The names of participants who submitted position statements will be compiled and posted with the electronic meeting agenda on the City's website prior to the start of the meeting. The cumulative number of position statements will be announced during the City Council meeting.

3. Address the City Council live during the City Council meeting in-person in City Council Chambers. Individuals wishing to address the Council during the meeting must sign up to speak by 4 p.m. on September 7.

Online sign-up closes at 4 p.m. on September 7, at which time no other speakers or comments will be accepted. There will be no on-site speaker sign up.

Council explained that they find the current system to not be user friendly and discussed the appropriateness of going out for another RFP, finding meeting materials on the City website, and the desire to see improvements made to the Q/A process.

Schatz stated that staff will work to simplify navigation to meeting information on the website and explained the 2016 RFP process, the interconnectedness of Granicus with other systems, that it is used for City Council as well as all Boards/Commissions, migrating years of meeting documents and videos, that the Granicus design is based on standard municipal legislative formats, and that since the Q/A is unique to Naperville, staff will need to change the process in-house but will inquire if Granicus can propose a possible solution.

A motion was made by Councilman Hinterlong, seconded by Councilwoman Gustin, to approve the award of a five-year extension to Contract 16-246, Agenda Management Software, to Granicus, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$219,220.38. The motion carried by the following vote:

Council discussed the appropriateness of removing professional requirements, that many applicants don't qualify as the Code is written, the problem of recurring vacancies and that there has never been a full board, temporary appointments and meeting cadence, bringing someone back who wants to serve again, that mayoral appointments are still subject to Council review, the need to develop a more robust marketing strategy for vacancies, and incorporating language that states it is the City's aim to appoint members that have qualifications connected to the building industry.

Due to multiple recent shooting crimes/murder in the City, I do not feel safe walking to the Fourth Avenue Station in hours of darkness.
