending a revised plan back to the commission that would give the city flexibility to develop housing diversity and give residents the peace of mind that the integrity of their neighborhoods would be maintained."

Clearly, we are simply trying to maintain the integrity of our 60-year-old neighborhood, asking Pulte for a reduced density, more open space, actual tree conservation and preservation of the berm area as a logical transition between neighborhoods.

If you build a new neighborhood at the expense of another, you live in a world that is constantly degenerating. That's hardly innovative. Naperville deserves better.

One simple solution would be to follow the precedent set by Atwater, another recent Pulte project in Naperville. Neighbors there had the same concerns as we do--high density, glaring lack of open space and no natural buffer between the development and their neighborhood. Pulte reduced density, increased open space and granted a conservation easement.

We respectfully request the same considerations.

Thanks you for your time, expertise and diligence as good stewards of our land and community.

I've been thinking about Naper Commons proposal since the last PZC meeting. To me, it is a shame that this area couldn't have been developed into more a Conservation Community* in its intention. Given that it not the developer's wishes, I do hope the goal will be set to minimize human versus nature conflicts. Beyond honoring the Forest Preserves requests in their letter, I hope the future residents will have a sound appreciation about living with wildlife. For example fences, particularly split rail, do little to solve coyote human conflicts. Humans need to be good stewards.

The plans show a regional trail zig-zagging through the public park. Yet the developer's presentation shows bicyclists only on the one-way streets adjacent to the park. While I'm not sure what the developer's and Park District's ultimate intent is, I do know bicyclists and pedestrians don't mix well - especially on high traffic regional trails. I suggest that the regional trail instead be routed along road D. Please see my attachment.

From the meeting, I gathered that the justification for reducing the front setbacks would be to be able to reallocate the space in the form of common area for the residents. PUD common areas are not the same same as Public Parks. There is exceptionally little common area for residents, Most of it is deeply contoured storm management facilities. The park district, I have thankfully heard, no longer would accept such area as land donations and I don't believe such areas should be fully acceptable for common areas either. Some communities have very complicated definitions of **useable** common open space. Schaumburg requires that all PUDs have at least 1 active and 1 passive recreation area. Schaumburg also requires that stormwater management areas cannot account for more than 50% of the required open space. I think this is wonderful! Some of the density complaints could be solved if Naper Commons took a similar approach. The lost front setbacks seem to amount to about 40,000 sq ft. Omitting a few single family homes and a couple units from townhomes could provide some nice common useable open space for the residents. It would also help reduce some pressure on the Forest Preserve. For example:

 Reducing the number of units per townhome from 6 to 5 for townhomes 176 and 178 would add 3,570 sq ft or 0.08 acres of common space between 176 and 178 and would allow room for canopy trees in this area. (The townhomes have only ornamental trees.) It would give the residents of 176 and 178 a bit more space from the common sidewalk. • Omitting single family detached homes 38, 39, 40, 41, and 42 would provide 33,675 sq ft, or .77 acres of common space at the west end of the public park. A pavilion, walk, and parking would add a very pleasant natural and useable common area for the residents.

It seems at least 6 acres of the current open space calculations are wetland or ponds. Conservatively excluding 3 acres of wetland and adding about about 1 acre as I suggested would make the PUD open space to be 28.52%. It seems to me a reasonable compromise. My attachment illustrates my suggestion.



First, and importantly, please note there are, at the time of this letter, nearly 7.000 signatures on a <u>Change.org</u> petition against proceeding with this development.

After reviewing Pulte's most recent revised plans for Naper Commons, my concerns about the magnitude of this project and its impact on the neighboring environment have not been mitigated.

Pulte would have you believe that the impact to Danada Forest Preserve will be minimal or even nonexistent. Common sense dictates otherwise. For example, Pulte's representatives have extolled the virtues of a portion of the development that will be "manor houses surrounded on three sides by forest preserve." They indicate this is a "plus" for the buyers of these homes. While these homeowners may benefit from a nice view, in reality, infringing on the forest preserve will be detrimental to the preserve and to its wildlife. This infringement certainly will not provide any benefits to the greater community or to the forest preserve.

Do you know that the Audubon Society identified Danada West Forest Preserve and Herrick Lake as one of the state's *Important Bird Areas (IBAs)*? According to their website:

This Important Bird Area contains one of the most diverse assemblages of breeding shrubland and riparian species in the region. Willow Flycatcher and Field Sparrow are unusually abundant as breeders along with an unusual variety of warbler species including American Redstart, Chestnut-sided Warbler, Ovenbird, Hooded Warbler and Blue-winged Warbler. The site has hosted the only pair of confirmed breeding Acadian Flycatcher in DuPage County.

There has been a great deal of misinformation about the blue heron rookery. Contrary to an older newspaper article, the rookery does exist and has existed for many years. Photos I took last April of the rookery attest to the fact that it is still here and is viable. (It will not always be so; nothing lasts forever.) As for the pair of nesting bald eagles, this species startles so easily that photographers are directed to take pictures of them from behind a blind. Just the sight of a person can disrupt nesting. It stands to reason that three years of heavy construction will not give these birds a positive outcome.

Traffic? Based on their calculations, Pulte stated that the increase to traffic will be minimal. But the new development will not exist in a vacuum. Pulte has not factored in the increased amount of traffic on Naperville and Warrenville Roads that will be generated by the new Costco and by the new mall on Ogden and Naperville Roads. Heavy traffic on Naperville Road often makes exiting and entering Danada Woods Townhomes very difficult. This is the only access and egress point to this development.

Additionally, has Pulte researched traffic safety at the intersection of Naperville and Warrenville Roads? It is the site of numerous traffic accidents, including a fatal accident last September.

Pulte has never addressed quality-of-life issues on the existing neighborhoods that abut the Nokia property. Construction is scheduled for three years. That is, if home sales go as swiftly as planned. If not,

construction could drag on. Pulte will be building homes within a few feet of the existing neighborhoods. What does Pulte say about the noise, dust, and dirt that neighbors will be subjected to during construction due to Naper Commons close proximity to Danada Woods Townhomes and the Fairmeadow Sudivision? What will happen to our quality of life? Please ask yourself if you would want this long disruption next to your home, and how it would impact you and your family.

There is also the financial consideration. What will happen to the value of our properties, not only during the long construction period, but after the new homes are built? The price point of the new townhomes will place them in direct competition with the Danada Woods Townhomes. It is likely that owners would be forced to lower the sales price of the older townhomes to make them more attractive to buyers. Remember, the new townhomes are not blocks away from Danada Woods Townhomes. They will be adjacent to and visible from the Danada Woods Townhome property. There could not be more direct competition for townhome sales.

I have a concern about the proposed park. Although I think it is too small to accommodate the needs of the 700 anticipated Naper Commons' residents, it is not clear whether the park will be open to the general public. The wording in Pulte's 33-page "Response to Standards," dated February 24, 2021, states: "An approximately 2-acre active park is located at the heart of the project and will serve as a central gathering area for residents of the community." Does community mean Naper Commons' residents, or does it include the general public? Is this a private or public park?

These are only a few of my many concerns about this mega-development.

I am asking for the consideration any taxpaying citizen is due from his/her municipal government. Please consider the impact on the forest preserve, the wildlife, traffic, the neighbors' quality of life and home values, and on the greater community before approving this development.

Dear Naperville Planning Commissioners,

I just wanted to take a moment and sincerely thank you for your time, care and expertise at the Feb. 3 meeting when the proposed Naper Commons was discussed. I've rarely experienced such a thorough public forum (and I've been to many); your patience and diligence was reassuring, made even more significant because you are community volunteers. Your jobs are not easy. Again, thank you. I feel like we are in good hands.

In your deliberations, I thought you all brought up many excellent concerns about the Naper Commons proposal and points of discussion as we prepare for the March 17 meeting, including:

Commissioner Van Someren, we share your worries about the serious impact this very dense housing development would undeniably and irreversibly have on the adjoining forest preserves. We may not even know the full impacts of such a project until it's too late. Concerned with that, we started a change.org petition in December, which has amassed 7,000 supporters and rising. (More importantly, it's spurring community awareness and has been shared more than 1,268 times.) If you have a chance, browse through the comments submitted by supporters. It's truly heartening to see how many Naperville and DuPage residents value and wish to protect our fragile, open spaces—and don't take these wild places for granted.

Commissioner Athanikar, I fully support your interest in preserving reasonable transition areas between neighborhoods. There is huge value in preserving existing open spaces between neighborhoods. Not only does such creative and mature space offer a smooth transition among dissimilar neighborhoods, it offers a naturalized and significant asset that can be used actively by humans and as an easement for wildlife.

Commissioner Robbins, thank you for suggesting that the potential negative impact on this fragile area needs to be studied more. Completely agree. Back in December I requested that an independent Environmental Impact Study be conducted for this project. Although it's not technically required in this case, it absolutely would be a best practice here. We should not ignore this useful tool for guidance.

Chairman Hanson, thank you for your steadfast commitment to upholding all seven specific purposes of the PUD that the city purposefully put in place last year to protect this unique area. This is exactly the high level of conscientiousness that public officials should model. Clearly—even with the developer's latest updates—several criteria of the PUD have yet to be met in a truly meaningful way.

And despite this commission's clear requests and advice, this plan remains virtually unchanged in terms of its high density and numerous requested variances.

Vice Chairman Bansal, I think your statement really summed up what so many of us are feeling about this proposal: This could be a wonderful project, just not HERE. Urban vibes are fine if there's a market for that, but this type of dense housing plan makes no sense in an area that is not walkable to restaurants, shops and businesses—it misses the whole point of why people enjoy those types of neighborhoods. (Believe me, I've lived here for 20 years, and even Freedom Commons is not safely walkable from our neighborhood). Pulte's plan belongs in a completely different setting and context—not one surrounded by two forest preserves and isolated from walkable urban amenities.

It is wrong to force this type of proposal, however tweaked, to fit here.

By its own description, Pulte's plan is purposefully designed for the exact opposite setting as this very unique parcel: Lots are tightly packed, density is high, yards are insignificant, streets will be busy, open space is in short supply. Logically, this is not forest-preserve-open-space-eagle-habitat-natural-beauty-friendly. At all.

Again, thank you for your time and diligence. I look forward to the March 17 continuance.

I continue to represent the Fairmeadow Association and the Banowetz, Butt and Feldballe families. They have reviewed the recent plan amendments submitted by Pulte Home Company, LLC the Naper Commons. This correspondence updates and supplements the written opposition submitted January 28, 2021.

Road D Right-of-Way

The Fairmeadow Association and BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose any vehicular interconnection with Fairmeadow Subdivision. While Pulte plans no longer show an interconnection, the petitioner's response to standards continues to indicate construction of cross access at 39th Street will occur. The perception is that this is the result of staff review. The City itself does not need a dedicated right-of-way at that location and its staff and attorneys are more than capable of negotiating proper covenants and easements on the plat without the full right-of-way dedication. All public services and utilities can be reserved through easements and, if it is the protection of Fairmeadow that the City is concerned with, the City can require that the plat show that utility or other interconnections other than a vehicular route will be provided without charge to the City or any neighboring owner or governing agency such as the township. Indeed the continued right-of-way requirement presents a serious screening problem between southwesterly Fairmeadow and Lots 168-169.

Lots 168-169 Duplexes

The Fairmeadow Association and BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the duplexes or attached single-family residences on Lots 168 and 169. The existing road surface for the parking lot is more than 100 feet from the 3S732 Delles Road and 25W251 39th Street properties and extensive landscaping screening prevents visibility from the properties to the parking lot. The proposed petition has duplex structures located approximately 20 feet to the property line, appearing to be near the minimum required by Naperville. While the duplexes should be removed (there are none anywhere else in the large development or otherwise nearby),

at a minimum, the plan should be modified to convert the right-of-way to common area and provide a transition buffer similar to that planned east of Lots 1-10. Best planning calls for removal of the duplexes.

Transitional Density

The Fairmeadow Association and BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES oppose the overall density along Lots 1-10. Transitional density planning deficiencies arise from the same three related factors seemingly driven by economics rather than planning: the number of homes, the out-of-place duplexes and the Road D right-of-way. While it is acknowledged that the overall density has been reduced from the original version of the plans, the reduction of density does not do enough for the transition to the larger lots in the Fairmeadow subdivision. Fewer homes is more consistent.

With this correspondence, I am providing an overlay comparing the December 2019 plan to the February 2021 plan. It is quite clear that the adjustments have not meaningfully reduced density. This circumstance makes transitional planning imperative. Easterly lots, in fact perimeter lots wrapping to the north, should have larger lot areas in the range of 0.5-1.0 acres. Whatever the business model of the applicant is, the Planning and Zoning Commission should focus more on transitional perimeter zoning than Pulte has in its most recent revision. The new easterly outlot is a step in the right direction.

Park Space and Open Space

The Fairmeadow Association and BANOWETZS, BUTT® and FELDBALLES oppose the proposed project based upon the park land and open space positions they expressed previously. The park space is important because it is a different form of beneficial and active open space and parks serve a distinct purpose when compared to the Forest Preserve District land nearby. One is not a substitute for the other. While Pulte submits that it has met Naperville's open space requirements, the revised open space exhibit falls short of meeting the open space and outdoor common area requirements of the development.

Tree Preservation and Drainage Clarifications

Hopefully, Pulte will spend some time addressing tree preservation along the east side of the development. It appears drainage and civil engineering questions are answered for the purposes of planning at this stage. However, it is a bit unclear whether there will be continuous underground continuity between the drainage between Fairmeadow and the development before it heads south. It is unclear whether underground lines in Fairmeadow will be connected to underground lines in the development or whether these will flow over land before being collected into the system. A change to the current rate, volume or direction of the flow must be avoided.

There is a substantial loss of existing trees. While some of this is unavoidable. There are large trees that the developer, with staff's supervision, should preserve and maintain. The meandering berm that appears to run down the east side of the development is diminished partly south of the Benowetz's north lot line. This should leave room for planting and transplanting as well as preservation.

Conclusion

As you are aware, the Fairmeadow Association and BANOWETZS, BUTTS and FELDBALLES are asking that you find that the development does not meet the seven purposes and other considerations for a PUD under the Zoning Ordinance, including Section 6-4-2. Where there are departures from expectations, they should not be present on the perimeter of the development or impact adjoining and nearby owners such as those in Fairmeadow, particularly in the southwest corner of the Fairmeadow subdivision. This has been a long hearing and everyone involved appreciates the effort and time you have dedicated to the matter. However, until Pulte commits to a reasonable plan that transitions from Fairmeadow to what appears within the development further to the west, it is not possible for these neighbors to support the project.

They respectfully ask that you decline to provide a favorable recommendation on the plans, as modified for the March 17, 2021 hearing. I will be in attendance this evening and hope that your review of this correspondence in advance of the hearing and inclusion of this letter and its enclosure in the record will shorten my participation this evening.

I am writing again to express my strong opposition to Pulte Home Company's proposed Naper Commons (PZC #20-1-086). While I had hoped that the revised plans would markedly reduce the scope of the project and alleviate concerns surrounding the high-density development, I was dismayed to see that the resubmitted documents reflected the removal of just 12 homes, a reduction of only 5%. I view this as a feeble attempt to appease those who oppose this project.

The amended plans have not lessened the overall negative impact of a subdivision of this size. Should this project be approved, we will still be facing a high-density housing development that will compound traffic problems, destroy local wildlife habitat, kill countless mature trees, cause stormwater issues, and drive down the property values in the existing neighborhoods.

I also question the value of the "urban" aesthetic that is a touted selling point. According to recent research from the National Association of Landscape Professionals, "a nice-sized lawn is the No. 1 priority among millennials, even beating out an updated kitchen. 

This property, adjacent to Danada Woods, has been met with opposition from current townhome residents and is another example of high-density housing. Although Pulte claims it has replicated the layout and spacing of Danada Woods, a quick assessment of the property shows otherwise. The buildable space of Outlot H measures 175' x 975' (a total of 170,625 sq. ft.) and will house 30 units. The mirroring Danada Woods property measures 229' x 975 (a total of 223,275 sq. ft.) where 18 units stand. If what Pulte was saying is

true, Outlot H should accommodate 14 townhouses, not 30, a number that more than doubles the number of acceptable units.

As Naperville citizens, taxpayers, community members, neighbors, friends, and the over 7,000 people who signed the change.org petition against the proposed development, we ask you to please consider our voices when placing your vote on Pulte Home Company's proposal.

We have reviewed the latest effort from Pulte Builders, and we are disappointed at their lack of listening to their potential neighbors, and for not following the advice given to Pulte by the Naperville Planning and Zoning Commissioners.

Specifically,

- 1. The development is still substantially too dense. This proposed development is much denser than any other Pulte designed development anywhere in the Naperville area.
- 2. The open space "gathering park" doesn't meet the Commission's regulations and advisement.
- 3. Townhomes #168 and #169 are incredibly close (15 feet) to the and and property lines. We believe this violates a 55-foot buffer regulation.
- 4. The very dense development will have a major impact on the surrounding wildlife, including nesting eagles, in the surrounding Forest preserve property.
- 5. Pulte's plan does not meet the seven standards of the PUD put in place by Naperville in February 2020 to protect this area.

Please consider these objections, and others that have been raised by our neighbors, and by the City of Naperville.

Yes, I want them to be aware of the lack of quality of construction, no buyer protection or rights when things are NOT furnished to the building standards we are accustomed to from Naperville.

- 1.Do you want a copy of our purchase agreement for comparison- to note the lack of, if any, Pulte responsibility on construction defects.
- 2. If you don't agree to close because of lack of quality construction that you want repaired first, they threaten to fine you \$300 to \$500 a day or will keep the 50 grand down payment and you lose the house.
- 3. **Only** allow virtual walkthrough for framing.
- 4. Before closing: 2 parts: the first, also only allowed virtually with the video reception poor quality.

The second in person portion was limited to 2 people for 1 a maximum one (1) hour total to walk through and inspect the entire new construction. Our home inspector had to leave so my husband could come.

I must say that after I filed a complaint, and my husband and I agreed to closing or losing our down payment. They did allow 1 additional hour right before our closing appt.
